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1. AN OVERVIEW

1.1. The Institution

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (hereinafter designated as Sansthan) was established on 15th October, 1970 as an autonomous organisation registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Act XXI of 1860). It is an autonomous organisation created for the overall development and promotion of Sanskrit in the country. It is being fully funded by the Government of India since its inception. It functions as the apex body for the propagation and development of Sanskrit and assists the Ministry of Human Resource Development in formulating and implementing various plans and schemes for the development of Sanskrit studies. It has assumed the role of a nodal agency for the effective implementation of various recommendations made by the Sanskrit Commission set up by the Government of India, Ministry of Education in 1956 concerning the preservation, propagation and development of Sanskrit language and education in all its aspects.

Considering Sansthan's contribution in the field of promotion and propagation of traditional Sanskrit education including teaching, training and research activities in Sanskrit, the Government of India accorded it the status of **Deemed University** w.e.f. 7th May, 2002 vide Notification No. F.9-28/2000-U.3 followed by U.G.C.'s Notification No.F.6-31/2001(CPP-I) dated 13th June, 2002. On 5th July, 2012 **National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC)**, Bangalore awarded Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), New Delhi **with 'A' grade**.

Under the scheme of review of Deemed Universities, the UGC Review Committee inspected all the campuses of the Sansthan including its Head Quarter at Delhi. The committee has praised the academic standard maintained by the Sansthan and has further recommended the status of Deemed University to it.

1.2 Role and functions

The major objectives of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and in pursuance thereof—

1. To Provide for higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels fully conforming to the concept of university, namely University Education Report (1948) and the Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).
2. To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management, etc. routinely offered by conventional institutions.
3. To provide for high quality teaching and research and for the advancement of knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken in-house by substantial number of full time faculty/research scholars (Ph.Ds and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines.
4. To enable creation of Sansthan under the 'de novo' category devoted to unique in emerging areas of knowledge, not being pursued by conventional or existing institutions - particularly in specific areas of study and research preferably sponsored by the Government of a State/ UT or the Central Government regarded

- as important for strategic needs of the country or for the preservation of our cultural heritage, so determined by a well laid-out process of wide consultation with the eminent peers of academic community.
5. To undertake, aid, promote, coordinate research in all branches of Sanskrit learning including teachers' training and manuscriptology, to bring out linkage with the outcome of modern research in the contextually relevant fields and to bring out publications.
 6. To act as nodal agency for the Government of India to implement its policies and programmes for the development of Sanskrit.
 7. To provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as it may deem fit.
 8. To provide for research and for the advancement of/and dissemination of knowledge.
 9. To undertake extra mural studies, extension programmes and field outreach activities to contribute to the development of society.
 10. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the objectives of the Sansthan.

1.3 Programmes and Activities

Realising its objectives, the Sansthan has undertaken the following major programmes and activities:-

- Establishment of Campuses in different States of India.
- Conducting teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary/ Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Research at Doctorate levels.
- Conducting teachers' training at graduate level i.e. Shiksha Shastri (B. Ed.) and Post graduate level i.e. Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.).
- Conducting and Coordinating research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit.
- Cooperating with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.
- Establishment of Sanskrit libraries, manuscripts' collection centres and also editing and publishing rare manuscripts and books of importance.
- Conferment of degrees and granting of diplomas/certificates to persons having satisfactorily completed the approved prescribed courses of study/research and passed prescribed examinations.
- Instituting and awarding visitorship, fellowship, scholarships, stipends, prizes and medals.
- Conducting distance education programmes.
- Implementation of schemes of the Ministry of Human Resource Development for the promotion of Sanskrit.

1.4 Teaching

Teaching is conducted from Prak Shastri to Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the Sansthan in its 13 Campuses. The affiliated institutions carry out teaching from Prathama to Acharya.

Sanskrit institutions managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the Sansthan also impart teaching with the same syllabus.

1.5 Teachers' Training

In the Campuses, teachers' training course of one academic year with emphasis on teaching practice, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha Shastri Degree which is equivalent to B.Ed.. In addition, Shiksha Acharya Degree course equivalent to M.Ed. is conducted in Puri, Jaipur, Jammu and Bhopal Campuses.

1.6 Research

In all the Campuses of the Sansthan, students are enrolled for carrying out research leading to the award of degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D..

However, Ganga Nath Jha Campus, Allahabad is exclusively dedicated to research activities in selected branches of Sanskrit. The Library of the Campus is one of the richest Sanskrit Libraries in the country. A collection of over **57,957** rare manuscripts are also preserved in the library.

1.7 Publications

Research Journals and Books

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has been publishing two research journals containing research based articles, namely '*Sanskrit Vimarsha*' and 'Journal of the Ganganath Jha

Campus, Allahabad'. While the first journal is brought out by the Sansthan's Headquarters office, the other is published by Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad. In addition, the Campuses also publish annual literary magazines. The campuses at Bhopal and Jaipur have also upgraded the annual magazines published by them as research journals.

The Sansthan as well as the Campuses have brought out scholarly works, rare manuscripts and original texts. The Sansthan has published 588 books so far.

Sanskrit Varta - a quarterly news bulletin in Sanskrit is also published regularly.

2. AUTHORITIES & STRUCTURE

2.1 Minister of Human Resource Development, Government of India is the Chancellor of the Sansthan. During the reporting year, **Shrimati, Smriti Zubin Irani, Minister of Human Resource Development, Government of India** held the position of the Chancellor of the Sansthan. The Vice-Chancellor is the principal academic & executive officer. He is the president of all statutory bodies of the Sansthan. He exercises general supervision and control over the affairs of the Sansthan, executes policies and programmes and implements the decisions of all its authorities. During the year 2015-16, the following persons held the post of Vice-Chancellor/Vice-Chancellor incharge (1) Dr. Sukhbir Singh Sandhu (I/c V.C.) Joint Secretary (CU&L) 01.04.2015 to 28.04.2015. (2) Prof. Parmeshwar Narayan Shastry (I/c V.C.) 29.04.2015 to 14.06.2015 and Vice Chancellor 15.06.2015 to 31.03.2016 & continuing. The following are the authorities of the Sansthan:

1. Board of Management - It is the principal organ of the management in the Sansthan. It is empowered to take policy decisions and to ensure implementation of the decisions.

2. Academic Council - It is the principal academic body responsible for the maintenance of standards of education, teaching, training, examinations and research programme.

3. Finance Committee - It is the apex finance body responsible for placing annual accounts and financial estimates before the Board of Management, fixing limits of total expenditure and recommending creation of all types of posts.

4. Planning and Monitoring Board- It is the principal planning body responsible for monitoring of development programmes.

Apart from the above the Sansthan has also other constituted bodies for making recommendations with regard to their respective nature of functions namely Grant in Aid Committee, Publication Committee, Scholarship Selection Committee, Research Board and Examination Board.





4.1 ACTIVITIES AT HEAD QUARTER

4.1 ACTIVITIES AT HEAD QUARTER

4.1.1 ADMINISTRATION

The administration services of the Sansthan are executed through the following wings which are headed by the officers in-charge who assist in the subject matters linked with their units :

- (a) General Administration/Establishment
- (b) Personnel Administration
- (c) Campus Administration

In addition to the above main activities, this branch also deals with services and supplies, acquisition of land & building, establishment of new campuses and conducting meetings of Board of Management and Finance Committee. Various construction proposals for the buildings at different Campuses alongwith the estimated expenditure were sanctioned during the period under report which are campus wise

summarised as under :

These funds were utilised during the year on pay and allowances, scholarships, President's award to eminent Sanskrit scholars and various schemes under development of Sanskrit Education and other maintenance items of expenditure.

Accounts

The wing is responsible for the consolidation of accounts received from various units of the Sansthan and submission to DGACR for audit. The consolidated annual account for the year 2015-2016 submitted to DGACR for Audit are placed at **Annexure-'M'**.

Maintenance of Provident Fund Accounts

The section maintains pay and provident fund accounts for officers and members of the staff of the Headquarters' Office. Every member has been supplied with the annual provident fund account statement immediately after the close of the financial year.

Settlement of Audit Objections

Concerted efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual campuses were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were settled during the year.

4.1.3 ACADEMIC SECTION

The important responsibilities of this section are :

- To organize the Academic activities of the Sansthan and frame syllabi for various courses.
- To constitute subject committees to frame syllabi of different subjects from Prathama to Acharya.
- To coordinate convening of Academic Council Meeting and Meeting of Board of Studies and take follow up action.
- This Section is also responsible for laying down standards for Academic performance and preparation of calendar of Academic programme.
- During the year, the Academic Council of Sansthan was constituted on 21-07-2015 (copy at Annexure 'A') which met once in the month of September 2015. In addition to this, the syllabi of Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) and Shiksha-Acharya (M.Ed.) were also revised in pursuance of the instruction of NCTE for converting

these courses to two year courses with semester system of examination for these courses in the meetings of the Committee, constituted for the purpose on 25th and 26th Nov. 2015. A Meeting of the Sub-Committee of Academic Council was also held on 16th Feb., 2016.

- The Academic Section has also been entrusted the responsibility of grant of affiliation to Sanskrit institutions. The Sansthan had started with a few Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha but later some private institutions were also affiliated. These private institutions are affiliated only for the general courses from Prathama to Acharya and Vidyavaridhi. The number of affiliated institution has gone up considerably over the last few years. The status of Affiliated Institutions for the previous year was retained *status quo* on the recommendations of the Sub-Committee of Academic Council and Board of Management.

4.1.4 RESEARCH and PUBLICATION SECTION

This department is entrusted with the responsibilities of :

- A. Co-ordinating Research activities of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.
- B. Looking after the publication work of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

The department has the responsibility of organizing the meetings of Central Research Board and Publication Committee to carryout the above tasks.

Sansthan's Central Research Board met on 19-08-2015. Registration of 167 research students was approved in different Campuses for Vidyavaridhi research degree course. 04 JRF have been registered in Vidyavaridhi at Headquarter.

The Sansthan through its Publication Committee meetings held on 08.06.2015 approved various important titles for publication.

sale.



4.1.8 SCHEME SECTION

The section is responsible for implementing following schemes transferred from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India for the promotion and propagation of Sanskrit language and literature:



I. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching

a) Towards salary of Sanskrit Teachers for Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Schools/Mahavidyalayas

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance in the shape of salary to Sanskrit teachers, scholarship to students, Library grants. An amount of Rs. 1213.80/- lakh approximately was incurred under this scheme by the Sansthan. During the year, financial assistance was provided to 161 institutions.

b) Towards Salary of Teacher for Modern subjects in Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Mahavidyalas

Under this scheme of development of Sanskrit, the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is providing financial assistance to teachers for modern subjects remuneration of Rs. 6000/- per subject. As per the scheme, the financial assistance is restricted to three teachers in modern subjects in each institution. An amount of Rs. 191.77 lakh was incurred under this scheme by the Sansthan in the year 2015-2016. The financial assistance was provided to 71 Institutions.

c) Towards Salary of Sanskrit Teachers for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools belonging to State Govt.

Under the Scheme of development of Sanskrit, the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is providing financial assistance to Sanskrit teachers of Government Schools in different states. This assistance is extended towards salary of one Sanskrit teacher. During the year 2015-16, a total of 06 Government Schools were the beneficiaries and an amount of Rs. 4.32 lakh was utilised under this scheme.

II. Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.

Under the scheme the financial assistance is provided in the form of Samman Rashi by Sansthan to the eminent scholars above the age of 55 who have dedicated their lives to Sanskrit but have no settled source of income. The recommended scholar will be given Rs. 24,000/

- per annum, without deduction of income from other sources. For this purpose of Pandits having income of less than Rs. 24000/- per annum only would be considered.

III Financial Assistance to NGOs/ Deemed Sanskrit Universities/ Universities for various Research Projects and Programmes/ Activities for promotion of Sanskrit

&

VII Financial Assistance to Universities/ Deemed Universities/CBSE/NCERT/ SCERT etc. to improve standards of Sanskrit teaching.

Under these schemes, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan meets cent percent approved expenditure on different projects and programmes for the development and propagation of Sanskrit undertaken by NGO's/ Deemed Sanskrit Universities/Universities/ Institutions. During the year 2015-2016 the Sansthan incurred an expenditure of Rs. 38.45 lakh for various projects.

IV Financial Assistance for Publication, Re-print and Bulk Purchase

During the year 2015-16, meeting of the Grants-in-Aid Committee of the Sansthan was convened on 24.08.2015 in which several important proposals were approved under publication schemes. A total amount of Rs. 16.38/- lakh was released for the these schemes to meet out the expenses for their execution.

Under the scheme of Production of Sanskrit Literature, 07 books were published by different authors with financial assistance of the Sansthan and 12 other proposals were sanctioned for publication grant. **(Annexures at 'J' and 'K')** In addition to it, 28 Sanskrit Journals/News Papers were also granted annual publication grant.

V Shastra Chudamani Scheme

Under this Scheme, the services of retired eminent Sanskrit scholars are utilised in campuses, Adarsh Sanskrit Pathshalas and other State Government run Sanskrit Colleges/ Universities and voluntary organisations. The object of the Scheme is to preserve the indepth studies of different Shastras at the various centres where Sanskrit education is imparted to the Sanskrit students of traditional system. As per the scheme, the traditional scholars are appointed in different organisations. The scholars are being paid Rs.6000/- p.m. for a period of two years. The appointment so made can be extended for another one year on the recommendation of the Grants in Aid Committee. In addition to the existing appointed scholars, 22 more Shastra Chudamani Scholars were selected during 2015-2016. A sum of Rs. 52.76/- was utilised under the scheme.

VI Vocational Training Scheme

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance to organise the workshop and to conduct Prayogik Prashikshan in vocational disciplines like Jyotisha, Karmakanda, Paleography, Cataloguing, Manuscriptology, Sanskrit Shorthand and Typing etc.. An amount of Rs. 1.73 lakh was utilised under this scheme during 2015-2016.

VIII Award of Scholarships

This scheme is carried out by the scholarship section. Details regarding this are shown in 4.1.9. (2&3)

IX All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest

We organize different Shastric Competitions under the programme named Akhila Bharateeya Shastriya Spardha. The details of this programme during 2015-16 are given in 4.1.10 of this Annual Report.

4.1.9 SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan disburses scholarships of three types -

(1) Internal scholarships for traditional Sanskrit students studying in its own campuses.

(2) Merit scholarship at all India level for students studying Sanskrit from class 9th to PhD in modern stream.

(3) Merit Scholarship at all India level for Sanskrit students studying from Poorva Madhyama to Vidyavaridhi or equivalent degrees in traditional Sanskrit institutes.

Among the above mentioned 1,2,3, the type 1 scholarship (i.e. internal scholarship for the campus students) are directly distributed to the eligible students by the Campuses. Type 2 and

3 scholarships are distributed under the 'Scheme for the Development of Sanskrit Education' of Govt. of India. The disbursement of scholarships under this scheme is looked after by the scholarship section of H.Q. of Sansthan.

Internal (type 1) Scholarships

The rates of internal scholarships for students of Prak Shastri, Shastri, Shiksha Shastri and Acharya courses are Rs. 600/- Rs. 800/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 1000/- per month respectively. Scholars pursuing research for the award of Vidyavaridhi degree are granted monthly scholarship amount of Rs. 8000/- in addition to annual contingency grant of Rs. 3000/- for two years.

As per the sanctioned budget earmarked to states, a cut off list of merit of maximum to maximum percentage of student is prepared. According to our record, 81630 applications were received in the Sansthan from the Traditional and Modern institutions for award of Scholarship for the year 2015-16 under the Scholarship Scheme. After prepared the merit of the applications, 9970 applicants were selected for award of scholarship-2015-16 in modern & traditional streams from class 9th to Ph.D. programme in different places of India of various University/Colleges/Schools. Cash prizes of 10,000/-, 7,000/- and 5,000/- along with Gold Medal, Silver Medal and Bronze Medal were awarded to those who achieved I, II and III positions respectively in the competitions. Apart from this, 2,000/- and 1,500/- were given as a special prize to those

who got distinction with 80% and above and First division with 65% and above respectively in each Shalaka Pareeksha. The team of Karnataka got over all championship.

The brilliant presentations by the participants were well appreciated by scholars, judges, dignitaries and other audience.

4.1.11 ADARSHA SANSKRIT MAHAVIDYALAYA/SHODH SANSTHAN

Name of the Scheme

The Scheme for Financial Assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans.

Introduction

The Scheme for financial assistance to institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas / Adarsh Shodha Sansthans was started by the Government of India for supporting traditional institutions of Sanskrit learning. It was reviewed from time to time. The last review by Ministry of Human Resource Development was made in 1993 and the same became operative vide letter no. F. 30-19/88-skt-I dated 7th July, 1993. Later the Scheme was transferred to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan for implementation Vide letter no. F.8-3/94-skt-I dated 17.7.1995 of the Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. This scheme has been further revised by Government of India, vide letter no. F.N. 31-4/2009-Skt.I dated 29th June, 2012.

Consequent upon the changes that have come about in the field of higher education, particularly Sanskrit education, implementation of 6th Pay Commission, Pay Grade and subsequent issuance of Regulations by the University Grants Commission for maintenance of standards in higher education, it has become

imperative to reformulate the scheme in order to enable the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research in a more effective way.

Under this scheme, 25 Institutions are being run at various parts of the country with the financial assistance of Govt. of India through the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan and major portion of the finance for this scheme is being released by the Sansthan. There are 21 ASM & 04 ASS (01 ASM has been recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya for financial assistance in the March, 2015). Such institutions are provided 95% of the grant on recurring and 75% of grant on non-recurring items of expenditure.

Objectives

The objective of the Scheme is to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research. For this purpose, assistance is extended under this scheme to Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas for conducting courses at the level of Shastri and Acharya and to Shodha Sansthans (Research Institution) for organizing and conducting research - both at doctoral and post doctoral levels and bringing out research based publications and research journals.

4.1.12 PROJECTS

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has undertaken several valuable projects since 2003. The list of projects undertaken/being undertaken is given below for information even though there is no specific progress in these during the reporting year.

1. Bhasha Mandakini (T.V. Telecast) -

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan telecasts Sanskrit programmes through Gyan Darshan Channel of IGNOU daily and thrice in a week through D.D. Bharati and D.D. India since September, 2003. since then 730 episodes of 30 minutes were telecast by IGNOU.

2. National E-data Bank of Sanskrit Literature :- (E-text)

The project aims at developing e-learning in Sanskrit and making e-Sanskrit corpus available to public through electronic texts and internet. Targets for the first phase of the project have been decided and the ground work has been prepared. One hundred texts have been taken

up for preparing data-base to start the ground work for this tremendous task. Teachers in different campuses of the Sansthan have been assigned the texts as per their specializations and area of study. Data entry operators have been engaged for feeding the texts and preparing files on the computer.

104 books have been uploaded in the internet.

3. Sanskrit Teaching through Audio/ Video (Multimedia Project)

In this project DVD albums have been prepared संस्कृत भाषा शिक्षणम्, वैदिक गणित, संक्षेप-रामायणम्, नाट्यविंशतिका, कथादशकम्, प्रथमादीक्षा वी. सी.डी. तदेव गगनं सैव धरा, कविभास्करी. अभिज्ञान-शाकन्तलम. शब्दकल्पद्रुम एवं भासनाटकम् available for sale.

4. MP3 Audio -

'Tattvachintamani' prepared by Prof. K.E. Devanathan, Tirupati and 'राणायणीय' सामगानम् prepared by Shri Vedamurti Prabhakar Shastri

and Pundlik Krishna Bhagvat is available for sale.

5. E-Granthalaya –

3,05,567 books have been entered for networking the libraries of all campuses of Sansthan with E-granthalaya software.

6. Manas Software –

Manas software for preparing data bank of Sanskrit Manuscripts has been assigned in the Allahabad Campus.

7. Who is Who –

The Sansthan prepared data bank of Sanskrit Scholars in a book form as well as soft form. The book form 'Inventory of Sanskrit Scholars' (संस्कृतविद्वत्परिचयिका) already published on the occasion of 15th World Sanskrit Conference, 2012 and uploaded on website.

8. Dictionary of Sanskrit –

Inter-lingual studies can provide a plausible way for promotion and preservation of languages. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has taken up a project on 'Dictionary of Sanskrit and other Indian languages including Dialects and Sub-dialects.' This project has been taken up with financial assistance under the schemes of MHRD in 2009.

This project will also contribute to the preservation and protection of traditional knowledge and linguistic skills through the study of common terminology in diverse Indian languages, dialects and sub-dialects. Details of Dictionary projects read as under:-

i. Work on 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary and 'Malvi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' is carried out in Bhopal campus, Bhopal. In '**Budeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary**', collection work of 14000 words of Bundeli is completed and Bundeli to Sanskrit word-meanings of vowels, Kavarga, Cha, Chha, Ja, is completed. Remaining work of word-collection has been complete in '**Malavi-Sanskrit-Dictionary**' collection work of 15,000 words of Malavi is completed and typed. Also, Malavi to Sanskrit word-meaning of vowels, Kavarga, Chavarga is completed. Remaining work of word-collection will complete by October, 2013.

ii. '**Dialect-Sub-Dialects of North and North East India**' project is carried out in Sanskrit Sahitya Parishad, Kolkata, in which total 11,487 words of oriya and Banlga languages were collected.

iii. Work of '**Sanskrit-Persian-Urdu-Hindi Dictionary**' is carried out in Sansthan headquarter. Under this project first volume based on vowels got published and in Consonants work from 'Ka' to 'Dha' is completed. Remaining work is in process.

9. Sankhayoga or Patanjalayoga Darshan-

In this project, the new edition of Patanjalayog Darshan is being prepared which is enriched and embellished with its terminologies and twelve antique commentaries. In the conservation of oriental Sanskrit texts, this project will contribute immensely. Two S.R.F. are working at Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi in this project.

The first phase of the project has been completed. In this phase, eleven commentaries of fifty one sutras of first chapter and common terminology available therein is arranged. In Appendix, the पाठभेद and of yogasutras are arranged alphabetically in first volume which is handed over to Research and Publication. The work on seven commentaries of Patanjala Yogasutra and four commentaries of Samkhyappravachan Bhasya is still carried on.

10. Special Drive for Collection and Digitization of Manuscripts -

All the Campuses of the Sansthan have independent libraries. This apart, the Campuses at Allahabad, Puri, Guruvayur and Lucknow have manuscript's libraries also. The Guruvayoor campus has undertaken a special drive for the collection of manuscripts from the year 2008-09 onward. The Sansthan has also taken the initiative for the digitization of all the manuscripts available in various libraries of its campuses. The digitization work will be conducted through NIC.

As per information received from National Manuscripts Mission, digitization of 40,000

manuscripts out of 52,000 manuscripts has been completed in Allahabad Campus.

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has undertaken several valuable projects since 2003. The list of projects undertaken/being undertaken is given below for information even though there is no specific progress in these during the reporting year.

Minor/Major Research Projects in Sansthan Campus

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan strives to promote teaching and research in emerging areas in Sanskrit Shastras, accordingly the campuses of Sansthan have been the centres of research in higher education in various disciplines. Hence Sansthan provide the support to its campuses/teachers for promoting research through projects. In this regard Sansthan will allot 1-2 major projects and 1-2 minor projects to each campus, annually.

MOOCs Project

Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) constitute one of the most innovative moments with in open learning and distance education . Through the MOOC constantly evolving and create new learning opportunities in higher education. However there exist no consolidated approaches regarding the Sanskrit educational material development at the course implementation process Sansthan is doing the work accordingly.

Rajabhasha

Ministry has implemented the programme regarding promotion and propagation of Hindi Rajabhasha in all Central Govt. offices. Accordingly Sansthan also doing sufficient official work in Hindi as well as organizing different kinds of programme. Every year we send trisemister report of work done in Hindi to the Hon'ble Minister apart from other activities.

Deccan College Sanskrit Dictionary Project

"An Encyclopedia Dictionary of Sanskrit on

Historical Principals" is being implemented by the Sansthan in department of Sanskrit and Lexicography, Deccan college, Pune with financial support from the Ministry of HRD through Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

The Prestigious dictionary project launched in the year 1948 and collection of reference material was completed in the year 1973. Nearly 1 crore and 10 lakhs reference cards containing one word in each card were completed upto 1973. There after the editorial work has started and till now 10 lakhs reference have been edited into 30 volumes and published 31st volume is ready for publication.

Shastratha Training Programme.

A Shastratha Training Programme organized by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was conducted from 02.03.2016 to 18.03.2016 at Eklavya Campus, Agartala, Tripura, NER. The aim of the training programme was to promote and popularized the Traditional Teaching system of Sanskrit Shashtras.

The training is focused on 6 various branches of Sanskrit i.e. Advaitavedanta, Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Mimansa, Nayaya and Sahitya, from each branch 10 students are selected by an All India Entrance test which is conducted on 10.02.2016 at various parts of India. In the Entrance Test near about 54 students work selected for Training and sixty well known Sanskrit Traditional Shastra Scholars came as Trainers. It is very effective and creative programme which has given very good results in Sanskrit field and students for protecting Shastras.

Bharatavani Project.

Bharatavani is a project with an objective of delivering knowledge in and about all the languages in India using multimedia (i.e., text, audio, video, images) formats through a portal (website). This portal would be all inclusive, interactive, dynamic and moderated. The idea is to make India an Open Knowledge Society, in the era of Digital India. Accordingly Sansthan has successfully uploaded 40 e-books on Bharatavani Portal.

Learners at these centres exhibited great enthusiasm. 4.2 ACTIVITIES AT CAMPUSES

4.2.1 Shri Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad (U.P.)

1. About the Campus (Brief History of the Campus)

Situated in the heart of the holiest city Prayag i.e. in the bank of Ganga, Yamuna and Saraswati. Ganganath Jha Research Institute was founded on 17th November 1943 in the auspicious occasion of second death anniversary of M. M. Dr. Sir Ganganatha Jha with a view to perpetuate his name and works by a number of great persons including Indologists and erudite scholars of eminence, his students, his well wishers and his family members like Mahamana Pt. Madan Mohan Malaviya, Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru, Dr. Bhagavan Das, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, Justice Shri Kamala Kant Verma, Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj, Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishvari Prasad and Dr. Baburam Saxena etc.

The proposal for the building was registered on 12.1.45 under the society Registration act 1860. A land of 1.5 Acres was acquired with the effort of M.M. Umesh Mishra near the Chandra Shekhar Azad Park, in Company Bagh and the foundation stone was laid on 3.2.1945 by the then Governor of U.P. Sir Maurish Hailet. He expressed his thoughtful emotional words on this occasion and said that being an International as well as National figure, M.M. Sir Ganganatha Jha did not belong to any state in particular. Seeing his love and inclination towards the city of Prayag it will be an appropriate step to start a Research Institute which will be dedicated to complete his remaining works.

Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru was the first Chairman (1943-49) of the Institute followed by Dr. Bhagavan Das (1949-59), Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, (1959-63), Justice Shri Kamala Kant Verma (1963-65) and Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj (1965-71). As Chairman of the Institute Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishvari Prasad, Dr. Baburam Saxena have contributed a lot for the upliftment of this Institute. From the

beginning itself M.M. Dr. Umesh Mishra (1967) was the honourable secretary of the Institute. With his overall observation and constant effort the Institute got a noteworthy progress and it could procure an important place in the field of Indology in the world level.

After his demise his worthy son Dr. Jayakant Mishra, Professor of the English Department of the Allahabad University, efficiently took over the charge of the said post of Secretary and could keep the fame intact. The Administration of the Institute was governed by the ten members of Governing body. Dr. Baburam Saxena, Dr. Ishvari Prasad, Dr. S.P. Chaturvedi and Pt. K.C.Chattopadhyaya were associated with this Governing body. Till that period, the first and foremost work of the Institute was to publish a Research Journal of International repute on Sanskrit and Indological subjects.

M.M. Dr. P.V. Kane, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, , Dr. F. W. Thamas (Oxford) and Prof. Fainklin Adgartan (New york), Maulavi Saeed Suleman Naqi (Azamgarh), Prof. Mohammad Safi were the honourable members of the Institute. Dr. Gopal Swarup Pathak, Dr. Dharendra Varma, Sir S. Varadachari Justice Raghuvardayal, S.C. Dev and Pt. Sitaram were the honourable life members of the Institute. With the grace of these scholars, the Institute carried on its glories constantly.

The Institute was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi (under the Ministry of HRD, Government of India) in 1971 and it was named as Ganganatha Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth. Again from 2002 onwards it has been renamed as Ganganath Jha Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, when Sansthan was recognised by UGC as a Deemed University. Now the campus is dedicated to undertake, aid, promote and co-ordinate original researches in all branches of Indology.

2. Location of the Campus

Ganganath Jha Campus is situated in Chandrasekhar Azad Park in the Company Bagh, near Indian press chaurah, behind the statue of the great martyr Chandrasekhar Azad. Just in front of the Campus in the east lies pannalal Road, in the north Jawaharlal Nehru Road (G.T. Road) and in the behind in i.e. west Allahabad Museum is situated in the Kamla Nehru Road. The Campus is placed in the distance of 3 k.m. form Civil Line Bus Station, 5 k.m. from Railway station and 20 k.m. form Bamrauli Air Port.

4.2.3 Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu (Jammu and Kashmir)

1.1 Introduction

Under the aegis of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), with its campuses all over India, is the largest, multi-campus university in the world. Prof. Parameshwar Narayan Shastry is the Vice Chancellor of the university at present. Situated at Jammu, the winter capital of the state of Jammu and Kashmir, Shri Ranbir Campus is one of the 11 campuses of Sansthan. The campus building has been constructed on a piece of land, measuring 84 kanals.

1.2 Objectives and Background

The history of the campus goes back to more than 173 years when Maharaja Ranbir Singh of Jammu and Kashmir established Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya at Jammu, with a view to preserve and propagate the traditional knowledge enshrined in the Sanskrit language and literature. This Mahavidyalaya was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Government of India, on April 1, 1971, and called Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. With the declaration of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as a multi-campus deemed university on May 2, 2002, this institution came to be called 'Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Shri Ranbir Campus. Dr. Anant Maral was the first principal of the institution, followed by Dr. Dayanand Bhargava, Dr. J. Ganguly, Dr. Jagannath Pathak, Dr. Raghav Prasad Chaudhary, Dr. Ram Kishore Shukla, Dr. Priyatama Chandra Shastri (In-charge), Prof. G. Ganganna, Prof. Vishwa Murti Shastri, Prof. Yash Pal Khajuria, Prof. M. Chandrasekhar and Prof. Parameshwar Narayan Shastry. Prof. Ramanuja Devanathan is the principal of the Campus at present.

1.4 studies and Research Activities

Shri Ranbir Campus provides education bases on a beautiful combination of traditional and modern systems of education. As per the direction of the Sansthan Headquarters, semester system has been implemented in the Campus. Class-wise teaching arrangements are, as follow:-

(i) Traditional Sanskrit Studies

Under the traditional Sanskrit Studies, the Campus has arrangements for teaching Prak-shastri I + II (Intermediate 10+2), Shastri I +II + III (B.A.) and Acharya I + II (M.A.). The subjects taught include – traditional Sanskrit subjects like Sanskrit Grammer (Vyakarana), Sanskrit Literature (Sahitya), Philosophy (Darshan), Astrology (Siddhanta and Phalit Jyotisha), and Vaidic Literature (Veda); and modern subjects like English, Hindi, Dogri, History, Political Science, Computer Science, Environmental Science and physical education.

(ii) Profession Education

Professional courses like B.Ed. (Shiksha Shastri) and M.Ed. (Shiksha Acharya) are taught in the Department of Education.

(iii) Research Activities

In order to conduct multi-dimension research activities in the relevant fields of Sanskrit learning, there are arrangements for Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) guidance. Till last year, 120 research scholars have been awarded Ph.D.

degrees. At present, 31 students are registered as research scholars in the campus.

1.5 Distance Education Centre (Muktaswadhyayakendram)

For the purpose of promotion and propagation of Sanskrit at the world level, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has started a distance education institution called Muktaswadhyayapeetham, which has been duly recognized by the Distance Education Council of India. All the campus of the Sansthan have a centre of the Muktaswadyayapeetham, called Mukhtaswadyayakendram.

The Mukhtaswadyayakendram at Shri Ranbir Campus started in 2010-11. There are 58 students registered with the Centre in the current session. The centre provides Intermediate (Prakshastri), B.A. (Shastri) and M.A. (Acharya) courses as per semester system. A special feature of the Mukhtaswadyayapeetham is that there is an arrangement for Bridge courses for non-Sanskrit students. Under these courses, the students are provided audio-visual material with other course material such as textbooks etc. so that non-Sanskrit knowing students also can learn Sanskrit easily in a short time.

In addition to Sanskrit Literature, grammar and Jyotisha subjects, the centre is also conducting a course in Sanskrit journalism. There are plans for introducing other classical subjects. Besides these, certificate courses in Dramatics (Natyashastra), Pali, Prakrut etc, would be introduced soon. For these initiatives, the Sanskrit Headquarters, the Muktaswadhyayapeetham and all the lovers of Sanskrit deserve to be congratulated. A numbers of members of local Intelligentsia, such as, Engineers, doctors, lawyers, teachers has joined the courses offered by the Kendram.

1.6 Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project

Kashmir Shaiva Darshan is a priceless legacy of the state of the Jammu and Kashmir. For the conservation and preservation of this priceless legacy, the Campus is exclusively running a Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project on its premises. Through the tireless efforts of Late Dr. Baljinnath

Pandita and the research assistants associated with the project, two volumes of Kashmir Shaiva Darshan have been published, which are available for sale. The copies of the volumes are being sent all over India and the world. The department also houses 125 rare manuscripts. The manuscripts are in Sharada and Devanagari scripts. The transliteration and translation work on these manuscripts has stopped due to retirement/ transfer of the concerned research assistants to the headquarters. A request for appointment of staff has been made and the requisite staff is expected to be deputed soon, after which the project work would be resumed.

1.7 Publications

The campus has published 23 books relating to the various branches of knowledge. There is a great demand in the country for the books relating to Kashmir Shaiva Darshan. Publication of house-magazine "Shri Vaishnavi" featuring research-oriented articles, poems etc. in Sanskrit, English, Hindi, Dogri is being published regularly since the inception of the institution. Last year, the magazine has been granted ISSN 755 2277 906X by National Institute of Science and Communication and Information Resources, New Delhi.

Besides this, Education Department has started publishing a shikshashastra journal entitled "Shikshaamritam" since the academic session 2011-12.

1. *SHARADAYANAM* – a research magazine containing a collection of the research papers read out in the National Seminar on the topic "*Kashmirshaivadarshana-sahityaparamaparayoh Samvardhane Kashmiranam Yogadanam*" held in 2014-15.
2. *Punati* -- a research magazine containing a collection of the research papers read out in the National Seminar on the topic "*Samasamayiksandarbhe Vedoditnaitika-avadharnah*" held in 2015-16.
3. *Shastrasaurabha* - a research magazine containing a collection of the research

papers read out in Shri Shankara Shastrartha Parishad held in 2015-16.

1.8 Library

The well-stocked library of the Campus enshrines about 45000 books on various subjects. As per the directions of the Sansthan Headquarters, additional books costing about Rs. 2 lakh have purchased this year.

1.9 E-library

To make available to the public at large the introductory knowledge of books in the campus library, data entry process is going on in the e-library of the campus.

1.10 Planetarium

To provide the theoretical and practical knowledge of Astrology to the students, a small planetarium has been established in the campus. A number of instruments and teaching aids, such as, miniature planetarium, telescopes, planet orbit model machine, phases of the moon model machine, solar and lunar eclipse model machine, Gol Yantra and informative picture posters have been kept here.

1.11 Conference Hall

A modern conference hall, with conference microphones and LED projector system, having a seating capacity of 62 persons has been established at the campus.

1.12 Vani Vilas Auditorium

For smooth conduct of scholarly lectures, and dance, dramas, lectures and other cultural activities by the students of the campus, a well-equipped auditorium with a seating capacity of 500 persons has been established at the campus.

1.13 Computer Room

A computer room also has been established at the Modern Subjects Department of the campus to provide computer instruction to the Prakshastri and Shastri students. The computer room features 15 computers, air conditioners,

excellent furniture, internet facility, and Wi Fi facility.

1.14 Departmental Computers

Computers with printers and internet facility have been provided at every department for the smooth functioning of the academic and research activities at the campus.

1.15 Departmental Libraries

In order to make books conveniently available to the teachers and students, and to inculcate in them an interest in books, Departmental libraries have been established at all the departments of the campus. Every department was granted a sum of Rs. 50000 for the purpose of purchasing books in the current session.

1.16 Language Lab

Language Lab was established in the Department of Education (Pedagogy). At a time, ten students and one instructor can engage in understanding the intricacies of language learning and pronunciation. For this purpose, ten student computers and one instructor's computer have been established at the lab.

1.17 Psychology Lab

New equipment has been installed in the Psychology lab of the campus which includes ultramodern electronic equipment as well.

1.18 Teaching and Non-teaching Staff

The Campus is staffed with 39 faculty members, comprising of Professor, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors, Contract Teachers, and Guest Teachers, and 23 ministerial staff, 4 guards and 4 CPWD staff.

1.19 Hostels

For the students coming from the far-flung areas of the state and other parts of the country, separate hostels for boys and girls have been established. The hostels are well-equipped with modern facilities. They have 84 rooms capable of accommodating 168 students. The hostels

also have 4 geysers. Both the hostels have separate messes also.

1.20 Staff Quarters

There are staff quarters at the campus, to cater to the residential needs of the Principal, hostel superintendent and wardens and teaching staff of the campus.

1.21 Gymnasium

Yoga and physical exercise are also provided to the students to ensure their physical and mental health and well-being. For this purpose, a gymnasium equipped with modern exercising machines and a ten-seater work station, has been established.

1.22 Play Ground

There is a vast play ground at the campus, where the students undertake various sporting and athletic activities.

2. LITERARY AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

2.1 Saraswati Parishad and Departmental Seminars

Since the inception of the institution in 1971, monthly Saraswati Parishad has regularly been organized at the campus with a view to personal and intellectual development of the students. Since 2006, all the department of the

campus, namely, Vyakarana, Sahitya, Darshan, Jyotisha, Education and Modern Subjects too have been organizing Departmental seminars in their own respective disciplines every third week of the month, wherein competitions in elocution, oral text recitation, oral sloka recitation, pronunciation etc. are conducted. At the end of the every month, Saraswati Parishads are organized jointly by all the Departmental Parishads in which competitions in all the subjects are held.

2.2 Shastra Exercises

After-class sessions are held for the inquisitive students having special interest in the Shastras. To make them capable of self-study, they are made to learn by heart the *Rudrashtadyayee* and other *Vaidic mantras* along with due rituals. A special Shastra Practice room has been allocated for the purpose.

2.3 Kaumudi Mahotsava / Vasantotsava (The Spring Festival)

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi, organized *Kaumudi Mahotsava*, at New Delhi from February 24-25, 2016, in which the Campus students presented the Sanskrit play "*Latakamelakam*". Campus students Purushottam Das, Sneha Pandey, and Arun Kumar Nayak got first, second and third prize, respectively. Director of the play, Dr. Devendra Pathak, got the Best Director Award.

2.4 Yuv Mahotsava (Youth Festival)

Every year, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan organizes *Yuv Mahotsava* (Youth Festival) at its Campuses on rotational basis. This year, the honour of hosting the *Yuv Festival* went to Shri Veda Vyasa Campus, Balahar, Garli, Himachal Pradesh. Students from all the 12 campuses of the Sansthan participated in the various competitions of the Festival which was held from October 30 to November 02, 2015. Harish Sharma, an Acharya student from Shri Rambir Campus bagged Bronze Medal in Shot Put. In the Cultural and Academic competitions, Purushottam Das bagged Gold Medal in Mono Acting, and Bronze Medal in Oral Recitation of *Subhashits*. Sneha Pandey got Bronze Medal in

accomplish the noble cause of promotion, propagation and preservation of Sanskrit in the state and coming generations is not deprived of the benefits of the legacy of our great and ancient civilization, because Sanskrit is the Hallmark of India and Indian-ness. The excellent elements of moral upliftment, character-building, and patriotism enshrined in the ancient Sanskrit works can lead to peaceful coexistence and a brotherhood of mankind.

4.2.4 Guruvayoor Campus, Purnattukara, Trichur (Kerala)

Introduction

The Guruvayoor Campus came into being on 16-07-1979 consequent upon the take over of the Guruvayoor Sahitya Deepika Sanskrit Vidyapeetha at Pavaratty near Guruvayoor, which was founded by Late Sri. P.T. Kuriakkose Master. (The erstwhile Vidyapeetha had attained name and fame in and outside the state of Kerala as a centre of Sanskrit Learning, imparting instructions at graduate and Post graduate level with affiliation to Madras University in 1934, Kerala University in 1958 and Calicut University in 1968). This abode of ancient traditional status got affiliation with Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan under Ministry of H.R.D. Govt. of India, with effect from January 1970 and it became constituent Vidyapeeth of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan and it was called Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. On 7th May 2002, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan along with its constituent Vidyapeethas was declared as a Deemed to be University and it was considered as Guruvayoor Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

The Guruvayoor Campus has two centers, one at Purnattukara and one at Pavaratty. The main centre at Purnattukara situates on a beautiful landscape within an extent of fourteen acres. It comprises of main Academic block, Administrative block, Library, Boys & Girls Hostels, Guest House, Auditorium, Play Ground, Semi functional building and quarters. The centre at Pavaratty situates on a land of extent of 50 cents and is named as P.T. Kuriakkose Smrithi Bhawan after Shri. P.T. Kuriakkose Master, the former of the erstwhile Vidyapeetha. There is a single storied building having two big halls, one administrative room and other ten class rooms with all modern amenities.

Campus Location

Main Centre of Guruvayoor Campus is situated in an educational complex area at Adat

Panchayath in Thrissur District, Kerala and surrounded by Amala Medical College, Sri.Ramakrishna Ashram, S.R.K.G.V.M. Higher Secondary School and Sarada Girls Higher Secondary School, Central School, IES Engineering College. From Thrissur Town, Guruvayoor Campus is 8 kilometers to North-West. The Kochi international airport at Nedumabassery is only sixty one kilometers away from the campus, along the AdatMuthuvara. Thrissur. Ernakulam National High Way–NH 47. Kuriakose Master Smrithi Bhawan at pavaratty is fifteen kilometer away from the main centre.

Courses Offered

At present the campus at Purnattukara offers the following courses of study:-

1. Prak Shastri (Intermediate).
2. Shastri (Graduation) in Vedanta, Sahitya, Vyakarana, Nyaya & Jyotisha.
3. Acharya (Post-Graduation) in Vedanta, Sahitya, Vyakarana, Nyaya & Jyotisha

The syllabus of Prak Shastri & Shastri includes modern subjects such as English, History, Malayalam, Computer Science, Special English, Yoga & Environmental Studies along with traditional Sanskrit subjects to prepare the students to be in tune with modern world.

P.T. Kuriakkose Smrithi Bhawan offers classes of three months duration under Non Formal Sanskrit Education, correspondence courses of Learning Sanskrit and Distance Education. This institution is also as a centre of Manuscript Collection.

4.2.7 Shri Rajiv Gandhi Campus, Sringeri (Karnataka)

About the Campus

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has established Rajiv Gandhi Kendrya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha as its constituent unit at Sringeri on 13th January 1992. The then Minister of HRD, Govt of India, Shri. Arjun Singh was the president of the Sansthan. The then President his Excellency Sri R. Venkataraman inaugurated the Campus on the auspicious day of 5th March 1992. The Campus has now been renamed as Rajiv Gandhi Campus by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. The Central Public Works Department has constructed the main building of the Campus at the cost of Rs. 1.63 crores. In the second phase the construction of hostels for boys and girls, quarters for minimum requirement of the staff has been done at the cost of Rs. 4.17 crores. Recently in the year 2014-15 an extension work of the main building construction and the play ground and hostel extension works were take-up with a cost of Rs. 8,05,08,000 and the truncated portion of the main building was inaugurated on 07 February 2016 by Prof. P. N. Shastri, Honorable Vice-Chancellor of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. We have well furnished Guest House in the Campus. The temporary auditorium was constructed to run the various cultural and educational activities in the campus.

The Campus has been established in 10.2 acre of land acquired from State Government which is in Chikmangalur dist of Karnataka State. The Campus is situated at 120 kms away from Mangalore, 380 kms from Bangalore, 90 kms from Udupi and 105 kms from Shimoga. It adjoins to the Shimoga-Bangalore train route.

Courses Offered

The Campus offers the subject Sahitya, Navyavyakarana, Advaita Vedanta, Meemamsa, Navya Nyaya and Phalitha Jyotisha at Acharya (M.A.) and Shastri (B.A.) levels. Shiksha-Shastri (B.Ed.) and Prak Shastri (Intermediate) course

are also offered here. The Campus offers the Research programme Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) also. Besides traditional Sanskrit Subjects, the modern subjects such as Hindi, English, History, Kannada and Computer science are also taught in Prak Shastri & Shastri.

About the Campus

The Bhopal Campus of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was established in the year 2002 at Madhya Pradesh's capital city Bhopal. The campus was formally inaugurated by the Hon. Governor of Madhya Pradesh, Bhai Mahavir, on 16th Sep. 2002. The Govt. of M.P. has donated 10 acres of land for the growth and development of this campus. On 19th Sept. 2005, the then Hon. Minister of HRD, Gov. of India, Shri Arjun Singh laid the foundation stone for the construction of the Academic, Administrative and Central Library Blocks and an Auditorium in the campus. The main building has been made ready and since May 2010 all academic activities and administrative functions are being carried out from this new building. At present, the separate hostels for girls and boys, a guest house and the residence for staff have been constructed.

Courses Offered

Three distinct departments of teaching training and research function under the curriculum of the Bhopal campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. The teaching department holds classes for Prakshastri (Higher Secondary), Shastri (B.A.) and Acharya (M.A.) where modern subjects like Hindi, English, Pol. Science, Environment Science and Computer Science are

taught alongwith the traditional Sanskrit disciplines of Sahitya (Literature), Vyakarana (Grammar), Jyotisha (Astrology) and Jain Darshan. The training department runs the curriculum for Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) and Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.) Students can pursue Vidya Varidhi (Ph.D.) under the research department which facilitates research in Sanskrit Literature, Grammar, Astrology, Sanskrit Education and its allied branches.

In addition to this, the campus has a Non-Formal Education Centre which offers 3 months' courses, Swadhyaya Kendra of Mukta Swadhyaya Peetham (Institute of Distance Education) of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

The Jyotish Department runs two other courses titled as the "Bharatiya Vastushastra Parichay Pathyakrama" and the "Bharatiya Vastushastra Parichay Pathyakarma".

Academic and Extra Curricular Activities :

- **Samvid Vikas Parisad** - In order to enhance the oratory skills of the students and to help them acquire expertise over the *Shastras*, oratory conclaves are regularly organized in campus. These conclaves offer an excellent opportunity to the students to freely discuss various topics in Sanskrit literature, grammar, astrology and education.
- **Shastra Mimansa Committee** - This committee aims at the enhancement of the professors' knowledge of classical glory with the help of *Shastras* discourses. Professors deliver lectures and discuss on pre-decided subjects on first Friday of every month. In the end of the session research papers are published in *Shastra Mimansa* magazine.
- **Classical Discourses** - Students are trained to closely analyze and review Classical Sanskrit texts in order to acquaint them with various important,

difficult and rare aspects of the *Shastras*. The training comprises of detailed discussions and debates on a specifically chosen area of a given Shastra through which students are expected to arrive at a rational conclusion through a series of arguments presented both in favour and against the topic.

- **Kanthpatha (Poetry Recitation) and Shalaka** - Regular practice sessions are held to train students in the recitation of various ancient religious and poetic texts in Sanskrit. This not only sharpens their memory but also enhances their mental ability and intellect. While *Kanthapatha* primarily evaluates a student's memory, *Shalaka* also examines his/her intellect and explanatory skills.
- **Inter State debate competition** - Bhopal Campus organizes an inter state debating contest based on eight chosen *Shastras* for traditional Sanskrit students of M.P. and Chhattisgarh. Various competitions like *Shastriya Shalaka* (recitation of Sanskrit verses) *Kavya Shalaka* (recitation of poetic texts in Sanskrit), *Kavyapatha* (recitation of Sanskrit verses) and *Shlokantakshiri* (recitation of the *Shlokas*) are held under this event. The winners of these competitions are then chosen to participate in other debate competitions held at national and international levels.
- **All India debate competition** - The winners of the above mentioned inter state debate competition are given special training in Shastriya Shalaka (recitation of classical Sanskrit texts), Kavya Shalaka (recitation of the Shlokas) at the Bhopal campus. They are hence prepared to participate in various events of the All India debate Competition organized by the headquarter of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.
- **Sport and Yoga** - All students of the campus are given regular training in various physical exercises, sports and Yoga which not only contributes to their physical and spiritual development but

also leads them towards an all round development of their personality. The best performers in sports, physical exercise and Yoga are awarded at the annual Day Function every year. They are further selected to participate in different sports events of All India Youth Festival.

- **All India Youth Festival** - The headquarter of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan organizes an All India youth Festival every year. The aim of the festival is to train and encourage talented students across campuses in various extra curricular activities like painting sports, Yoga, dramatics, dance and music etc.
- **Dramatics and other Arts** - Students are trained in the classical tradition of the Sanskrit drama in campus as well as in summer training workshops organized in collaboration with other institutes. Students thus trained, perform in the Kaumudimahotsava, all India Youth Festival and other national level drama competitions.

Other Academic activities -

- **Distance Education** - The Bhopal Campus acts as an active distant learning centre for students registered with the headquarter of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan to pursue distance education in Sanskrit. This centre sends out study materials to registered private candidates and also arranges classroom teaching sessions for them, if and when required. The campus thus enables students residing in their respective hometowns to pursue Prakshastri, Shastri and Acharya and attain respective degree/certificates on the successful completion of the course.
- **Natya Shastra Anusandhan Kendra** - Centre for Natya Shashtra in Research is established in year 2011-12 session. Promotion of Natya Shastra, research in Natya Shastra, developing Sanskrit Dramaturgy etc are main functions of the centre.

- **Non-formal Sanskrit teaching** - Sansthan has developed an innovative curriculum to promote self study of Sanskrit. The curriculum has been specially designed to enable students to study Sanskrit language, Sanskrit poetry and the *Shastras* on their own, without the help of any teacher. The entire syllabus has been divided into five academic sessions with each session being a six - months period. The required text books are available in campus at the fixed price.
- **Introduction to Indian Astrology and Bhartiya Vastushastra** - Three month long curriculum designed for people interested in the forecast prediction related branches of Indian astrology (*Phalit Jyotish*) and *Vastushastra* are run by the campus. Through these short term evening courses anyone, irrespective of age and profession, can acquire preliminary knowledge of general principles of forecasting in Indian Astrology. Information regarding to this course is published in local dailies periodically.
- **Sanskrit on Internet** - A project on uploading various classical Sanskrit texts on the internet is under the implementation work of the campus. The purpose of this project is to enable easy access to any classical Sanskrit text from anywhere in the world. In this project, books titled *Shahitya Darpan*, *Alankara-sarwaswam* and *Paribhashendu-shekhara* have already been uploaded on the net. A who's Who index of all Sanskrit Scholars is also being compiled for the internet use.
- **The Survey of Sanskrit Educational Research** - Collation and editing work of M.Ed., M.Phil, Ph.D. and D.Litt. Research abstracts of educational researches in Indian Sanskrit Universities from 1980 to 2012 has been taken under this project. Dr. Nilabh Tiwari is the Principal Investigator of this Major Research Project.
- **Lexicography** - The project on dialect

and sub dialect of Bundeli and Malvi in Sanskrit vocabulary has been finished. The Malwi-Sanskrit Dictionary (with Hindi meaning) and The Bundeli-Sanskrit Dictionary (with Hindi meaning) have been published under this project.

- **Conferences and Workshops** - National and state level workshops and conferences aimed at promoting research and encouraging academic interactions are regularly organized in the campus.
- **Training** - The campus organizes special training sessions for teachers of informal Sanskrit Teaching programs. The main purpose of these training programs is not only to enable the teachers to acquire expertise in Sanskrit language and the *Shastras* but also to enhance their teaching skills.
- **Book Selling Centre** - People can purchase Sanskrit text books and other significant books which are published and distributed by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi from Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Bhopal Campus at reasonable price.

Extra Curricular Activities including details of functions/seminars. (2014-15)

- **Yoga day Programmes :-** On the 21st June 2015, which is celebrated as the Inter National Yoga Day, the Yoga Day Programme had been organized in the Bhopal Campus. In this programme the patron of Hoshangabad Aarsh Gurukul Mahavidyalaya, Swami Rituspatiji was the chief guest who delivered the special lecture on the subject- "Patanjal Yog-Sutra". In this Programme the campus students, teachers and employees participated in the yoga practices. The chairman of this programme was Principal RSKS Bhopal Campus Prof Vidyanand Jha. 5.4 Organising of 'World Yoga Day' in KJ Somayya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Mumbai



5.18 13th Sanskrit Natyotsava





SCHEDULE 23 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and generally on the accrual method of accounting.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION

- 2.1. Fees from students (except Tution Fees), Sale of Admission forma, Royalty and Interest on Saving Bank account are accounted on cash basis.
- 2.2. Income from Investments are accounted on accrual basis.

3. FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- 3.1. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition, installation and commissioning.
- 3.2. Gifted/Donated assets are valued at the declared value where available; if not available, the value is estimated based on the present market value adjusted with reference to the physical condition of the asset. They are set up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the Institution. Depreciation is charged at the rate of depreciation applicable for that assets.
- 3.3. Books received as gifts, are valued at selling prices printed on the books. Where they are not printed, the value is based on assessment.
- 3.4. Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Straight line method, at the following rates:

- 3.5 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.
- 3.6 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Re.1 in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.
- 3.7 Assets created out of Earmarked Funds and funds of Sponsored Projects, where the ownership of such assets vests in the University, are setup by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the University. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets. Assets created out of Sponsored Project funds, where the ownership is retained by the sponsors but held and used by the University are separately disclosed in the Notes on Accounts.
- 3.8 Leasehold Land is amortized over period of lease.

4. INTANGIBLE ASSETS

Patents and copy rights, E Journals and Computer Software are grouped under intangible assets.

5. STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of office and computer stationary stock is accounted as revenue expenditure. However, being a pioneer/nodal institution for the propagation and development of Sanskrit stock of Sansthan publication/books are treated as fixed assets. (refer Schedule-4)

6. RETIRMENT BENEFITS

- 6.1 Retirement benefits are treated as per GOI Rules. Its includes Pension, Gratuity, Leave & Cashment and Provident Fund.
- 6.2 A fixed medical allowance of Rs.500/- p.m. is being paid as per Govt. of India OM dated 19.11.2014.
- 6.3 For Provident Fund of employees of Sansthan a separate set of accounts - Receipt & Payment, Income & Expenditure and Balance Sheet are prepared and is attached with these accounts.
- 6.4 For pension also an earmarked fund has been created in which Govt. Grant and expenditure is accounted in Schedule-2.
- 6.5 132 employees are covered under New Pension Scheme.

7. INVESTMENTS

Investment is in the form of Fixed Deposit in the bank. There is no diminution in its value.

8. EARMARKED / ENDOWMENT FUNDS

- 8.1 Sansthan is having one earmarked fund for Pension and five endowment funds in the name of Jindal Trust, Dubey Award, Somaiya Trust, Shukla Trust and RK Sharma. All these dedicated funds have been depicted in Schedule-2
- 8.2 Expenditure on the special funds is deducted from these funds only and not taken to the Income & Expenditure account.

9. GOVERNMENT AND UGS GRANTS

- 9.1 Sansthan is functioning on the basis of grant received from Ministry of HRD which is being accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to the financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as recoverable from government.
- 9.2 Grant utilized for fixed assets has been shown as Capital expenditure and remaining as revenue. (refer Schedule-10)
- 9.3 Unutilized grants is carried forward as unspent (refer Schedule-10) and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet. (refer Schedule-3)

10. INVESTMENT OF EARMARKED FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCURED ON SUCH INVESTMENT:

- 10.1 These earmarked funds are invested in fixed deposit in Banks.
- 10.2 Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the University.

11. SPONSORED PROJECTS

Sansthan is having one project of UGC - SRF/JRF (Senior/Junior Research Fellow) funded by UGC.

12. INCOME TAX

Sansthan is a Deemed University and fully financed through government grant. The income of the University is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts. No TDS is deducted by the bank on investment in Term Deposits.

9. As the Provident Fund Accounts and the New Pension Scheme Account are owned by the members of those funds and not by the University, these accounts were separated from the University's Accounts. **Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India
on the Accounts of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan
for the year ended 31 March 2016**

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as at 31 March, 2016, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act. The audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2017-18. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Sansthan's Management. The financial statements include the accounts of 11 Campus of the Sansthan and Headquarter. Out of these, accounts of four units were audited and comments suitably incorporated in the report. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. The Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

- i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India vide order No. 29-4/2012-FD dated 17 April 2015.
- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.

iv) We further report that:

A. Balance Sheet

A.1 Liabilities

A.1.1 Current Liabilities and Provisions (Schedule-3) - Rs. 37.20 crore

No provision has been made for retirement benefits on actuarial valuation which is in contravention of Accounting Standard 15 and Format of Accounts prescribed by Ministry of Human Resource Development.

B. General

B.1 An embezzlement of Rs. 13.51 lakh occurred in the Mumbai campus of RSS during the year 2008-09. Out of this, Rs. 1.42 lakh was deposited by the accused cashier. The Sansthan had, however, shown Rs. 6.28 lakh only under "Suspense Accounts" in the Balance Sheet (2015-16) while remaining amount of Rs. 5.81 lakh (including Rs. 4.27 lakh relating to GPF had not been shown in the accounts. Present status of the case was also not disclosed in the Notes on Accounts.

B.2 Mumbai campus of RSS has not prepared the Balance Sheet. The consolidation has been done at RSS Hqrs by Receipts & Payments Accounts of Mumbai Campus. Audit is not able to verify whether the assets and liabilities of Mumbai campus has been correctly incorporated in the accounts.

B.3 As per Schedule 7 of accounts the closing cash balances of Mukta Swadhyayapeetham Scheme is Rs. 9.43 lakh but the liability (unspent balance) under Schedule 3 and unspent balance in Schedule 10 has been shown as Rs. 3.63 lakh. This may be rectified. The correct liability of MSP may be disclosed in Schedule 3 and Schedule 10.

C. Grants-in-aid

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan had an opening balance of grant of Rs.60.34 crore (Plan: Rs. 36.63 crore and Non Plan: Rs. 23.71 crore) and received grant-in-aid of Rs. 161.47 crore (Plan: Rs. 93.50 crore and Non Plan: Rs. 67.97 crore) during the year. It had own receipts of Rs. 7.70 crore (Plan : Rs. 2.86 crore and Non-Plan: Rs. 4.84 crore). It utilised Rs. 188.11 crore (Plan: Rs. 118.25 crore and Non-Plan: Rs. 69.86 crore) leaving unutilised grant-in-aid of Rs. 41.40 crore (Plan: 14.74 crore and Non-Plan: Rs. 26.66 crore).

The opening balances of grant-in-aid shown in the Schedule 10 of the accounts are not correct and should be Rs. 60.34 crore (Plan: Rs. 36.63 crore and Non-Plan Rs. 23.71 crore). This opening balance is the cash balances of RSS as on 31/3/2015 and not the opening balance of grant-in-aid.

The expenditure shown in Schedule 10 does not include expenditure of Rs. 6.25 crore (Plan Rs. 0.33 crore and Non-Plan Rs. 5.92 crore) on retirement expenses as the same has been booked in Schedule 2.

D. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Vice-Chancellor, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:

a. in so far as it relate to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as at 31 March 2016; and

b. in so far as it relate to the Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

Annexure to Audit Report

1. Adequacy of Internal audit system

The internal audit is being done by constituting audit parties from the staff of RSS Headquarter and its campuses. However during the year 2015-16 no internal audit was done.

- The internal audit of headquarters is not being done.
- The internal audit is not being conducted by the Ministry.
- There is no internal audit manual.

2. Adequacy of Internal Control System

The internal control system of RSS is inadequate due to following reasons:

- (i)** Irregular internal audit and non-maintenance of internal audit manual.
- (ii)** In Lucknow campus of RSS expenditure of Rs. 6.35 lakh has been incurred without prior expenditure sanction from competent authorities.
- (iii)** Non preparation of Bank reconciliation statement by Bhopal Campus of RSS.
- (iv)** Non-maintenance of cheque issue register by Mumbai campus of RSS.
- (v)** Physical verification of fixed assets/inventories of RSS Hqrs. and its campus was not regularly done.

3. System of physical verification of assets

- (i)** The physical verification of fixed assets of RSS headquarters is pending for the years 2014 to 2016.
- (ii)** The physical verification of fixed assets of the campuses of RSS was not being done regularly (on the basis of test check of campuses)

4. System of Physical verification of inventory.

- (i)** The Physical verification of inventories of RSS Hqrs. was conducted upto 31.03.2014 and of books and publication was under process.
- (ii)** The physical verification of inventories of the campuses of RSS was not being done regularly (on the basis of test check of campuses).

5. Regularity in payment of dues.

- As per accounts, no payment over six month in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2016.
