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### 1. AN OVERVIEW

#### 1.1. The Institution

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (hereinafter designated as Sansthan) was established on 15th October, 1970 as an autonomous organisation registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Act XXI of 1860). It is an autonomous organisation created for the overall development and promotion of Sanskrit in the country. It is being fully funded by the Government of India since its inception. It functions as the apex body for the propagation and development of Sanskrit and assists the Ministry of Human Resource Development in formulating and implementing various plans and schemes for the development of Sanskrit studies. It has assumed the role of a nodal agency for the effective implementation of various recommendations made by the Sanskrit Commission set up by the Government of India, Ministry of Education in 1956 concerning the preservation, propagation and development of Sanskrit language and education in all its aspects.

Considering Sansthan's contribution in the field of promotion and propagation of traditional Sanskrit education including teaching, training and research activities in Sanskrit, the Government of India accorded it the status of Deemed University w.e.f. 7th May, 2002 vide Notification No. F.9-28/2000-U.3 followed by U.G.C.'s Notification No.F.6-31/2001(CPP-I) dated 13th June, 2002. On 5th July, 2012 National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore awarded Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), New Delhi with 'A' grade.

Under the scheme of review of Deemed Universities, the UGC Review Committee inspected all the campuses of the Sansthan including its Head Quarter at Delhi. The committee has praised the academic standard maintained by the Sansthan and has further recommended the status of Deemed University to it.

#### 1.2 Role and functions

The major objectives of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and in pursuance thereof—

- 1. To Provide for higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels fully conforming to the concept of university, namely University Education Report (1948) and the Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).
- 2. To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management, etc. routinely offered by conventional institutions.
- 3. To provide for high quality teaching and research and for the advancement of knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken in-house by substantial number of full time faculty/research scholars (Ph.Ds and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines.
- 4. To enable creation of Sansthan under the 'de novo' category devoted to unique in emerging areas of knowledge, not being pursued by conventional or existing institutions particularly in specific areas of study and research preferably sponsored by the Government of a State/UT or the Central Government regarded

as important for strategic needs of the country or for the preservation of our cultural heritage, so determined by a well laid-out process of wide consultation with the eminent peers of academic community.

- 5. To undertake, aid, promote, coordinate research in all branches of Sanskrit learning including teachers' training and manuscriptology, to bring out linkage with the outcome of modern research in the contextually relevant fields and to bring out publications.
- 6. To act as nodal agency for the Government of India to implement its policies and programmes for the development of Sanskrit.
- 7. To provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as it may deem fit.
- 8. To provide for research and for the advancement of/and dissemination of knowledge.
- To undertake extra mural studies, extension programmes and field outreach activities to contribute to the development of society.
- 10. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the objectives of the Sansthan.

## 1.3 Programmes and Activities

Realising its objectives, the Sansthan has undertaken the following major programmes and activities:-

- Establishment of Campuses in different States of India.
- Conducting teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary/ Undergraduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Research at Doctorate levels.
- Conducting teachers' training at graduate level i.e. Shiksha Shastri (B. Ed.) and Post graduate level i.e. Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.).
- Conducting and Coordinating research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit.

- Cooperating with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.
- Establishment of Sanskrit libraries, manuscripts' collection centres and also editing and publishing rare manuscripts and books of importance.
- Conferment of degrees and granting of diplomas/certificates to persons having satisfactorily completed the approved prescribed courses of study/research and passed prescribed examinations.
- Instituting and awarding visitorship, fellowship, scholarships, stipends, prizes and medals.
- Conducting distance education programmes.
- Implementation of schemes of the Ministry of Human Resource Development for the promotion of Sanskrit.

## 1.4 Teaching

Teaching is conducted from Prak Shastri to Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the Sansthan in its 13 Campuses. The affiliated institutions carry out teaching from Prathama to Acharya.

Sanskrit institutions managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the Sansthan also impart teaching with the same syllabus.

### 1.5 Teachers' Training

In the Campuses, teachers' training course of one academic year with emphasis on teaching practice, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha Shastri Degree which is equivalent to B.Ed.. In addition, Shiksha Acharya Degree course equivalent to M.Ed. is conducted in Puri, Jaipur, Jammu and Bhopal Campuses.

#### 1.6 Research

In all the Campuses of the Sansthan, students are enrolled for carrying out research leading to the award of degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D..

However, Ganga Nath Jha Campus, Allahabad is exclusively dedicated to research activities in selected branches of Sanskrit. The Library of the Campus is one of the richest Sanskrit Libraries in the country. A collection of over **57,957** rare manuscripts are also preserved in the library.

### 1.7 Publications

Research Journals and Books

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has been publishing two research journals containing research based articles, namely 'Sanskrit Vimarsha' and 'Journal of the Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad'. While the first journal is brought out by the Sansthan's Headquarters office, the other is published by Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad. In addition, the Campuses also publish annual literary magazines. The campuses at Bhopal and Jaipur have also upgraded the annual magazines published by them as research journals.

The Sansthan as well as the Campuses have brought out scholarly works, rare manuscripts and original texts. The Sansthan has published 611 books so far.

Sanskrit Varta - a quarterly news bulletin in Sanskrit is also published regularly.

# 2. AUTHORITIES & STRUCTURE

- 2.1 Minister of Human Resource Development, Government of India is the Chancellor of the Sansthan. During the reporting year from 01.04.2016 to 04.07.2016 Shrimati Smriti Zubin Irani and from 05.07.2016 to 31.03.2017 Shri Prakash Jawadekar,  $\mathbf{of}$ Minister Human Resource Development, Government of India held the position of the Chancellor of the Sansthan. The Vice-Chancellor is the principal academic & executive officer. He is the president of all statutary bodies of the Sansthan. He exercises general supervision and control over the affairs of the Sansthan, executes policies and programmes and implements the decisions of all its authorities. Prof. Parmeshwar Narayan Shastry is continuing as the Vice Chancellor of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan during the year 2016-17. The following are the authorities of the Sansthan:
- Board of Management It is the principal organ of the management in the Sansthan. It is empowered to take policy decisions and to ensure implementation of the decisions.

- 2. Academic Council It is the principal academic body responsible for the maintenance of standards of education, teaching, training, examinations and research programme.
- **3. Finance Committee** It is the apex finance body responsible for placing annual accounts and financial estimates before the Board of Management, fixing limits of total expenditure and recommending creation of all types of posts.
- **4. Planning and Monitoring Board** It is the principal planning body responsible for monitoring of development programmes.

Apart from the above the Sansthan has also other consituted bodies for making recommendations with regard to their respective nature of functions namely Grant in Aid Committee, Publication Committee, Scholarship Selection Committee, Research Board and Examination Board.







# 4.1 ACTIVITIES AT HEAD QUARTER

## 4.1.1 ADMINISTRATION

The administration services of the Sansthan are executed through the following wings which are headed by the officers in-charge who assist in the subject matters linked with their units:

- (a) General Administration/Establishment
- (b) Personnel Administration
- (c) Campus Administration

In addition to the above main activities, this branch also deals with services and supplies, acquisition of land & building, establishment of new campuses and conducting meetings of Board of Management and Finance Committee. Various construction proposals for the buildings at different Campuses alongwith the estimated expenditure were sanctioned during the period under report which are campus wise summarised as under:

(a) Jaipur Campus, Jaipur (Rajasthan) - Rs. 115.58 Lakh (b) Rajiv Gandhi Campus, Sringeri (Karnataka) - Rs. 176.35 Lakh (c) Guruvayoor Campus, Trichur, (Kerala) - Rs. 436.28 Lakh (d)

Shri Sadashiva Campus, Puri (Orissa) - Rs. 264.74 Lakh (e) Vedavyas Campus, Balahar (H.P.) - Rs. 223.03 Lakh (Phase-II) (f) Ekalavya Campus, Agartala (Tripura) - Rs. 1200.00 Lakh (g) Headquarter, New Delhi Rs. 8.49 Lakh.

During the year 2016-17, Sansthan established its 13th campus at Devprayag, District Pauri Garhwal, Uttarkhand on 16th June, 2016 namely Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Devprayag by taking over Shri Raghunath Kirti Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya running since 1908. During the reported period, an amount of Rs. 5,25,50,592/- was released to Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Devprayag, Pauri Garhwal.

Under Right to Information Act, 2005, total number of 199 applications were received in the Headquarters Office and replies to 167 applications were given. 32 applications were transferred to the related campuses and institutions.

#### 4.1.2 FINANCE & ACCOUNTS

The important activities reported by this section for the year under report are as under:-

#### Budget (2016-17)

An unspent balance of Rs. 4120.65 lakh (Plan Rs. 1453.16 lakh and Non-Plan Rs. 2667.49 lakh) was carried over from the year

2015-2016 to the financial year 2016-2017. A total budget of Rs. 19040.39 lakh (including the previous unspent balance) was sanctioned by the Ministry. The amount was further allocated among the constituent units in the following manner:-

#### Accounts

# Maintenance of Provident Fund Accounts

The section maintains pay and provident fund accounts for officers and members of the staff of the Headquarters' Office. Every member has been supplied with the annual provident fund account statement immediately after the close of the financial year.

## **Settlement of Audit Objections**

Concerted efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual campuses were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were settled during the year.

### 4.1.3 ACADEMIC SECTION

The important responsibilities of this section are :

- To organize the Academic activities of the Sansthan.
- To frame syllabus of different subjects from Prathma to Acharya.
- To coordinate convening of Academic Council Meeting and Meeting of Board of Studies and take follow up action.
- This Section is also responsible for laying down standards for Academic performance and preparation of calendar of Academic programme.
- This year Sansthan has introduce the Diploma Course in Yoga, Ayurveda Sahitya and Vastu/Jyotish in four campuses.
- The Academic Section has also been entrusted the responsibility of grant of affiliation to Sanskrit institutions. The Sansthan had started with a few Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha but later some private institutions were also affiliated. These private institutions are affiliated only for the general courses from Prathama to Acharya and Vidyavaridhi. Under the instruction of University Grant Vidyalaya/Maha-Commission the vidyalaya cannot be affiliated. The status of Affiliated Institutions for the previous year was retained status quo on the recommendations of the Sub-Committee of Academic Council and Board of Management.
- During the year, A meeting of Academic Council of Sansthan had met once in the

month of 01.08.2016 (Annexure 'A'). In addition to this, the syllabi of Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) and Shiksha-Acharya (M.Ed.) were also revised on the recommendation of the constituted committee. The meeting of reviewing the syllabus of Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) and Shiksha-Acharya (M.Ed.) was held on 28th January, 2017, syllabus was amended and

was prepared for its printing (Annexure 'B'). This year Sansthan has introduce the Diploma Course in Yoga, Ayurveda Sahitya & Vastu/Jyotish in four campuses. In addition to this, a Meeting of the Sub-Committee of Academic Council had met twice in the month of 3rd May & 24th December, 2016 (Annexure 'C').

## 4.1.4 RESEARCH and PUBLICATION SECTION

This department is entrusted with the responsibilities of :

- A. Co-ordinating Research activities of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.
- B. Looking after the publication work of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

The department has the responsibility of organizing the meetings of Central Research Board and Publication Committee to carryout the above tasks.

Sansthan's Central Research Board met on 3-.11.2016 and 06.03.2017. Registration of 136 research students was approved in different Campuses for Vidyavaridhi research degree course. 19 JRF have been registered in Vidyavaridhi at the campuses including Headquarter.

The Sansthan through its Publication Committee meetings held on 04.04.2016 and 02.08.2016 approved various important titles for publication.


## 4.1.5 EXAMINATION SECTION

#### Scheme-IV

Financial Assistance for Publication, Re-print of Rare Sanskrit Books and Bulk Purchase of Sanskrit Books.

#### Scheme-V

Financial Assistance for Utilization of services of retired/eminent literary Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).

#### Scheme-VI

Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organisations to conduct "Prayogik Prasikshan" for Vocational training courses for the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Institutions.

### Scheme-VII

Financial Assistance to Universities/ Deemed Universities/ CBSE/ NCERT/ SCERT etc. to improve standards of Sanskrit teaching.

#### Scheme-VIII

Award of Scholarships to Students of Sanskrit Pathshalas /Mahavidyalayas/ High/Higher Secondary Schools/ Colleges.

#### Scheme-IX

All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest.

# I. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching

## a) Towards salary of Sanskrit Teachers for Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Schools/Mahavidyalayas

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance in the shape of salary to Sanskrit teachers, scholarship to students, Library grants. An amount of Rs. 734.07/- lakh approximately was incurred under this scheme by the Sansthan. During the year, financial assistance was provided to 457 institutions.

## b) Towards Salary of Teacher for Modern subjects in Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Mahavidyalas

Under this scheme of development of Sanskrit, the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is providing financial assistance to teachers for modern subjects remuneration of Rs. 6000/per subject. As per the scheme, the financial assistance is restricted to three teachers in modern subjects in each institution. An amount of Rs. 136.75 lakh was incurred under this scheme by the Sansthan in the year 2016-2017. The financial assistance was provided to 109 Institutions.

# c) Towards Salary of Sanskrit Teachers for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools belonging to State Govt.

Under the Scheme of development of Sanskrit, the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is providing financial assistance to Sanskrit teachers of Government Schools in different states. This assistance is extended towards salary of one Sanskrit teacher. During the year 2016-17, a total of 47 Government Schools were the beneficiaries and and an amount of Rs. 31.95 lakh was utilised under this scheme.

# II. Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.

Under the scheme the financial assistance is provided in the form of Samman Rashi by Sansthan to the eminent scholars above the age of 55 who have dedicated their lives to Sanskrit but have no settled source of income. The recommended scholar will be given Rs. 24,000/

- per annum, without deduction of income from other sources. For this purpose of Pandits having income of less than Rs. 24000/- per annum only would be considered.

# VII Finacial Assistance to Universities/ Deemed Universities/CBSE/NCERT/ SCERT etc. to improve standards of Sanskrit teaching.

Under these schemes, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan meets cent percent approved expenditure on different projects and programmes for the development and propagation of Sanskrit undertaken by NGO's/Deemed Sanskrit Universities/Universities/Institutions. During the year 2016-2017 the Sansthan incurred an expenditure of Rs. 4.76 lakh for various projects.

# IV Financial Assistance for Publication, Re-print and Bulk Purchase

During the year 2016-17, meeting of the Grants-in-Aid Committee of the Sansthan was convened on 10.08.2016 and 21.03.2017 in which several important proposals were approved under publication schemes. A total amount of Rs. 53.02/- lakh was released for the these schemes to meet out the expenses for their execution.

Under the scheme of Production of Sanskrit Literature, 15 books were published by different authors with financial assistance of the Sansthan and 30 other proposals were sanctioned for publication grant. (Annexures at 'J' and 'K') In addition to it, 29 Sanskrit Journals/News Papers were also granted annual publication grant.

#### V Shastra Chudamani Scheme

Under this Scheme, the services of retired eminent Sanskrit scholars are utilised in campuses, Adarsh Sanskrit Pathashalas and other State Government run Sanskrit Colleges/ Universities and voluntary organisations. The object of the Scheme is to preserve the indepth studies of different Shastras at the various centres where Sanskrit education is imparted to the Sanskrit students of traditional system. As per the scheme, the traditional scholars are appointed in different organisations. The scholars are being paid Rs.6000/- p.m. for a period of two years. The appointment so made can be extended for another one year on the recommendation of the Grants in Aid Committee. In addition to the existing appointed scholars, 27 more Shastra Chudamani Scholars were selected during 2016-2017. A sum of Rs. 43.82/- was utilised under the scheme.

### VI Vocational Training Scheme

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance to organise the workshop and to conduct Prayogik Prashikshan in vocational disciplines like Jyotisha, Karmakanda, Paleography, Cataloguing, Manuscriptology, Sanskrit Shorthand and Typing etc.. An amount of Rs. 3.92 lakh was utilised under this scheme during 2016-2017.

## VIII Award of Scholarships

This scheme is carried out by the scholarship section. Details regarding this are shown in 4.1.2. & 3.

### IX All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest

We organize different Shastric Competitions under the programme named Akhila Bharateeya Shastriya Spardha. The details of this programme during 2016-17 are given in 4.1.10 of this Annual Report.

## 4.1.9 SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan disburses scholarships of three types -

- (1) Internal scholarships for traditional Sanskrit students studying in its own campuses.
- (2) Merit scholarship at all India level for students studying Sanskrit from class 9th to Ph.D. in modern stream.
- (3) Merit Scholarship at all India level for Sanskrit students studying from Poorva Madhyama to Vidyavaridhi or equivalent degrees in traditional Sanskrit institutes.

Among the above mentioned 1,2,3, the type 1 scholarship (i.e. internal scholarship for the campus students) are directly distributed to the eligible students by the Campuses. Type 2 and

3 scholarships are distributed under the 'Scheme for the Development of Sanskrit Education' of Govt. of India. The disbursement of scholarships under this scheme is looked after by the scholarship section of H.Q. of Sansthan.

#### Internal (type 1) Scholarships

The rates of internal scholarships for students of Prak Shastri, Shastri, Shiksha Shastri and Acharya courses are Rs. 600/- Rs. 800/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 1000/- per month respectively. Scholars pursuing research for the award of Vidyavaridhi degree are granted monthly scholarship amount of Rs. 8000/- in addition to annual contingency grant of Rs. 8000/- for two years w.e.f. 18.02.2016.

According to our record, 72963 applications were received in the Sansthan from the Traditional and Modern institutions for award of Scholarship for the year 2016-17 under the Scholarship Scheme. After prepared the merit of the applications, 11665 applicants were selected for award of scholarship-2016-17 in modern & traditional streams from class 9th to Ph.D. programme in different places of India of various University/Colleges/Schools. ### 4.1.11 ADARSHA SANSKRIT MAHAVIDYALAYA/SHODH SANSTHAN

#### Name of the Scheme

The Scheme for Financial Assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans.

#### Introduction

The Scheme for financial assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas / Adarsh Shodha Sansthans was started by the Government of India for supporting traditional institutions of Sanskrit learning. It was revieved from time to time. The last review by Ministry of Human Resource Development was made in 1993 and the same became operative vide letter no. F. 30-19/88skt-I dated 7th July, 1993. Later the Scheme was transferred to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan for implementation Vide letter no. F.8-3/94-skt-I dated 17.7.1995 of the Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. This scheme has been further revised by Government of India, vide letter no. F.N. 31-4/2009-Skt.I dated 29th June, 2012.

Consequent upon the changes that have come about in the field of higher education, particularly Sanskrit education, implementation of 6th Pay Commission, Pay Grade and subsequent issuance of Regulations by the University Grants Commission for maintenance of standards in higher education, it has become imperative to reformulate the scheme in order to enable the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research in a more effective way.

Under this scheme, 26 Institutions are being run at various parts of the country with the financial assistance of Govt. of India through the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan and major portion of the finance for this scheme is being released by the Sansthan. There are 22 ASM & 04 ASS (01 ASM has been recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya for financial assistance in the March, 2015). Such institutions are provided 95% of the grant on recurring and 75% of grant on non-recurring items of expenditure.

#### **Objectives**

The objective of the Scheme is to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research. For this purpose, assistance is extended under this scheme to Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas for conducting courses at the level of Shastri and Acharya and to Shodha Sansthans (Research Institution) for organizing and conducting research - both at doctoral and post doctoral levels and bringing out research based publications and research journals.

#### **4.1.12 PROJECTS**

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has undertaken several valuable projects since 2003. The list of projects undertaken/being undertaken is given below for information even though there is no specific progress in these during the reporting year.

#### 1. Bhasha Mandakini (T.V. Telecast) -

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan telecasts Sanskrit programmes through Gyan Darshan Channel of IGNOU daily and thrice in a week through D.D. Bharati and D.D. India since September, 2003. since then 730 episodes of 30 minutes were telecast by IGNOU.

### 2. National E-data Bank of Sanskrit Literature :- (E-text)

The project aims at developing e-learning in Sanskrit and making e-Sanskrit corpus available to public through electronic texts and internet. Targets for the first phase of the project have been decided and the ground work has been prepared. One hundred texts have been taken up for preparing data-base to start the ground work for this tremendous task. Teachers in different campuses of the Sansthan have been assigned the texts as per their specializations and area of study. Data entry operators have been engaged for feeding the texts and preparing files on the computer.

104 books have been uploaded in the internet.

### 3. Sanskrit Teaching through Audio/ Video (Multimedia Project)

In this project DVD albums have been prepared संस्कृत भाषा शिक्षणम्, वैदिक गणित, संक्षेप-रामायणम्, नाट्यविंशतिका, कथादशकम्, प्रथमादीक्षा वी. सी.डी., तदेव गगनं सैव धरा, कविभास्करी, अभिज्ञान-शाकुन्तलम्, शब्दकल्पद्रुम एवं भासनाटकम् available for sale.

#### 4. MP3 Audio -

'Tattvachintamani' prepared by Prof. K.E. Devanathan, Tirupati and 'राणायणीयं सामगानम्' prepared by Shri Vedamurti Prabhakar Shastri and Pundlik Krishna Bhagvat is available for sale.

#### 5. E-Granthalaya –

3,05,567 books have been entered for networking the libraries of all campuses of Sansthan with E-granthalaya software.

#### 6. Manas Software -

Manas software for preparing data bank of Sanskrit Manuscripts has been assigned in the Allahabad Campus.

#### 7. Who is Who -

The Sansthan prepared data bank of Sanskrit Scholars in a book form as well as soft form. The book form 'Inventory of Sanskrit Scholars' (संस्कृतविद्वत्परिचायिका) already published on the occasion of 15th World Sanskrit Conference, 2012 and uploaded on website.

#### 8. Dictionary of Sanskrit -

Inter-lingual studies can provide a plausible way for promotion and preservation of languages. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has taken up a project on 'Dictionary of Sanskrit and other Indian languages including Dialects and Subdialects.' This project has been taken up with financial assistance under the schemes of MHRD in 2009.

This project will also contribute to the preservation and protection of traditional knowledge and linguistic skills through the study of common terminology in diverse Indian languages, dialects and sub-dialects. Details of Dictionary projects read as under:-

i. Work on 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary and 'Malvi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' is carried out in Bhopal campus, Bhopal. In 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary', collection work of 14000 words of Bundeli is completed and Bundeli to Sanskrit word-meanings of vowels, Kavarga, Cha, Chha, Ja, is completed. Remaining work of word-collection has been complete in 'Malavi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' collection work of 15,000 words of Malavi is completed and typed. Also, Malavi to Sanskrit word-meaning of vowels, Kavarga, Chavarga is completed. Remaining work of word-collection will complete by October, 2013.

ii. 'Dialect-Sub-Dialects of North and North East India' project is carried out in Sanskrit Sahitya Parishad, Kolkata, in which total 11,487 words of oriya and Banlga languages were collected.

iii. Work of 'Sanskrit-Persian-Urdu-Hindi Dictionary' is carried out in Sansthan headquarter. Under this project first volume based on vowels got published and in Consonants work from 'Ka' to 'Dha' is completed. Remaining work is in process.

#### 9. Sankhyayoga or Patanjalayoga Darshan-

In this project, the new edition of Patanjalayog Darshan is being prepared which is enriched and embellished with its terminologies and twelve antique commentaries. In the conservation of oriental Sanskrit texts, this project will contribute immensely. Two S.R.F. are working at Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi in this project.

The first phase of the project has been completed. In this phase, eleven commentaries of fifty one sutras of first chapter and common terminology available therein is arranged. In Appendix, the पाउभोद and of yogasutras are arranged alphabetically in first volume which is handed over to Research and Publication. The work on seven commentaries of Patanjala Yogasutra and four commentaries of Samkhyapravachan Bhasya is still carried on.

## 10. Special Drive for Collection and Digitizatin of Manuscripts -

All the Campuses of the Sansthan have independent libraries. This apart, the Campuses at Allahabad, Puri, Guruvayur and Lucknow have manuscript's libraries also. The Guruvayoor campus has undertaken a special drive for the collection of manuscripts from the year 2008-09 onward. The Sansthan has also taken the initiative for the digitization of all the manuscripts available in various libraries of its campuses. The digitization work will be conducted through NIC.

As per information received from National Manuscripts Mission, dizitization of 52,187

manuscripts out of 55,369 manuscripts has been completed in Allahabad Campus.

## Minor/Major Research Projects in Sansthan Campus

The Rashtriya Sasnkrit Sansthan strives to promote teaching and research in emerging areas in Sanskrit Shastras, accordingly the campuses of Sansthan have been the centres of research in higher education in various disciplines. Hence Sansthan provide the support to its campuses/teachers for promoting research through projects. In this regard Sansthan will allot 1-2 major projects and 1-2 minor projects to each campus, annually.

#### **MOOCs Project**

Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) constitute one of the most innovative moments with in open learning and distance education. Through the MOOC constantly evolving and create new learning opportunities in higher education. However there exist no consolidated approaches regarding the Sanskrit educational material development at the course implementation process Sansthan is doing the work accordingly.

#### Rajabhasha

Ministry has implemented the programme regarding promotion and propagation of Hindi Rajabhasha in all Central Govt. offices. Accordingly Sansthan also doing sufficient official work in Hindi as well as organizing different kinds of programme. Every year we send trisemister report of work done in Hindi to the Hon'ble Minister apart from other activities.

## Deccan College Sanskrit Dictionary Project

"An Encyclopedia Dictionary of Sanskrit on

Historical Principals" is being implemented by the Sansthan in department of Sanskrit and Lexicography, Deccan college, Pune with financial support from the Ministry of HRD through Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

The Prestigious dictionary project launched in the year 1948 and collection of reference material was completed in the year 1973. Nearly 1 crore and 10 lakhs reference cards containing one word in each card were completed upto 1973. There after the editorial work has started and till now 10 lakhs reference have been edited into 30 volumes and published 31st volume is ready for publication.

#### Shastratha Training Programme.

A Shastratha Training Programme organized by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was conducted from 02.03.2016 to 18.03.2016 at Eklavya Campus, Agartala, Tripura, NER. The aim of the training programme was to promote and popularized the Traditional Teaching system of Sanskrit Shashtras.

The training is focused on 6 various branches of Sanskrit i.e. Advaitavedanta, Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Mimansa, Nayaya and Sahitya, from each branch 10 students are selected by an All India Entrance test which is conducted on 10.02.2016 at various parts of India. In the Entrance Test near about 54 students work selected for Training and sixty well known Sanskrit Traditional Shastra Scholars came as Trainers. It is very effective and creative programme which has given very good results in Sanskrit field and students for protecting Shastras.

#### Bharatavani Project.

Bharatavani is a project with an objective of delivering knowledge in and about all the languages in India using multimedia (i.e., text, audio, video, images) formats through a portal (website). This portal would be all inclusive, interactive, dynamic and moderated. The idea is to make India an Open Knowledge Society, in the era of Digital India. Accordingly Sansthan has successfully uploaded 40 e-books on Bharatavani Portal.

Through the Non-Formal Sanskrit Education centres throughout India, people have become familiar with Sanskrit and cultural heritage of India, People from all walks of the society evinced great zeal for learning Sanskrit. Grand inauguration and valedictory functions were organized at various centres. Study materials of Prathama, Dwitiya and Threetiya Deeksha prepared by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan were the main base of teaching Sanskrit at their respective centres. The study materials were rated as excellent by the learners. Certificates of participation were awarded at the end of the Prathama, Dwitiya and Tritiya Deeksha. Learners at these centres exhibited great enthusiasm. Students, teachers, professors, doctors, engineers, bankers, industrialists, officers, lawyers, scientists, farmers and house wives etc. were the beneficiaries of the programmes.

These Non Formal Sanskrit Education Centres were not only run in cities and metropolitan cities of the country but they were also conducted in remote small villages, small towns, difficult accessibility areas of Jammu & Kashmir and North East states. The centres have been functioning at Universities, Degree Colleges, Inter Colleges, High and Higher Secondary Schools, Junior High Schools, Public Schools, Voluntary Organisations throughout the country. For the proper functioning of theses centres, State Co-ordinators were nominated in the States on receiving of proposals regarding centres, centres co-ordinators and teachers from respective States. 

## 01. Brief History of the Campus -

Situated in the heart of the holiest city Prayag i.e. in the bank of Ganga yamuna and Saraswati, Ganganath Jha Research Institute was founded on 17th November 1943 in the auspicious occasion of second death anniversary of Dr. M.M. Ganganatha Jha with a view to perpetuate his name and works by a number of Great persons including Indologist and erudite scholars of eminence, his students, well wishers and his family members like Mahamana Pt. Madan Mohan Malaviya, Dr. Tej Bahadur Sapru, Dr. Bhagvan Das, Dr. S. Radhakrishnana, Justice Sri kamala Kant Verma, Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj, Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishwari Prasad and Dr. Baburam Saxena etc.


The proposal for the building was registered on 12.1.45 under the society Registration act 1860. A land of 1.5 Acres was acquired with the effort of M.M. Umesh Mishra near the Chandra Shekhar Azad Park, in Company Bagh and the Foundation stone was laid on 3.2.1945 by the then Governor of U.P. Maurish Hailed.

D. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru was the first Chairman (1943-49) of the Institute followed by Dr. Bhagavan Das (1949-59),, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, (1963-65), justice Shri Kamala Kant Verma (1963-65) and Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj (1965-71). As Chairman of the Institute Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishvari Prasad, Dr. Baburam Saxena have contuributed a lot for the upliftment of this institute.

The Institute was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi (Under the Ministry of HRD, Government of India) in 1971 and it was named as Ganganatha Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Again from 2002 onwards it has been renamed as Ganganath Jha Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, when Sansthan was recognised by UGC as a Deemed University now the campus is dedicated to undertake, aid, promote and co-ordinate original researches in all branches of indology.

### 02. Location of the Campus. -

Ganganath Jha Campus is situated in Chandrasekhar Azad Park in the Company Bagh, near Indian press Chaurah, behind the statue of the great martyr Chandrasekhar Azad. Just in front of the Campus in the east lies pannalal Road, in the north Jawaharlal Nehru Road (G.T. Road) and in the behind in i.e. west Allahabad Museum is situated in the Kamala Nehru Road. The Campus is placed in the distance of 3 k.m. form Civil Line Bus Station, 5 k.m. from Railway station and 20 k.m. form Bamrauli Air Port.

## 4.2.2 Shri Sadashiva Campus, Puri (Odisha)

#### **Campus Introduction:**

Shree Sadashiva Campus established under the ministry of MHRD is ancient and prosperous campus in all over the thirteen campuses situated in India. Before this the present campus was governed by Odisha Govt. and progressed in Shree Sadashiva Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya in Puri. Initially an eminent Sanskrit scholar of Odisha Shree Harihar Das had started Sanskrit School in 1865 with the patronized collaboration of the Maharaja of Balarampur. After that great scholar Mahamahopadhyaya Shree Sadashiva Mishra had promoted this school as a college in 1918.

Although this college was administered by the Education dept. of Odisha Govt., yet later it was established as an autonomous body for the development and proper nourishment of Sanskrit subject. The subjects like Sahitya, Vyakaran, Navya Vyakaran, Vedanta, Dharma Shastra, Puran, Mimansha, Sankhya Yoga, Sarva Darshan and Jyotish were started to teach and The college has the reputation of producing many intellectual students who has gained extreme knowledge by studying these subjects which made them popular in all over the world.

This college was accepted as central Sanskrit Vidyapeeth of RSKS under the ministry of MHRD in 15th August 1971. The ministry of Human Resource development has declared Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as Deemed University on may 7th 2002. It was inaugurated on July 3rd 2002. It has thirteen campuses all over the India.

### Teaching Activity:

Recently in this Campus, the classical subjects like Sahitya, Navya Vakaran, Vedanta, Puran, Smrti, Mimamsa, Sankhya Yoga, Sarva Darshan, Jyotish etc are taught from Prak Shastri to Shikshya Acharya. ## 4.2.3 Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu (Jammu and Kashmir)

#### 1. Shri Ranbir Campus, Kot Bhalwal, Jammu

#### 1.1 Introduction

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University) is a premier institution for promoting Sanskrit studies in India and abroad. Founded in 1970, it is the biggest Sanskrit University in the world today, having multiple campuses, being run by the Ministry of Human Resorce Development, Government of India. Prof Parmeshwar Narayan Shastri is the Vice Chacellor of the University. There are 13 Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan across the nation. Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu is one of them.

#### 1.2 Objectives & Background

The erstwhile Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya, established by Maharaja Ranbir Singh (1830-1885), the former Ruler of the Jammu & Kashmir from 1856 to 1885, was taken over as one of the constituent Vidyapeetha by the Rashtriva Sanskrit Sansthan New Delhi, on 1st April, 1971, and was named as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. On declaration of the Sansthan as Deemed University, the Vidyapeetha was renamed as Shri Ranbir Campus. Dr. Anant Nath Shastri was the first Principal of the Institution followed by Dr. Dayanand Bhargay, Dr. J. Ganguly, Dr. Jaganath Pathak, Dr. Raghav Prasad Choudhary, Dr. Ram Kishore Shukla, Dr. Priyatam Chander Shastri (Incharge), Prof. G. Ganganna, Prof. Vishvamurti Shastri, Prof. Yashpal Khajuria (Incharge), Prof. M. Chander Shekher (Incharge), Prof. P.N. Shastri and Prof. Ramanuja Devanathan. At present, Prof Baccha Bharti is the Principal (Incharge) of the Campus.

### 1.3 Subjects & Departments

There are 8 subject departments in the Campus.

- 3) Department of Darshan

- 6) Department of Modern Subjects

- 8) Distance Education Centre

#### 1.4 Studies & Research Activities

Subjects like Hindi, Dogri, English, Political Science, History and Computer Science are taught, along with traditional subjects, up to Shastri (Graduation) level. There is also good arrangement for study of Environment Science and Yoga training for the students. Postgraduation courses are offered in traditional subjects. Besides, the campus also offers research programme leading to the award of Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) degree. The campus has undertaken an important project of Kashmir Shaiva Darshana Kosha with object of compiling a dictionary of Kashmir Shaiva Darshana. Semester System has been implemented at Graduation and Post Graduation levels. Teaching learning system in the campus is as follows:

#### (i) Traditional Sanskrit Studies

Under the traditional Sanskrit education, Shri Ranbir Campus runs Prak Shastri (Intermediate, 10+2, 2 year) course, Shastri (3 year, six semester Graduation) course, and Acharya (2 year, 4 semester) M.A. Course in Vyakarana, Jyotish (Phalit & Siddhant), Sahitya, Darshan and Veda, Shiksha Shastra (2 year B.Ed.) course. The Campus also have a Muktasvadhyaya Kendra for Distance Education courses, and a Kashmir Shaiva Darshana Kosha Project. Education is imparted by well-versed teachers of different disciplines to the Students from Prak Shastri to Acharya level.

#### (ii) Professional Education

Education Department, providing Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) Course was started in 1979 for the training of Sanskrit teachers.

#### (iii) Research Activities

The campus also offers research programme leading to the award of Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) degree. 120 Doctorate Degrees have been awarded to the students of the campus and at present 21 Research Scholars are enrolled in the campus. 15 students were enrolled in the current session.

#### 1.5 Distance Education Centre

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi, launches distance education mode for various traditional programmes through its Mukta Svadhyaya Pitham. All the programmes of M.S.P are approved by Distance Education Council and IGNOU. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan established Mukta-Svadhyayapeetham Centre at Jammu Campus in 2010-2011 to impart Sanskrit and traditional courses through distance education mode including on-line learning, to develop some innovative courses in inter-disciplinary fields covering Sanskrit Vangmaya. At present there are 46 students pursuing education through distance

### 1.6 Kashmir Shaiv Darshan Project

Kashmir Shaiv Darshan is an invaluable heritage of the province of Kashmir. For the purpose of conserving this heritage, the Kashmir Shaiv Darshan project is underway in Shri Ranbir campus. This project is exclusive to this campus of the University. Thanks to untiring efforts of research assistants affiliated with Late Dr. Baljinath Pandit, Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Kosh has been published in two Volumes. Both of these two volumes are available for sale. Copies are being sent all over the country and abroad. The department also houses 125 rare manuscripts in Sharda and Devanagari script.

#### 1.7 Publications

The Campus has published 23 books in

various subjects. Of these publications, there is great demand of Kashmir Shaiv-Darshan-related books all over the country. In addition to that, the Campus brings out many magazines also.

The Vaishnavi (the campus magazine) is published with ISSN number every year and is released during the Annual Day Function of the Campus.

Since the 2011-2012, the Department of Education has been bringing a magazine on Educational topics which is entitled "Shikshamritam"

Since 2015-16 session, the collection of the papers presented during Shri Shankar Shastrartha Parishad are being publised by the title "Shastrasaurabham".

Since 2016-17, Departmental Magazines are also being published by various departments of the Campus.

### 1.8 Library

Shri Ranbir Campus has its own well equipped library having 45,000 books of different subjects.

### 1.9 E-Library

E-library is being setup in the campus to facilitate students and scholars of the campus.

#### 1.10 Planetorium

The Jyotish Department is also equipped with small Planetorium laboratory. In this, laboratory Konus space, Terrestrial Telescope sky Watchers, Orion Dobsonian Konus Spot etc equipments are provided for their practical work.

#### 1.11 Conference Hall

Shri Ranbir Campus has a Conference Hall equipped with modern amenities having the seating capacity of 62 seats.

#### 1.12 Vani Vilas Auditorium

There is a big Vani Vilas Auditorium having the seating capacity of 500 seats with modern hi-tec amenities with sound proof system.

### 1.13 Computer Room

The campus has a well-equipped Computer Lab. All the students at Prak-shastri and Shastri levels are given free computer education. The computer lab has 17 computers with internet connection and well furnished furniture.

### 1.14 Departmental Computers

For smooth functioning, every department have their own computer system with internet facility.

#### 1.15 Departmental Library

In order to motivate and facilitate students, every department has been granted 50000 rupees for the departmental library from current session.

#### 1.16 Language Lab

The Shikhsa Shastra Department is also equipped with Educational Technology laboratory wherein basic equipments for educational innovative practices are available. The lab trains the pupil-teachers in using modern technology for teaching Sanskrit via OHP, computer PPt presentations, slide projectors etc. The lab is also equipped with Dish Antenna, Tape Recorders. Etc.

#### 1.17 Psychology Lab

The Department of Shiksha Shastra is equipped with furnished Psychology Laboratory. There are equipments for conducting practicals on various theories of psychological foundations.

### 1.18 Teaching & Non Teaching Staff

There are 38 teachers, 23 office employees, 04 caretakers and 04 CPWD employees serving in the campus.

## 1.19 Hostel

Campus consists of two hostels for boys and girls. Hostel facilities are provided to students of traditional courses of the campus, subject to availability of accommodation. The boys hostel and the girls hostel have 60 and 24 residential

rooms having the capacity of 168 students. Hostel rooms are furnished with necessary furniture. There are separate messes for both the hostels.

#### 1.20 Staff Quarters

The campus has Staff Quarters for the Principal, Hostel Warden and Other Staff members.

#### 1.21 Gymnasium

Ranbir Campus has a Gymnasium equipped with modern machines for the physical and mental growth of the students.

#### 1.22 Play Ground

There is a big playground in the campus for variety of outdoor sports and games.

#### 2. Literary and cultural activities

# 4.2.4 Guruvayoor Campus, Purnattukara, Trichur (Kerala)

#### 1 Introduction

The Guruvayoor Campus came into being on 16-07-1979 consequent on the takeover of an institution then known as Guruvayoor Sahitya Deepika Sanskrit Vidyapeetha at Pavaratty near Guruvayoor, founded by Late Sri. P.T. Kuriakkose Master. The erstwhile Vidyapeetha had attained fame in and outside the state of Kerala as a centre of Sanskrit Learning imparting instruction at graduate and postgraduate level with affiliation to Madras University in 1934, Kerala University in 1958 and Calicut University in 1968. This abode of ancient traditional studies got affiliation with Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan under Ministry of H.R.D. Govt. of India, with effect from January 1972.

The Guruvayoor Campus has two centres, one at Puranattukara and one at Pavaratty.

Centre at Puranattukara is the main centre which situates on a beautiful landscape of an extent of fourteen acres. It comprises of Main Academic block, Administrative block, Boys & Girls Hostel for an accommodation of 120 students each, Library, Guest House, Auditorium, Play Ground, Semi functional building and quarters.

Centre at Pavaratty situates on a land of extent of 50 cents. This centre is renamed as P.T. KuriakkoseSmrithiBhawan. There is a single storied building having two big halls, one administrative room and ten class rooms with all modern amenities.

# 4.2.7 Shri Rajiv Gandhi Campus, Sringeri (Karnataka)

#### About the Campus

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan established Rajiv Gandhi Campus at Sringeri, the abode of ancient treasure of knowledge where Sri Adi Shankara Bhagavatpada has established an Amnaya Peetha for the preservation and propagation of ancient treasure of knowledge, on 13th January 1992. The foundation stone of the Campus was laid on 5th March 1992 by His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Sri Bharati Teertha Mahaswamiji of Dakshinamnaya Sringeri Sri Sharada Peetham, in the benign presence of Shri R. Venkataraman, the then President of India, and Shri Arjun Singh, the then minister for HRD, Government of India. The Central Public Works Department has constructed the main building of the Campus at the cost of Rs. 1.63 crores. In the second phase the construction of hostels for boys and girls, quarters for minimum requirement of the staff has been done at the cost of Rs. 4.17 crores. Recently, in the year 2014-15 an extension work of the main building, a play ground construction work and hostel extension work were undertaken with a cost of Rs 8.05 crores, and the truncated position of the building was completed and inaugurated on 07 February 2016 by Prof. P.N. Shastry, the Honourable Vice-Chancellor of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

### The Campus Location

### 4.2.9 Bhopal Campus, Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh)

### 1. About the Campus

As per the recommendation of the Sanskrit Commission (1956-57) the Government of India established the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on 15 October, 1970 as an autonomous body, for the development along with the dissemination of Sanskrit and the implementation of the Central Government's policies and programs regarding Sanskrit. Considering its multifarious importance in May 2002 the Ministry of Human Resource and Development, Government of India, has declared it a Multi Campuses Deemed University. At present total 13 campuses of this deemed university are working in different states of India among which, from the session 2002-2003, the Bhopal campus is being run in the capital city of M.P.- Bhopal.

Bhopal is a city which is well flourished in the aspects of natural, intellectual, literary, historical and political wealth from the ancient times. So the MHRD Govt. of India issued the establishment order no. Sasnkrit-1-section dated 31st March 2002 to establish the Bhopal campus in the city. For the implementation of this government order the RSKS New Delhi started the Bhopal Campus from 1st July 2002, as per the letter no.- 37021/2002-admin/1108 office order no. 107/dated 5.6.2002, by providing the principal and other departments etc. Though 10 years before this date, in 1991-92, by the declaration of the then minister of Human Resource and Development Ministry Govt. of India, Honourable Shri Arjun Singh, the planning of this Bhopal campus had been decided and at that very time the Govt. of M.P. had given 10 acres land at free of cost, for the development of this campus through the Govt. order letter no- F 6730/ Govt./Sa-2B/93 dated 27.05.1993/ 20.7.1993. Thus, from 6th July 2002 in the room provided in the Barkatullah University Guest House the Bhopal Campus activities were started and from 2nd August 2002 the admission of the students and the teaching activities were started in a rented building in Arera Colony.

The formal inauguration of the Bhopal Campus was declared on the date 16th September 2002 by the then Governor of M.P. Honorable Bhai Mahaveer ji in the presence of the then V.C. RSKS New Delhi Prof. Vempati Kutumb Shastri ji, the founder Principal of the Campus Prof. Azad Mishra ji and the other reputed scholars of the Sanskrit world. After that the then chief minister of M.P. Honorable Shri Digvijay Singh ji laid the foundation stone of this campus building on the allotted land plot on 27.02.2003. The foundation stone of the main administrative building was laid by the then minister of MHRD Honorable Shri Arjun Singh ji on the date 19th September 2005 for the further development of the Campus.

Then in the presence of then VC Prof. Radhavallabh Tripathi the newly built main building was named as the Vatsaraja Bhavan on the date 24.03.2010 i.e. Wednesday Ramnavami and all the campus activities were started in this Vatsaraja Bhavan from that day. At present in this Vatsaraja main building all the classes, laboratories, non-formal classes, departmental libraries, correspondent open education centre, Natya Shastra research centre, meeting hall and fully equipped auditorium are available. Along with these a systematic Vararuchi Granthagar (Central Library) and an air-conditioned Bhavabhuti Prekshagar (Auditorium) fully equipped with audio visual facilities too are available. In this building the guest room, teachers' room and rooms for the HODs are also given as per the rules. Apart from these a boys' hostel for 333 students, girls' hostel for 108 students, guest house, principal and employees residence have been provided in the campus.

• The campus is running 6 departments including- Sahitya, Vyakaran, Jyotish, Jain Darshan and Education with the Modern Subjects Department. The courses offered include Prakshastri, Shastri, Acharya, Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.), Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.), a separate certificate course in Jyotish (3 months), Diploma in

Vastushastra and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) in different branches of Sanskrit knowledge. For the training of the physical education a modern gymnasium along with playground is provided to the students.

- The Mukta Swadhyay Peeth is working in the campus for providing Sanskrit education to the people who want to learn Sanskrit.
- The campus Vararuchi Granthagara (Central Library) maintains a rich collection of many references, journals, books, other magazines and newspapers.
- The campus possesses well equipped Computer, Jyotish, Language, Curriculum and Psychology laboratories for the advance studies in Sanskrit.
- The well maintained open air theatre is built in the campus premises which can accommodate 300 people at a time.
- Bhopal Campus runs the unique Natyashastra Anusandhan Kendra which works on the theatrical presentation of the Sanskrit plays and dramas. It records and prepares the audio CDs of the Sanskrit songs and slokas.
- The Bhopal Campus publishes two ISSN journals namely Rashtri (ISSN- 2231-2129) and Shastra Mimansa (ISSN- 2321-6948). The yearly departmental publications are also there in all the departments of the campus.

Thus this Campus is striving hard to achieve the decided goals for the development of the Sanskrit Education.

# 4.2.10 K.J. Somaiya Sanskrit Vidyapeetham Campus, Mumbai (Maharashtra)

#### A Short Introduction:

Mumbai is one of the four Indian Metropolitan cities, located on the Western Coast, having 2.5 crores of population. It is the capital of Maharashtra. This Metropolitan city is also known by the economical capital of India, by the blessings of the deity Mumbadevi.

With a view to propagating the traditional knowledge system introduced by the sages, banking on the admixture of Traditional studies and new dawns, the K. J. Somaiya Trust had donated one acre land for starting a centralized Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. To make it successful the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Deemed University had constituted a committee. The Committee members had reviewed the land and recommended for the Vidyapeetha to be started in Mumbai and forwarded a report in this regard to the Ministry of HRD.

The Ministry had sent an approval to start the Vidyapeetha and the K. J. Somaiya Trust gave the permission to start the scheme of various Courses.

### The Current Situation of the Campus:

The Inauguration of the Mumbai Campus of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, (Deemed University), had been done by then Honorable HRD Minister, Govt. of India, Dr. Murli Manohar Joshi on the 16th May 2002. There are facilities for the courses of Prak-Shastri (+2), Shastri (B.A.), Acharya (M.A.) in concerned subjects of Sahitya, Vyakarana and Jyotisha and with Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D) for subjects associated at the K. J. Somaiya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. Apart from these, English, Hindi, Political Science, Computer Studies and the subjects like Environmental Studies are being taught here according to the Sansthan's Syllabus. This syllabus is not only along with commercial studies but is a tool to learn Sanskrit through the Distance Education. Along with the modern system, Hindi and English, the professional Course of one year Shiksha-Shastri (B.Ed) is compulsorily in Sanskrit has been practiced for 100 students (for the academic year (2015-16) it has been extended for 2 years). It was started in the academic year 2007-08 after the recognition by NCTE.

Currently, the K. J. Somaiya Trust in Vidyavihar had donated an invaluable one acre land for the construction of the Vidyapeetha. All the formalities for the construction of building have been completed.

At present, the activities are being practiced in a way that the Administration and Library are in Polytechnic Bhavan, Learning-Teaching, research etc. are in Chanakya Bhavan and Suruchi (Kala) Bhavan.

# The outlook of the Mission and the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan:

The Aim of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is:

- (I). To make Sanskrit useful in all ways, to make the Sanskrit literature linked with the education along with other languages, to give importance to the traditional system of Sanskrit education, to propagate various activities of the Sansthan and to implement all the policies for the total development of the Sanskrit traditional studies.
- (II). All types efforts are to be done to run all the branches to make the tools available through the technical medium to learn Sanskrit, to create human resources along with complete Sanskrit support, to do research and comparative study in the field of technology on the context of Sanskrit.

# About the Campus (Brief History of the Campus)

Shri Raghunatha kirti Adarsha Sanskrit Mahavidylaya (Estd.1908), Devaprayaga, Uttarakhand was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on 16th June, 2016 as its 13th constituent Campus. Like the former Mahavidyalaya, the campus is also named after the famous ancient deity Shri Raghunathaji shrined in the ancient Raghunatha temple constructed in the Katyuri style of Katyuri dynasty of the mountains on the holy confluence of two important mythological rivers, namely, Bhagirathi and Alaknanda from where exactly the river Ganga is believed to be originated.

Because of this cultural, spiritual and educational background, the campus was inaugurated here on 16.06.16 by Mr. Mantriprasad Naithani, then Hon'ble Education Minister of Uttarakhand in the precious presence of Prof. P.N. Shastri, the Vice chancellor of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan along with M. K. Dhyani, the Ex Rajyasabha Member and Mr. Rajendra Kotiyal, the Suchana Ayukta, Uttarakhand. The former Sanskrit Mahavidylaya has donated its premises with a vast land measuring 3.443 hectares and simultaneously the Govt. of uttarakhand has also allotted some adjourned portion of land measuring 9.228 hectares. Now the campus has total land of 23 acres. The land with the complete approved lay-out plan has been handed over to CPWD (Shrinagar Branch) for the construction work of the campus building. The construction of Boundary is already in progress and the construction of all other required blocks including Academic, Administrative and residential (Hostel for Boys and Girls both, Guest House and several types of Staff Quarters) along with Library hall, Auditorium and Stadium and play ground etc. will start soon in May 2017.

#### **Campus Location**

So far as the geographical, historical, mythological and educational status is concerned, Devaprayaga comes in the state of Uttarakhanda (formerly Uttaranchal and still formerly Uttarpradesh) which is popularly and culturally known as Devabhumi or the divine land. This state of Devabhumi is adorned not only with one of the famous Jyotirmathas called Shribadrikashrama but with one of the twelve jyotirlingas, namely, Shrikedarnatha. The province has the credit of being the sources of two vedic as well mythological rivers Ganga and Yamuna. Even today also the divine-soul (devatatma) Himalaya stands here as the measuring pole of the earth as if to glorify the state.

According to the Kedarakhanda of the Skanda-Purana, the name Devaprayaga came into existence on the very name of the sage Shri Devasharma who has undergone a severe penance in this auspicious place. Devaprayaga has the credit of being recognised as the first prayaga among the five prayagas of Uttarakhand, followed by Rudra prayaga, Karna Prayaga, Nanda prayaga and Vishnu prayaga respectively. The small but important city Deva prayaga is surrounded with atleast three series of mountains, namely, Griddhachala, Dasharathachala and Nrisimhachala etc. The Nrisimhachala part of Devaprayaga was famous earlier as a centre of learning in entire Uttarakhanda being categorically named as vidyakshetram. It is the only state where Sanskrit is accepted as its second official language.

### **Regular Courses Offered**

The newly established campus now functions with five departments where traditional subjects like Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Sahitya, Veda and Nyaya are taught along with the modern Subjects like Hindi, English, History, computer science etc. (up to graduation or Shastri level). The campus now runs in the earlier constructed limited space of the former Mahavidyalaya with around fifty students admitted to different classes of:

- Prak Shastri (Intermediate)
- Shastri (B.A.)
- Acharya (M.A.)
- Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.)

The campus is committed to offer research programmes mainly leading to the award of Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) degree in forthcoming years. Some research students are transferred from other campuses to continue their ph.D. works here.

#### **Future Courses**

• Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.): Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) course is to be started here in next academic year which is specifically meant for the training of Sanskrit teachers.

# Non-formal Sanskrit Teaching Courses

- Non-formal course of Spoken Sanskrit: The campus has also undertaken a non-formal course of Spoken Sanskrit to enable the students to speak Sanskrit fluently. It is going to arrange a residenial camp for teaching the students through the prathama diksha and dvitiya diksha programme of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan





#### **SCHEDULE 23 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

#### 1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and generaly on the accrual method of accounting.

#### 2. REVENUE RECOGNITION

- 2.1. Fees from students (except Tution Fees), Sale of Admission forma, Royalty and Interest on Saving Bank account are accounted on cash basis.
- 2.2. Income from Investments are accounted on accrual basis.

#### 3. FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- 3.1. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition, installation and
- 3.2. Gifted/Donated assets are valued at the declared value where available; if not available, the value is estimated based on the present market value adjusted with reference to the physical condition of the asset. They are set up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the Institution. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets.
- 3.3. Books received as gifts, are valued at selling prices printed on the books. Where they are not printed, the value is based on assessment.
- 3.4. Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Straight line method, at the following rates:

- 3.5 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.
- 3.6 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Re.I in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.
- 3.7 Assets created out of Earmarked Funds and funds of Sponsored Projects, where the ownership of such assets vests in the University, are setup by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the University. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets. Assets created out of Sponsored Project funds, where the ownership is retained by the sponsors but held and used by the University are separately disclosed in the Notes on Accounts.

  3.8 Leasehold Land is amortized over period of lease.
- 4. Intangible Assets: Patents and copy rights, E Journals and Computer Software are grouped under Intangible Assets.

#### 5. STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of office and computer stationary stock is accounted as revenue expenditure. However, being a pioneer/nodal institution for the propagation and development of Sanskrit stock of Sansthan publication/books are treated as fixed assets. (refer Schedule-4)

#### **6. RETIRMENT BENEFITS**

- 6.1 Retirement benefits are treated as per GOI Rules. It includes Pension, Gratuity, Leave Encashment and Provident Fund.
- 6.2 A fixed medical allowance of Rs.500/- p.m. is being paid as per Govt. of India OM dated 19.11.2014.
- 6.3 For Provident Fund of employees of Sansthan a separate set of accounts Receipt & Payment, Income & Expenditure and Balance Sheet are prepared and is
- 6.4 For pension also an earmarked fund has been created in which Govt. Grant and expenditure is accounted in Schedule-2.
- 6.5 132 employees are covered under New Pension Scheme.

#### 7. INVESTMENTS

Investment is in the form of Fixed Deposit in the bank. There is no diminution in its value.

#### 8. Earmarked / Endowment Funds

- 8.1 Sansthan is having one earmarked fund for Pension and five endowment funds in the name of Jindal Trust, Dubey Award, Somaiya Trust, Shukla Trust and RK Sharma. All these dedicated funds have been depicted in Schedule-2
- 8.2 Expenditure on the special funds is deducted from these funds only and not taken to the Income & Expenditure account.

#### 9. Government and UGC Grants

- 9.1 Sansthan is functioning on the basis of grant received from Ministry of HRD which is being accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to the financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as recoverable from the Grantor.
- 9.2 Grant utilized for fixed assets has been shown as Capital expenditure and remaining as revenue. (refer Schedule-10)
- 9.3 Unutilized grants as carried forward as unspent (refer Schedule-10) and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet. (refer Schedule-3)

#### 10. INVESTMENT OF EARMARKED I FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCURED ON SUCH INVESTMENT:

- 10.1 These earmarked funds are invested in fixed deposit in Banks.
- 10.2 Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the University. (refer Schedule-2)

#### 11. SPONSORED PROJECTS

Sansthan is having one project of UGC - SRF/JRF (Senior/Junior Research Fellow) funded by UGC.

#### 12. INCOME TAX

12.1 Sansthan is a Deemed University and fully finance through Govt. grant. The income of the University is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts. No TDS is deducted by the bank on investment in Terms Deposits.
