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1. AN OVERVIEW

1.1. The Institution

Formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, was established by the Govt. of India in the year 1970 as per the recommendations of Sanskrit Commission 1956. Its main aim & objective was to promote, propagate and preserve Sanskrit learning, teaching and research throughout the country. It was fully funded by the Ministry of HRD (now Ministry of Education), Govt. of India.

Considering its contribution in the field of promotion and propagation of traditional Sanskrit education, the Government of India accorded it the status of Deemed to be University w.e.f. 7th May, 2002. The erstwhile Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University) has now been promulgated as Central Sanskrit University, Delhi (CSU) under the Central Sanskrit Universities Act, 2020 (No.5 of 2020) passed by the Parliament and assented to by His Excellency, the President of India and started functioning as the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi since 30th April, 2020. With its Headquarters at New Delhi, it has twelve campuses spread across the country. In addition to these constituent campuses, it has granted affiliation to 58 Sanskrit institutions established in different regions of the Country.

Besides, it also working as the nodal agency of Govt. of India for overall promotion of Sanskrit language and was entrusted with implementation of following Central Schemes for development of Sanskrit education:-

- 1. Presidential Awards for Certificate of Honour and Maharishi Badarayan Vyas Samman to the Scholars in Sanskrit, Pali, Prakrit, Arabic, Persian, Classical Kannada, Classical Telugu, Classical Malayalam and Classical Odiya languages.
- 2. Scheme for Financial Assistance to the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya/Adarsh Shodha Sansthan.
- 3. Financial Assistance to Voluntary Sanskrit Organizations.
- 4. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching.
- 5. Pali-Prakrit Scheme

- 6. Financial Assistance to NGOs/Deemed Sanskrit Universities /CBSE/NCERT/ SCERT for various Research Projects and Programmes/ Activities for promotion of Sanskrit.
- 7. Financial Assistance for Publication/Re-print of rare books and Bulk Purchase of Books.
- 8. Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organisations to conduct "Vocational Training Courses" to the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions.
- 9. Financial Assistance for award of Scholarship to students of Sanskrit Pathashalas/ Mahavidyalayas/Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges/Universities under the scheme for Development of Sanskrit Education.
- 10. All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest (Akhil Bhartiya Shastriya Spardha).
- 11. Financial Assistance for Utilization of services of retired/eminent literary Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).
- 12. Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.
- 13. Sanskrit Dictionary Project, Deccan College, Pune.
- 14. Financial Assistance under Ashtaadashi (18 Projects for sustaining growth of Sanskrit).

Under these schemes, financial assistance is provided to institutions/organizations/scholars engaged in propagation and development of Sanskrit throughout the country.

1.2 Role and functions

The major objectives of the Central Sanskrit University as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and in pursuance thereof -

1. To Provide for higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels fully

conforming to the concept of university, namely University Education Report (1948) and the Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).

- 2. To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management, etc. routinely offered by conventional institutions.
- 3. To provide for high quality teaching and research and for the advancement of knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken in-house by substantial number of full time faculty/research scholars (Ph.D and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines.
- 4. To enable creation of University under the 'de novo' category devoted to unique in emerging areas of knowledge, not being pursued by conventional or existing institutions particularly in specific areas of study and research preferably sponsored by the Government of a State/UT or the Central Government regarded as important for strategic needs of the country or for the preservation of our cultural heritage, so determined by a well laid-out process of wide consultation with the eminent peers of academic community.
- 5. To undertake, aid, promote, coordinate research in all branches of Sanskrit learning including teachers' training and manuscriptology, to bring out linkage with the outcome of modern research in the contextually relevant fields and to bring out publications.
- 6. To act as nodal agency for the Government of India to implement its policies and programmes for the development of Sanskrit.
- 7. To provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as it may deem fit.
- 8. To provide for research and for the

- advancement of/and dissemination of knowledge.
- 9. To undertake extra mural studies, extension programmes and field outreach activities to contribute to the development of society.
- 10. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the objectives of the University.

1.3 Programmes and Activities

Realising its objectives, the University has undertaken the following major programmes and activities:-

- Establishment of Campuses in different States of India.
- Conducting teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary/Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Research at Doctorate levels.
- Conducting teachers training at graduate level i.e. Shiksha-Shastri (B. Ed.) and Post graduate level i.e. Shiksha-Acharya (M.Ed.).
- Conducting and Coordinating research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit.
- Cooperating with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.
- Establishment of Sanskrit libraries, manuscripts' collection centres and also editing and publishing rare manuscripts and books of importance.
- Conferment of degrees and granting of diplomas/certificates to persons having satisfactorily completed the approved prescribed courses of study/research and passed prescribed examinations.
- Instituting and awarding visitorship, fellowship, scholarships, stipends, prizes and medals.
- Conducting distance education programmes.
- Implementation of schemes of the Ministry of Education for the promotion of Sanskrit.

1.4 Teaching

Teaching is conducted from Prak-Shastri to Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the University in its 12 Campuses. The affiliated institutions carry out teaching from Prathama to Acharya.

Sanskrit institutions managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the University also impart teaching with the same syllabus.

1.5 Teachers' Training

In the Campuses, teacher's training course of one academic year with emphasis on teaching practice, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha-Shastri Degree which is equivalent to B.Ed.. In addition, Shiksha-Acharya Degree course equivalent to M.Ed. is conducted in Jaipur and Bhopal Campuses.

1.6 Research

In all the Campuses of the University, students are enrolled for carrying out research leading to the award of degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph D

However, Ganga Nath Jha Campus, Prayagraj is exclusively dedicated to research activities in selected branches of Sanskrit. The Library of the Campus is

one of the richest Sanskrit Libraries in the country. A collection of over 57,957 rare manuscripts are also preserved in the library.

1.7 Publications

Research Journals and Books

The Central Sanskrit University has been publishing two research journals containing research based articles, namely 'Sanskrit Vimarsha' and Journal of the Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj. While the first journal is brought out by the University's Headquarters Office, the other is published by Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj. In addition, the Campuses also publish annual literary magazines. The campuses also upgraded the annual magazines published by them as research journals.

The University as well as the Campuses have brought out scholarly works, rare manuscripts and original texts. The University has published 688 books so far.

Sanskrit Varta - a quarterly news bulletin in Sanskrit is also being published regularly.

2. AUTHORITIES & STRUCTURE

- 2.1 Hon'ble President of India Sh. Ram Nath Kovind is the visitor of the Central Sanskrit University. Minister of Education, Government of India is the Chancellor of the University. During the period 01.04.2020 to 31.03.2021 Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank', Minister of Education, Government of India held the position of the Chancellor of the University. The Vice-Chancellor is the principal academic & executive officer. He is the president of all statutary bodies of the University. He exercises general supervision and control over the affairs of the University, executes policies and programmes and implements the decisions of all its authorities. Prof. Parmeshwara Narayana Shastry is Vice Chancellor of Central Sanskrit University during the year 2020-21. The following are the authorities of the University:
- 1. **Court -** Constitution of the court and powers of the court shall be as prescribed by the clause 20 of the Central Sanskrit University Act. 2020.
- **2. Executive Council** It is the principal body to the manage the University. It is empowered to take policy decisions and to ensure implementation of the decisions.
- 3. Academic Council It is the principal

- academic body, responsible for the maintenance of standards of education, teaching, training, examinations and research programme.
- 3. Finance Committee It is the apex finance body responsible for placing annual accounts and financial estimates before the Board of Management, fixing limits of total expenditure and recommending creation of all types of posts.
- **4. Planning and Monitoring Board -** It is the principal planning body responsible for monitoring of development programmes of the University.

Apart from the above, the University has also other consituted bodies for making recommendations with regard Planning and Monitoring Board to their respective nature of functions namely Grant-in-Aid Committee, Publication Committee, Scholarship Selection Committee, Research Board and Examination Board.





4.1 ACTIVITIES AT HEAD QUARTER

4.1.1 ADMINISTRATION

The administration services of the University are executed through the following wings which are headed by the officers in-charge who assist in the subject matters linked with their unitsz:

- (a) General Administration/Establishment
- (b) Personnel Administration
- (c) Campus Administration

In addition to the above main activities, this branch also deals with services and supplies, acquisition of land & building, establishment of new campuses and conducting meetings of Board of Management and Finance Committee. Various construction proposals for the buildings at different Campuses alongwith the estimated expenditure were sanctioned during the period under report which are campus wise summarised as under:

(a) Shri Raghunathkirti Campus (Uttarakhand) - Rs. 2580 Lakh (b) Guruvayoor Campus, Trichur, (Kerala) - Rs. 300 Lakh

Under Right to Information Act, 2005, total number of 177 applications and 17 first appeals were received in the Headquarters Office and replies to 176 applications and 16 appeals were given. 27 applications were transferred to the related campuses and institutions.

4.1.2 FINANCE & ACCOUNTS

The important activities reported by this section for the year under report are as under:-

Budget (2020-21)

An unspent balance of Rs.505.50 Lakh (Revenue Rs. 505.50 Lakh) was carried over from the year

2019-20 to the financial year 2020-21. A total budget of Rs. 19790.57 Lakh (including the previous unspent balance) was sanctioned by the Ministry. The amount was further allocated among the constituent units the following manner:-

These funds were utilised during the year on pay and allowances, scholarships, President's award to eminent Sanskrit scholars and various schemes under development of Sanskrit Education and other maintenance items of expenditure.

Accounts

The wing is responsible for the consolidation of accounts received from various units of the University and submission to DGACR for audit. The consolidated annual account for the year 2020-21 submitted to DGACR for Audit are placed at Annexure-'M'.

Maintenance of Provident Fund Accounts

The section maintains pay and provident fund accounts for officers and members of the staff of the Headquarters Office. Every member has been supplied with the annual provident fund account statement immediately after the close of the financial year.

Settlement of Audit Objections

Concerted efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual campuses were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were settled during the year.

4.1.3 ACADEMIC SECTION

The important responsibilities of the section are:

- * To organize the Academic activities of the University and frame syllabi for various courses.
- * To creating syllabus of different subjects and Prathma to Acharya.
- * Formation of committees (BOS) of different subjects to prepare curriculum for classes from Prathma to Acharya.
- * To coordinate convening of Academic Council Meeting and Meeting of Board of Studies and take follow up action and follow up action.
- * During the last year, three meeings of the Acadmic Council were held in the Academic

- Section. (22 July, 05 November, 2020, 30 March, 2021)
- The Academic Section has also been entrusted the responsibility of grant of affiliation to Sanskrit institutions. The University had started with a few Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha but later some private institutions were also affiliated. These private institutions are affiliated only for the general courses from Prathama to Acharya and Vidyavaridhi. Under the instruction of University Grant Commission the Vidyalaya/Maha-vidyalaya cannot be affiliated. The status of Affiliated Institutions for the previous year was retained *status quo* on the recommendations of the Sub-Committee of Academic Council and Board of Management.

4.1.4 RESEARCH and PUBLICATION SECTION

This section is entrusted with the responsibilities of :

- A. Co-ordinating Research activities of Central Sanskrit University.
- B. Looking after the publication work of Central Sanskrit University.
- C. Co-ordinating of schemes financial assistance for bulk purchase books, financial assistance for publication for sanskrit literature, financial assistance for reprint of sanskrit books.

The department has the responsibility of organizing the meetings of Central Research Board and Publication Committee to carryout the above tasks.

The University through its research board meetings held on 06.07.2020 approved various synopsis of research scholars of University. 04 JRF have been registered in Vidyavaridhi at the campuses including Headquarter.

In addition to this, Sanskrit Varta-Quarterly news bulletin in Sanskrit and Sanskrit Vimarsh were also published.

4.1.5 EXAMINATION SECTION



Scheme-IV

Financial Assistance for Publication, Re-print of Rare Sanskrit Books and Bulk Purchase of Sanskrit Books.

Scheme-V

Financial Assistance for Utilization of services of retired/eminent literary Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).

Scheme-VI

Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organisations to conduct "Prayogik Prasikshan" for Vocational training courses for the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Institutions.

Scheme-VII

Financial Assistance to Universities/Deemed Universities/CBSE/NCERT/SCERT etc. to improve standards of Sanskrit teaching.

Scheme-VIII

Award of Scholarships to Students of Sanskrit Pathshalas/Mahavidyalayas/High/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges.

Scheme-IX

All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest.

I. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching

a) Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teachers to the Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance in the shape of salary to Sanskrit teachers @ Rs. 8000/-, Scholarship to students, Library grants. An amount of Rs. 687.98 lakh (approximately) was incurred under this scheme by the University. During the year 2020-21, financial assistance was provided to 420 institutions. As per the scheme, the financial assistance is restricted to four teachers in Sanskrit subject in each institutions. (Annexure-I)

b) Financial Assitance for Teachers for Modern subjects in Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Mahavidyalas

Under this scheme of development of Sanskrit Language, the Central Sanskrit University is providing financial assistance to teachers for Modern subjects remuneration of Rs. 8000/-per month. As per the scheme, the financial assistance is restricted to three teachers in modern subjects in each institution. An amount of Rs. 182.52 lakh was incurred under this scheme by the University in the year 2020-21. The financial assistance was provided to 148 Institutions.

c) Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teachers for Secondary / Higher Secondary Schools belonging to State Government Schools

Under the Scheme of development of Sanskrit Language, the Central Sanskrit University is providing financial assistance to Sanskrit teachers (@ 8,000/-P.M.) appointed in Govt. and Govt. aided High/Higher Secondary Schools where the State Government are not in a position to provide facilities to do so. This assistance is extended towards salary of one Sanskrit teacher. During the year 2020-21, a total of 13 Government Schools were the beneficiaries and and an amount of Rs. 11.52 lakh was utilised under this scheme.

d). Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.

Under the scheme the financial assistance is provided in the form of Samman Rashi by University

to the Eminent Sanskrit Scholars above the age of 65 years. Who have dedicated their lives to Sanskrit but have no settled source of income. The recommended scholar will be given Rs. 36,000/- per annum, without deduction of income from other sources. Only Pandits having would be considered for assistance having income of less than Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum only. No other qualifications have been prescribed the purpose.

II. Financial Assistance to NGOs/Deemed Sanskrit Universities/Universities for various Research Projects and Programmes/ Activities for promotion of Sanskrit

&

III. Finacial Assistance to Universities/Deemed Universities/CBSE/NCERT/SCERT etc. to improve standards of Sanskrit teaching.

Under these schemes, Central Sanskrit University meets cent-percent approved expenditure on different projects and programmes for the development and propagation of Sanskrit undertaken by NGO's/Deemed Sanskrit Universities/Universities Institutions. During the year 2020-21 the University incurred an expenditure of Rs. 2.70 lakh for various projects.

IV Financial Assistance for Publication, Re-print and Bulk Purchase

During the year 2020-21, meeting of the Grants-in-Aid Committee of the University was convened on 10.03.2021 in which several important proposals were approved under publication schemes.

Under the scheme of Production of Sanskrit Literature, 8 books were published by different authors with financial assistance of the Sansthan and 13 other proposals were sanctioned for publication grant. (Annexures at 'J' and 'K') In addition to it, 12 Sanskrit Journals/News Papers were also granted annual publication grant.

V. Financial Assistance for Utilization for Utilization of services of retired/eminent literary Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).

Under this Scheme, the services of retired eminent Sanskrit scholars are utilised in campuses, Adarsh Sanskrit Pathashalas and Sanskrit Colleges/ Universities and voluntary organisations run by the State Government. The object of the Scheme is to preserve the indepth studies of different Shastras at the various centres where Sanskrit education is imparted to the Sanskrit students with traditional system. As per the scheme, the traditional scholars are appointed in different organisations. The scholars are being paid Rs. 10,000/- p.m. for a period of two years. The appointment so made can be extended for

another one year on the recommendation of the Grants in Aid Committee. A sum of Rs. 45.60 was utilized under the scheme for the year 2020-21.

VI. Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organisations to Conduct "Vocational Training Courses" to the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions.

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance to organise the workshop and to conduct Prayogik Prashikshan in vocational disciplines like Jyotisha, Karmakanda, Paleography, Catalogu-ing, Manuscriptology, Sanskrit Shorthand and Typing etc. An amount of Rs. 1.26 lakh was utilised under this scheme during 2020-21.

4.1.9 SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

Central Sanskrit University disburses two types of scholarships -

- (1) Internal scholarships for traditional Sanskrit students studying in University's own campuses.
- (2) Financial Assistance for Award of Scholarship to students of Sanskrit Pathashalas/Mahavidyalayas/High/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges at All India Level in Modern and Traditional Streams.

Among the above mentioned 1,2 the type 1 scholarship (i.e. internal scholarship for the campus students) are directly distributed to the eligible students by the Campuses. Type 2 scholarships is distributed under the 'Scheme for the Development

of Sanskrit Education' of Govt. of India. The disbursement of scholarships under this scheme is looked after by the scholarship section of H.Q. of University.

Internal (type 1) Scholarships

The rates of internal scholarships for students of Prak Shastri, Shastri, Shiksha Shastri and Acharya courses are Rs. 600/- Rs. 800/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 1000/- per month respec-tively. Scholars pursuing research for the award of Vidyavaridhi degree are granted monthly scholarship amount of Rs. 8000/- in addition to annual contingency grant of Rs. 8000/- for two years w.e.f. 18.02.2016.

Introduction:-

In order to encourage the students in Sanskrit/ Pali/Prakrit, a merit scholarship is provided by the Central Sanskrit University under the scheme for Development of Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit Education to regular students studying Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit as a main or optional subject in any recognized Sanskrit Pathashala/Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya/ Sanskrit Vishwavidyalaya in Traditional Stream or School/ College/ University in Modern Stream pursuing Purva-Madhyama(1st year)/9th standard, Purva-Madhyama (2nd year)/10th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/Prakshastri (1st year)/11th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/ Prakshastri (2nd year)/12th standard, Shastri /B.A (1st/2nd/3rd year), Acharya/ M.A(1st/2nd year), Vidyawaridhi/Ph.D. or equivalent.

4.1.11 ADARSHA SANSKRIT MAHAVIDYALAYA/ SHODH SANSTHAN

Name of the Scheme

The Scheme for Financial Assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans.

Introduction

The Scheme for financial assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas / Adarsh Shodha Sansthans was started by the Government of India in 1978 for supporting traditional institutions of Sanskrit learning. The Scheme was first revieved in 1983 vide Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India letter no. F.80-7/88-Sk.I dated 06.10.1983. Then it was revised in 1993 vide Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India letter no. F. 30-19/88-skt-I dated 6th July, 1993. Later the Scheme was transferred to the Central Sanskrit University for implementation Vide letter no. F. 8-3/ 94-skt-I dated 16.06.1995 of the Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. This scheme has been further revised by Government of India, vide letter no. F.N. 31-4/2009-Skt.I dated 29th June, 2012.

Consequent upon the changes that have come about in the field of higher education, particularly Sanskrit education, implementation of 6th Pay Commission and subsequent issuance of Regulations by the University Grants Commission for maintenance

of standards in higher education, it has become imperative to reformulate the scheme in order to enable the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research in a more effective way.

Under this scheme, 26 Institutions are being run at various parts of the country with the financial assistance of Govt. of India through the Central Sanskrit University and major portion of the finance for this scheme is being released by the CSU. There are 22 ASMs & 04 ASSs. These institutions are financially assisted to the extent of the 95% of the admissible expenditure for recurring item and to the extent of 75% for non-recurring items, subject to the maximum of Rs.5.00 lakh per annum relating to development of infrastruture.

Objectives

The objective of the Scheme is to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research. For this purpose, assistance is extended under this scheme to Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas for conducting courses at the level of Shastri and Acharya and to Shodha Sansthans (Research Institution) for organizing and conducting research - both at doctoral and post doctoral levels and bringing out research based publications and research journals.

4.1.12 PROJECTS

Central Sanskrit University has undertaken several valuable projects since 2003. The list of projects undertaken/being undertaken is given below for information even though there is no specific progress in these during the reporting year.

i. Bhasha Mandakini (T.V. Telecast)

Central Sanskrit University telecasts Sanskrit programmes through Cyan Darshan Channel of IGNOU daily and thrice in a week through D.D. Bharati and D.D. India since September, 2003. since then 730 episodes of 30 minutes were telecast by IGNOU.

2. National E-data Bank of Sanskrit Literature :- (E-text)

The project aims at developing e-learning in Sanskrit and making e-Sanskrit corpus available to public through electronic texts and internet. Targets for the first phase of the project have been decided and the ground work has been prepared. One hundred texts have been taken up for preparing data-base to start the ground work for this tremendous task. Teachers in different campuses of the University have been assigned the texts as per their specializations and area of study. Data entry operators have been engaged for feeding the texts and preparing files on the computer. 120 video lectures have been uploaded in the University's website.

3. Sanskrit Teaching through Audio/Video (Multimedia Project)

In this project DVD albums have been prepared Sanskrit Bhasha Shikshnam, Vaidic Ganit, Sankshepa Ramayana, Naytyavinshatika, Kathadashakam, Prathama Deeksha V.C.D., Tadeva Gaganam Saiva Dhara, Kavibhaskari, Abhijnanashakuntalam, Shabdakalpadrum and Bhasnatakchakram are available for sale.

4. MP3 Audio -

'Tattvachintamani' prepared by Prof. K.E. Devanathan, Tirupati and 'राणायणीयं सामगानम्' prepared by Shri Vedamurti Prabhakar Shastri and Pundlik Krishna Bhagvat is available for sale.

5. E-Granthalaya -

3.05,567 books have been entered for networking the libraries of all campuses of University with Egranthalaya software.

6. Manas Software -

Manas software for preparing data bank of Sanskrit Manuscripts has been assigned in the Allahabad Campus.

7. Who is Who -

The University prepared data bank of Sanskrit Scholars in a book form as well as soft form. The book form 'Inventory of Sanskrit Scholars' (संस्कृतविद्वत्परिचायिका) already published on the occasion of 15th World Sanskrit Conference, 2012 and uploaded on website.

8. Dictionary of Sanskrit -

Inter-lingual studies can provide a plausible way for promotion and preservation of languages. Central Sanskrit University has taken up a project on 'Dictionary of Sanskrit and other Indian languages including Dialects and Sub-dialects.' This project has been taken up with financial assistance under the schemes of MHRD in 2009.

This project will also contribute to the preservation and protection of traditional knowledge and linguistic skills through the study of common terminology in diverse Indian languages, dialects and sub-dialects. Details of Dictionary projects read as under:-

i. Work on 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary and 'Malvi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' is carried out in Bhopal campus, Bhopal. In 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary', collection work of 14000 words of Bundeli is completed and Bundeli to Sanskrit word-meanings of vowels, Kavarga, Cha, Chha, Ja, is completed. Remaining work of word-collection has been complete in 'Malavi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' collection work of 15,000 words of Malavi is completed and typed. Also,

Malavi to Sanskrit word-meaning of vowels, Kavarga, Chavarga is completed.

- ii. 'Dialect-Sub-Dialects of North and North East India' project is carried out in Sanskrit Sahitya Parishad, Kolkata, in which total 11,487 words of oriya and Banlga languages were collected.
- iii. Work of 'Sanskrit-Persian-Urdu-Hindi Dictionary' is carried out in University headquarter. Under this project first volume based on vowels got published and in Consonants work from 'Ka' to 'Dha' is completed. Remaining work is in process.

9. Sankhyayoga or Patanjalayoga Darshan-

In this project, the new edition of Patanjalayog Darshan is being prepared which is enriched and embellished with its terminologies and twelve antique commentaries. In the conservation of oriental Sanskrit texts, this project will contribute immensely. Two S.R.F. are working at Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi in this project.

The first phase of the project has been completed. In this phase, eleven commentaries of fifty one sutras of first chapter and common terminology available therein is arranged. In Appendix, the पाउभेद and of yogasutras are arranged alphabetically in first volume which is handed over to Research and Publication. The work on seven commentaries of Patanjala Yogasutra and four commentaries of Samkhyapravachan Bhasya is still carried on.

10. Special Drive for Collection and Digitizatin of Manuscripts -

All the Campuses of the University have independent libraries. This apart, the Campuses at Allahabad, Puri, Guruvayur and Lucknow have manuscript Ds libraries also. The Guruvayoor campus has undertaken a special drive for the collection of manuscripts from the year 2008-09 onward. The University has also taken the initiative for the digitization of all the manuscripts available in various libraries of its campuses. The digitization work will be conducted through NIC.

As per information received from National Manuscripts Mission, dizitization of 55,369 manuscripts out of 52,187 manuscripts has been completed in Allahabad Campus.

Central Sanskrit University has undertaken

11. Minor/Major Research Projects in University Campus

The Central Sanskrit University strives to promote teaching and research in emerging areas in Sanskrit Shastras, accordingly the campuses of University have been the centres of research in higher education in various disciplines. Hence University provide the support to its campuses/teachers for promoting research through projects. In this regard University will allot 1-2 major projects and 1-2 minor projects to each campus, annually. To achieve this goal there are 32 projects in first round (4 major & 2 minor) projects are in continuation.

12. MOOCs Project

Mooc's training workshop was held at Eklavya Campus, Agartala (Tripura) from 22-28 March, 2018 to develop lesson on MOOC Platform by teaching staff of all departments from various campuses.

13. Bharatavani Project.

Bharatavani is a project with an objective of delivering knowledge in and about all the languages in India using multimedia (i.e., text, audio, video, images) formats through a portal (website). This portal would be all inclusive, interactive, dynamic and moderated. The idea is to make India an Open Knowledge Society, in the era of Digital India. Accordingly University has successfully uploaded 40 e-books on Bharatavani Portal.

At Present Running Projects

1. Deccan College Sanskrit Dictionary Project

"An Encyclopedia Dictionary of Sanskrit on Historical Principles" is being implemented by the University in department of Sanskrit and Lexicography, Deccan college, Pune with financial support from the Ministry of HRD through Central Sanskrit University. Till now 35 volumes are published in this project.

2. Rajabhasha

Ministry has implemented the programme regarding promotion and propagation of Hindi Rajabhasha in all Central Govt. offices. Accordingly University also doing sufficient official work in Hindi as well as organizing different kinds of programme. Every year trisemister report will be sent of work done in Hindi to the Hon'ble Minister apart from other activities.

4.1.14 NON FORMAL SANSKRIT EDUCATION

Central Sanskrit University conducted the following programmes through the department of Non Formal Sanskrit Education during the year 2020-21:

- 1. Functioning of Non Formal Sanskrit Learning Centres.
- 2. Residential Sanskrit Teachers Training.

1. Functioning of Non Formal Sanskrit Learning Centres

Sanskrit language is a unique treasure of Indian intectual tradition and Culture. The nature of Sanskrit is very vast and comprehensive. Innummerable Indians want to study Sanskrit for the protection and firmaness of their Indian aspect. With simple process, they are to be introduced Sanskrit language and knowledge contained therein in simple way. With concept of this great objectives and to provide the facility of Sanskrit study to the learners of varigated walks of society. Non Formal Sanskrit Education was started by the Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi.

The centers were set up by the Central Sanskrit University on the basis of applications received from highly reputed Institutions of the country like the Indian Institutes of Technology, Institutions of Ayurveda, Modern Colleges and Universities. Central Sanskrit University has appointed trained Sanskrit teachers for the current academic session in these centers. An authorised officer has been nominated at each center by the Vice-Chancellor of Central Sanskrit University for the smooth functioning of the Non Formal Sanskrit learning center. In the academic session 2020-21, with the help of the authorized officer, A total of 77 centers were conducted in North East states, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Goa, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Chhattisgarh, Jammu-Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh. Authorized Officers evaluate all the activities of their respective centers and forward the monthly progress details to the Department.

A total of 4700 learners of different age groups benefited in this academic session in the Sanskrit language certificate course and Sanskrit language Diploma course conducted by Non Formal Sanskrit Deptt.

Grand opening and closing ceremonies were organized in different centers, in which important visitors working in the field of Sanskrit, while expressing their views, explained the need for Sanskrit language enrichment. The heads of institutions have also requested the Central Sanskrit University to co-ordinate the Non

Formal Sanskrit learning center in their institution in the next academic session also.

4.1.15 CORRESPONDENCE COURSE



4.2 ACTIVITIES AT CAMPUSES

4.2.1 Shri Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj (U.P.)

1. Introduction

Ganganath Jha Research Institute was established on 17 November, 1943 in Prayagraj (Allahabad), the place of the holy confluence of the Ganges, Yamuna and Saraswati. It was established by Dr. Madan Mohan Malaviya, Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru, Dr. Bhagwandas, Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, Justice Shri Kamalakant Verma, Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj, Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Ishwari Prasad, Dr. Baburam Saxena, Lt. Governor Adityanath Jha and his followers, disciples, tutors and various family members, to commemorate the second death anniversary of Sir (Dr.) Ganganath Jha.

The research institute was registered on 12 January, 1945 under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. After receiving one and a half acres of land in the backyard of Chandrashekhar Azad Park in Company Bagh from the Government of Uttar Pradesh, with the efforts of Dr. Umesh Mishra, the foundation stone of its building was laid down on 3rd February, 1945 by the Hon'ble Governor of Uttar Pradesh, Sir Maris Hallett.


The first President of the institute was Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru (1943–49). Few of his notable successors were Dr. Bhagwandas (1949–59), Dr. S. Radhakrishnan (1959-63), Justice Shri Kamalakant Verma (1963-65) and Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj (1965–71). Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishwari Prasad and Dr. Baburam Saxena also contributed to

this institution as the Vice-President.

It was taken over by the CSU (Former Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan), New Delhi on April 01, 1971 as its integral Vidyapeeth. At that time, the research institute came to be known as 'Ganganath Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth'. It was further named as 'Ganganath Jha Campus' in 2002, after the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan got 'Deemed University' status. After the declaration of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University) as Central Sanskrit University by the Government of India, the campus is known as the CSU Ganganath Jha Campus of Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi. This campus is an eminent research center in the field of higher studies, which is dedicated to research in various disciplines of Sanskrit studies in the country and the world.

2. Location of Ganganath Jha Campus

The Ganganath Jha Campus is located near the Chandrashekhar Azad Martyr site, next to the Indian Press Chauraha inside the Chandrashekhar Azad Park. Opposite the campus is Pannalal Road, Jawaharlal Nehru Road is towards north and Allahabad Museum is located on Kamla Nehru Road behind the campus. The Ganganath Jha campus is located 3 km from the premises of Civil Lines Bus Station, 5 km from Allahabad Railway Station and the airport is located at a distance of 15 km at Bamrauli.



3. Main Activities

The Ganganatha Jha Campus is mainly a research institute. The main areas of work here, include the following:-

i. Research Training

(Pre-Ph.D. course-work for newly enrolled research students of all campuses under Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi),

ii. Publication

- (A) Journal of the Ganganatha Jha Campus A research journal devoted to Oriental Studies in general and Indological Studies in particular,
- (b) Edited Manuscripts and other books prepared under campus project,
- (C) Ushati A research journal devoted to Sanskrit Studies in general and Shastric Studies in particular),

iii. Preservation and conservation of Manuscripts

In addition to this, campus also conducts classes (via distance mode) for Prak-Shastri, Shastri, Acharya (Shahitya, Vyakaran, Jyotish) and Praak-Shastri Setu, Shastri Setu, Acharya Setu.

4.2.2 Shri Sadashiv Campus, Puri (Odisha)

1. About the Campus

Sri Sadashiv Campus, Puri (Odisha) one of the largest campuses of Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, has a history, going back to 1865, when, as a result of the initiative of Late Pt. H.H. Dash, an erudite and eminent scholar of the time, it started as a Sanskrit Toll with financial assistance from His Highness Digvijaya Singh Bahadur of Balarampur (U.P.). It became a school in 1888 under the supervision of a committee headed by the Collector of Puri. As a result of the untiring efforts of Shri Sadahiva Mishra, a brilliant alumnus of the Toll/ School, the institution was given a rent-free gift of the present premises by the Government of Odisha and Bihar and was raised to the level of a college around the year 1918. In 1951, the state Government named the College after Shri Sadashiva Mishra in recognition of the services rendered by him to the institution. On 15.08.1971 Sadahiva College was taken over by Central Sanskrit University (formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan).

1.1 Campus Location:

Now at present this campus has two pieces of land at Gandhi Ghat Mouza and Balukhanda Mouza. The educational complex is running on a plot of 4.7 Acres and residential complex is at Balukhanda Mouza having 10.5 Acres of land. Total the campus is having 15.2 Acres of land in the important location of the city.

1.2 Courses Offered. (with full details)

This campus offers the courses of Prak Sastri (Intermediate), Sastri (B.A), Siksha Sastri (B.Ed), Siksha Acharya (M.Ed.), Acharya (M.A) in the disciplines of Adwaita Vedanta, Sahitya, Vyakarana, Dharma Shastra, Sarva Darshan, Jyotish, Puran Itihas, Navya Nyaya, & Sankhya Yoga. Vidya Varidhi (Ph.D.) is also offered. The campus offers modern subjects such as History, English, Computer Science, Environment Studies for equipping the students with multi-faceted talent. Short term certificate courses in Bharatiya Jyothisha is also being conducted in the main center of the Campus.

4.2.3 Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu (Jammu and Kashmir)

1 Introduction

Shri Ranbir Campus, situated at Jammu, the winter capital of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, is one of the 12 campuses of CSU. The campus building has been constructed on a stretch of land, measuring 84 kanals.

1.1 Objectives and Background

The history of the campus goes back to 1857 when Maharaja Sri Ranbir Singh of Jammu and Kashmir established Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya at Jammu, with a view to preserve and propagate the traditional knowledge enshrined in the Sanskrit language and literature. This Mahavidyalaya was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Government of India, on April 1, 1971, and named as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth. With the declaration of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as a multi-campus deemed university on May 2, 2002, this institution came to be called 'Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Shri Ranbir Campus. Dr. Anant Maral Shastri was the first principal of the institution, followed by Dr. Dayanand Bhargava, Dr. J. Ganguly, Dr. Murlidhar Pandey, Dr. Jagannath Pathak, Dr. Raghav Prasad Chaudhary, Dr. Ram Kishore Shukla, Dr. Priyatam Chandra Shastri (In-charge), Dr. G. Ganganna, Prof. Vishwa Murti Shastri, Prof. Yash Pal Khajuria (Incharge), Prof. M. Chandrasekhar (In-charge), Prof. P.N. Shastry (In-charge), Prof. Ramanuja Devanathan, Prof. Bachcha Bharti (In-charge), Prof. Lokmanya Mishra (In-charge), Prof. Fateh Singh (In-charge), Sh. Sharat Chander Sharma (In-charge). Prof. Vasudev Sharma (In-charge) was the last principal and the first Director of the Campus. At present, Prof. Madan Mohan Jha is the Director of the Campus.

1.2 Subjects and Departments

1.3 Studies and Research Activities

Shri Ranbir Campus provides education based on a beautiful combination of traditional and modern systems of education. As per the directions of the Headquarters, semester system has been implemented in the Campus. Class-wise teaching arrangements are, as follow:

i) Traditional Sanskrit Studies

Under the traditional Sanskrit Studies, the Campus has arrangements for teaching Prak-Shastri (Intermediate 10+2), Shastri (B.A.) and Acharya (M.A.). The subjects taught include – traditional Sanskrit subjects like Sanskrit Grammar (Vyakarana), Sanskrit Literature (Sahitya), Philosophy (Darshan), Astrology (Siddhanta and PhalitJyotisha), and Vedic Literature (Veda); and modern subjects like English, Hindi, Dogri, History, Political Science, Computer Science, Environmental Science and Physical Education.

ii) Professional Education

Professional course Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) is taught in the Department of Education.

iii) Research Activities

In order to conduct multi-dimensional research activities in the relevant fields of Sanskrit learning, there are arrangements for Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) guidance. Till last year, 120 research scholars have been awarded Ph.D. degrees. At present, 13 students are registered as research scholars in the campus.

1.4 Distance Education Centre (Mukta-Swadhyaya-Peetham)

There are 44 students registered with the Centre in the current session. The centre provides Intermediate (Prak-Shastri), B.A. (Shastri) and M.A. (Acharya) courses as per annual exam system. A

special feature of the *Mukhta- swadhyayapeetham* is that there is an arrangement for Bridge courses for non-Sanskrit students. Under these courses, the students are provided audio-visual material with other course material such as textbooks etc. so that non-Sanskrit knowing students also can learn Sanskrit easily in a short time.

In addition to Sanskrit Literature, grammar and *Jyotisha* subjects, the centre is also conducting a course in Sanskrit journalism. There are plans for introducing other classical subjects. Besides these, certificate courses in Dramatics (*Natyashastra*), Pali, Prakrut etc, would be introduced soon. For these initiatives, the Sansthan Headquarters, the *Muktaswadhayayapeetham* and all the lovers of Sanskrit deserve to be congratulated. A number of members of local Intelligentsia, such as, engineers, doctors, lawyers, and teachers have joined the courses offered by the *Kendram*.

1.5 Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project

Kashmir Shaiva Darshan is a priceless legacy of Jammu and Kashmir. For the conservation and preservation of this priceless legacy, the Campus is exclusively running a Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project on its premises. Through the tireless efforts of Late Dr. Baljinnath Pandit and the research assistants associated with the project, two volumes of Kashmir Shaiva Darshan have been published, which are available for sale. The copies of the volumes are being sent all over India and the world.

1.6 Publications

The campus has published 23 books relating to the various branches of knowledge. There is a great demand in the country for the books relating to Kashmir Shaiva Darshan. Publication of Annual Research Magazine "Shri Vaishnavi" featuring research-oriented articles, poems etc. in Sanskrit, English, Hindi, Dogri is being carried on regularly since the inception of the institution.

Besides this, Education Department has started publishing a Shiksha-Shastra journal titled "Shikshamritam" since the academic year 2011-12. Another Campus magazine 'VAIKHARI' is being started from the current academic session 2020-21 which will which carry articles etc. by Campus students.

1.7 Library

The well-stocked library of the Campus enshrines

about 46000 books on various subjects. The library also houses 72 rare manuscripts. The manuscripts are in Sharada and Devanagari scripts.

1. About the Campus

Bhopal is a city which is well flourished in the aspects of natural, intellectual, literary, historical and political wealth from the ancient times. So the MHRD Govt. of India issued the establishment order no. Sasnkrit-i-section dated 31st March 2002 to establish the Bhopal campus in the city. For the implementation of this government order the RSKS New Delhi started the Bhopal Campus from 1st July 2002, as per the letter no.- 37021/2002-admin/no8 office order no. iO7/dated 5.6.2002, by providing the principal and other departments etc. The formal inauguration of the Bhopal Campus was declared on the date 16th September 2002 by the then Governor of M.P. Honorable Bhai Mahaveerji in the presence of the then V.C., RSKS New Delhi Prof. Vempati Kutumba Shastri, the founder Principal of the Campus Prof. Azad Mishra and the other reputed scholars of the Sanskrit world. After that the then chief minister of M.P. Honorable Shri Digvijay Singh laid the foundation stone of this campus building on the allotted land plot on 27.02.2003.

- The campus is running 6 departments including- Sahitya, Vyakaran, Jyotish, Jain Darshan and Education with the Modern Subjects Department. The courses offered include Prakshastri, Shastri, Acharya, Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.), Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.), a separate certificate course in Jyotish (3 months), Diploma in Vastushastra and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) in different branches of Sanskrit knowledge. For the training of the physical education a modern gymnasium along with playground is provided to the students.
- The Mukta Swadhyay Peeth is working in the campus for providing Sanskrit education to the people who want to learn Sanskrit.
- The campus Vararuchi Granthagara (Central Library) maintains a rich collection of many references, journals, books, other magazines and newspapers.

1. About the Campus in brief

A Philanthropist, great visionary, Padma Bhushan awardee Shri Karamshi Jetha Bhai Somaiya has a great contribution in the field of Education and Social Service. He established an educational institution in Somaiya Vidyavihar which is known as one of the biggest and esteemed educational institutions and named as Somaiya Vidyavihar University, throughout the world. The Somaiya family has a great reverence and passion towards Sanskrit language and culture. Hence Shri Shantilal Somaiya, S/o Shri K.J. Somaiya submitted a proposal to H.R.D.Ministry, Government of India to establish a Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), New Delhi in Somaiya Vidyavihar. Consequent upon the submission of proposal by K.J. Somaiya Trust, Vidyavihar, Mumbai, a Committee appointed by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, carried out an inspection and recommended establishing its constituent Vidyapeetha there. The Ministry of H.R.D., Government of India was kind enough to concur in the recommendations of the Committee vide the decision taken on 31st March 2002. K.J. Somaiya Trust allowed the CSU to utilize their existing built-up structure for conducting the classes until the construction of building of the Campus is complete. The Sansthan has taken possession of the allotted land of one acre from the leaser Somaiya Trust. On the auspicious day of 16th May 2002, the then Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource & Development, Government of India, Dr. Murali Manohar Joshi inaugurated the Mumbai campus. The construction of the new building on this site is in progress. The teaching-learning process, in this campus, started precisely from 2003. The N.C.T.E. approved Shiksha-Shastri Course (equivalent to B. Ed.) has also been introduced in the campus since 2005.

2. Campus Location

The Campus is located at Vidyavihar (East), Ghatkopar, Mumbai, the economic capital of India. The K. J. Somaiya Trust in Vidyavihar has donated one acre land for the construction of Central Sanskrit University, K.J. Somaiya Campus. All the formalities

for the construction of building have almost been completed.

At present, the various teaching-learning activities, Shastra classes and Research works are running in the Chanakya Bhavan of Somaiya Campus. 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4.2.12 Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Devprayag, Uttarakhand

1. Introduction

Shri Raghunatha Kirti Adarsha Sanskrit Mahavidylaya (Estd.1908), Devaprayaga, Uttarakhand was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on 16th June, 2016 as its 13th constituent Campus. The campus has been named after the famous ancient deity Shri Raghunathaji shrine in the ancient Raghunatha temple constructed in the Katyuri style of Katyuri dynasty of the mountains on the holy confluence of two important mythological rivers, namely, Bhagirathi and Alaknanda from where exactly the river Ganga is originated.

Because of this cultural, spiritual and educational background, the campus was inaugurated here on 16.06.16. The former Sanskrit Mahavidylaya has donated its premises with a vast land measuring 3.443 hectares and simultaneously the Govt. of Uttarakhand has also allotted some adjourned portion of land measuring 9.228 hectares. Now the campus has total land of 23 acres. The land with the complete approved lay-out plan has been handed over to CPWD (Shrinagar Branch) for the construction of the campus building The first Foundion stone was laid by the honourable Governor of Uttarakhand Dr. K.K.Paul on 06.05.2017 whereas the Second Foundation stone was laid by Dr. Satyapal Singh, the honourable state Minister of Higher Education, Ministry of HRD, Govt. Of India on 08.11.2017. The construction of all the required blocks including Academic, Administrative and residential (Hostel for Boys and Girls both, Guest House and several types of Staff Quarters) along with Library hall, Auditorium and Stadium (play ground) etc. are in progress and heading towards completion.

So far as the geographical, historical, cultural, mythological and educational status is concerned, Devaprayaga comes in the state of Uttarakhanda, popularly and culturally known as Devabhumi or the divine land.

2. Regular Courses Offered

The newly established campus now functions with six departments where traditional subjects like

Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Sahitya, Veda, Vedanta and Nyaya are being taught along with the modern Subjects like Hindi, English, History, computer science etc. (up to graduation or Shastri level). Around hundred students are admitted to following different classes:

- **Prak Shastri** (Intermediate)
- Shastri (B.A.)
- Acharya (M.A.)

Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.): The campus is also committed to offer research programmes for the award of Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) degree of Centeral Sanskrit University. At present seven research students are enrolled in the campus for their Ph.D. works.

3. Center of Distance Education Mukta-Swadhyayapeetha

Muktswadhyaypeetham under the Central Sanskrit University is always engaged in promotion of Sanskrit Language through distance education, for which self-study centres have established in all the Campuses of University. Establishment of self-study centre in Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus has been done in 2020-21 session, under which the bridge courses for astrology, literature and vyakarna and full courses have been offered from prak-shastri to acharya respectively. In addition, certificate course in Sanskrit journalism, certificate courses in Pali and Praakrit languages have also been started, in which Sanskrit students are studying. The responsibility of its coordination has been given to Dr. Anil Kumar. Tourism and Ayurveda regarding courses are also planned to be included in future.

Vigilance Awareness Day: Vigilance Awareness Day was observed in the campus on 25.11.2020




5.7 Central Sanskrit University Foundation Day



Schedule 23 - Significant Accounting Polices

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and generaly on the accrual method of accounting.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION

- 2.1. Fees from students (except Tution Fees), Sale of Admission form, Royalty and Interest on Saving Bank account are accounted on cash basis.
- 2.2. Income from Investments are accounted on accrual basis.

3. FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- 3.1. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition, installation and commissioning.
- 3.2. Gifted/Donated assets are valued at the declared value where available; if not available, the value is estimated based on the present market value adjusted with reference to the physical condition of the asset. They are set up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the Institution. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets.
- 3.3. Books received as gifts, are valued at selling prices printed on the books. Where they are not printed, the value is based on assessment.
- 3.4. Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Straight line method, at the following rates:

- 3.5 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.
- 3.6 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Re.I in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.
- 3.7 Assets created out of Earmarked Funds and funds of Sponsored Projects, where the ownership of such assets vests in the University, are setup by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the University. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets. Assets created out of Sponsored Project funds, where the ownership is retained by the sponsors but held and used by the University are separately disclosed in the Notes on Accounts.
- 3.8 Leasehold Land is amortized over period of lease.
- 4. Intangible Assets: Patents and copy rights, E Journals and Computer Software are grouped under Intangible Assets.

5. STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of office and computer stationary stock is accounted as revenue expenditure. However, being a pioneer/nodal institution for the propagation and development of Sanskrit stock of University publication/books are treated as fixed assets. (refer Schedule-4)

6. RETIRMENT BENEFITS

- 6.1 Retirement benefits are treated as per GOI Rules. Its includes Pension, Gratuity, Leave & Cashment and Provident Fund.
- 6.2 A fixed medical alloance of Rs.1000/- p.m. is being paid by Govt. of India OM dated 19.07.2017.
- 6.3 For Provident Fund of employees of University a separate set of accounts Receipt & Payment, Income & Expenditure and Balance Sheet are prepared and is attached with these accounts.
- 6.4 For pension also an earmarked fund has been created in which Govt. Grant and expenditure is accounted in Schedule-2.

6.5 270 employees are covered under New Pension Scheme.

7. INVESTMENTS

Investment is in the form of Fixed Deposit in the bank. There is no diminution in its value.

8. Earmarked / Endowment Funds

- 8.1 University is having one earmarked fund for Pension and five endowment funds in the name of Jindal Trust, Dubey Award, Somaiya Trust, Shukla Trust and RK Sharma. All these dedicated funds have been depicted in Schedule-2
- 8.2 Expenditure on the special funds is deducted from these funds only and not taken to the Income & Expenditure account.

9. Government and UGC Grants

9.1 University is functioning on the basis of grant received from Ministry of Education which is being accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to the financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as 9.2 Grant utilized for fixed assets has been shown as Capital expenditure and remaining as revenue. (refer Schedule-10) 9.3 Unutilized grants as carried forward as unspent (refer Schedule-10) and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet. (refer Schedule-3)

10. INVESTMENT OF EARMARKED I FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCURED ON SUCH INVESTMENT:

- 10.1 These earmarked funds are invested in fixed deposit in Banks.
- 10.2 Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the University. (refer Schedule-2)

11. SPONSORED PROJECTS

University is having one project of UGC - SRF/JRF (Senior/Junior Research Fellow) funded by UGC.

12. INCOME TAX

12.1 University is a Central Sanskrit University and fully finance through Govt. grant. The income of the University is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts. No TDS is deducted by the bank on investment in Terms Deposits.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi for the year ended 31 March 2021

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Central Sanskrit University (CSU), New Delhi as at 31 March 2021, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act read with section 32 (1) of the Central Sanskrit Universities Act, 2020. The financial statements include the accounts of 12 Campuses of the CSU and Headquarter. Out of these, accounts of three campuses and Headquarter was audited and considered for the report. These financial statements are the responsibility of the CSU Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format, prescribed by the Ministry of Education, Government of India vide order No. 29-4/2012-FD dated 17 April 2015.
- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Central Sanskrit University, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv) We, further report that:
- A. Balance Sheet
- A.1 Assets
- A.1.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 4)-Rs. 377.16 crore

Capital Work in Progress: Rs.301.81 crore

The above includes work–in-progress of Rs. 12.01 crore in respect of Puri Campus. As per the utilization-cum-expenditure certificate as on 31.03.2021 furnished by CPWD against deposit of Rs. 12.01 crore

for execution of different capital works, Rs.10.33 crore has been utilized by CPWD leaving a balance of Rs.1.67 crore. The utilised amount included expenditure towards "Siksha Soudha" Building which had been constructed with an expenditure of Rs. 9.30 crore (up to 31.03.2021) and put to use since July 2019 and furniture worth Rs.50 lakh procured and used in different class rooms/Faculty Chambers etc. since 14.10.2020.

This has resulted in overstatement of Capital Work in Progress by Rs. 11.48 crore and understatement of Tangible Assets by Rs. 9.80 crore under Fixed Assets and also understatement of Loans, Advances and Deposits by Rs.1.68 crore.

B. Grants-in-aid

The Central Sanskrit University received Grants-in-aid of Rs.192.85 crore (Non NER: Rs. 190.18 crore and NER: Rs. 2.67 crore) during the year 2020-2021 and had an opening balance of Grants-in-aid of Rs. 5.05 crore (Non NER: 1.13 crore and NER: Rs. 3.92 crore). Out of total grant-in-aid of Rs.197.90 crore (Non-NER: Rs. 191.31 crore and NER: Rs. 6.59 crore), it utilized Rs. 194.17 crore (Non NER: Rs. 188.21 crore and NER: Rs. 5.96 crore) leaving unutilized grant-in-aid of Rs. 3.73 crore (Non-NER: Rs. 3.11 crore and NER: Rs. 0.62 crore) as on 31 March 2021.

C. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Vice-Chancellor, Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- a. in so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi as at 31 March 2021; and
- b. and in so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

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Annexure to audit report

1. Adequacy of Internal audit system

There is no separate internal audit wing and the post of Accounts Officer (Internal Audit) is vacant. However Internal Audit is being conducted by the officers/employees of the Finance Department of the CSU Headquarters, Campuses and retired Senior Audit Staff. The Internal Audit examination for 2018-19 has been completed by various audit teams. Internal audit of 2019-21 has not been conducted. There is no internal audit manual

2. Adequacy of Internal Control System

The internal control system of CSU Hqrs. needs to be strengthened as:

- The post of Accounts Officer is vacant since February 2015.
- The physical verification of Fixed Assets, books and inventories of CSU Headquarters has not been conducted during the year.

3. System of physical verification of assets

- The physical verification of Fixed Assets of CSU Hqrs has been conducted upto 2019-20.
- Physical verification of Library books of CSU Hqrs has been done upto2019-20. Also missing books of 1781 Nos. worth Rs.1.79 lakh has not been written off till date.
- Physical verification of Fixed Assets of Devprayag and Bhopal Campus has been done for the year 2020-21 whereas the Physical Verification of Puri campus has not been done (test checked units).

4. System of physical verification of inventory

- The physical verification of inventories of CSU Hqrs such as stationery and consumables hasbeen done upto 2019-20.
- Physical verification of Bhopal Campus has been done for the year 2020-21 whereas the Physical Verification of Devprayag and Puri campus has not been done for the year 2020-21 (test checked units).

5. Regularity in payment of statutorydues

Statutory dues of Rs.1.14 lakh pertaining to GIS was pending in respect of Bhopal Campusas on 31.03.2021.
