# Selection Criteria and Scheme of Examination for the post of ASSISTANT

## 1. General

- 1.1 The selection to the post of Assistant shall be through a process of Computer Based Test (CBT) &Written test, followed by Skill Test in Typing on Computer.
- 1.2 The examination will consist of two papers Paper-1-CBT (Objective- MCQ) and Paper-2 (Descriptive), each Paper for 100 Marks.
- 1.3 For Paper 1(Objective-MCQ), there will be 100 questions carrying 01 mark each.
- 1.4 The Time for Computer Based Test of Paper-1 (Objective-MCQ) is of 60 minutes.
- 1.5 The Time allotted for Paper-2 (Descriptive) is of 2 hours.
- 1.6 To qualify the examination, the candidate must secure at least 40% of marks in each paper. Only those candidates who obtain qualifying marks in the objective CBT Paper and in Descriptive paper, shall be eligible for appearing in the Skill Test in Typing on Computer.
- 1.7 The Skill Test in typing on computer will be qualifying in nature, but merit list for selection will be drawn on the basis of combined marks secured in the Objective-CBT Paper and the Descriptive-written Paper. Only those candidates who qualify skill test will be considered for inclusion in the merit list.
- 1.8 There is no negative marking for any wrong answer in CBT examination (Paper-1).
- 1.9 In Paper -1 (Objective-MCQ), the questions in Section-A will be in concerned language and for Section-B and Section-C, the questions will be in bilingual (Hindi & English).
- 1.10 The answer script in Paper-2 (Descriptive) should be written either in English or Hindi i.e. only in one language, except wherever it is specified to do so, otherwise the paper will not be evaluated and score will not be awarded.
- 1.11 Merit shall be decided based on combined marks secured in Objective and Descriptive Papers subject to fulfilment of conditions as mentioned herein above.
- 1.12 In the event of tie in scores in the total marks in written test (both Objective & Descriptive), the following factors will be taken in order of preference in deciding the merit:
  - (a) Higher Score in the 2nd Paper of the candidate
  - (b) Percentage of marks in the Graduation, which is the minimum qualification to apply for the post,
  - (c) Age factor comes in scene (elder candidate will be given preference).
