Selection Criteria and Scheme of Examination for the post of **PROFESSIONAL ASSISTANT**

1. General

- 1.1 The selection to the post of Professional Assistant shall be through a process of Computer Based Test (CBT).
- 1.2 For CBT (Objective-MCQ), there will be 100 questions carrying 01 mark each (Total 100 marks).
- 1.3 The Time for Computer Based Test (Objective-MCQ) is of 60 minutes.
- 1.4 To qualify the examination, the candidate must secure at least 40% of marks in Objective Paper.
- 1.5 There is no negative marking for any wrong answer in CBT examination.
- 1.6 In CBT (Objective-MCQ) Paper, the questions in Section-A will be in concerned language and for Section-B and Section-C, the questions will be in bilingual (Hindi & English).
- 1.7 Merit shall be decided based on the marks secured in Objective (CBT– MCQ) Paper subject to fulfilment of conditions as mentioned herein above.
- 1.8 In the event of tie in scores in the total marks in Objective (CBT– MCQ) Paper, the following factors will be taken in order of preference in deciding the merit:
 - (a) Percentage of marks in the PG degree, which is the minimum qualification to apply for the post.
 - (b) Age factor comes in scene (elder candidate will be given preference).
