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1. AN OVERVIEW

1.1. The Institution

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (hereinafter designated as Sansthan) was established on 15th October, 1970 as an autonomous organisation registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Act XXI of 1860). It is an autonomous organisation created for the overall development and promotion of Sanskrit in the country. It is being fully funded by the Government of India since its inception. It functions as the apex body for the propagation and development of Sanskrit and assists the Ministry of Human Resource Development in formulating and implementing various plans and schemes for the development of Sanskrit studies. It has assumed the role of a nodal agency for the effective implementation of various recommendations made by the Sanskrit Commission set up by the Government of India, Ministry of Education in 1956 concerning the preservation, propagation and development of Sanskrit language and education in all its aspects.

Considering Sansthan's contribution in the field of promotion and propagation of traditional Sanskrit education including teaching, training and research activities in Sanskrit, the Government of India accorded it the status of **Deemed University** w.e.f. 7th May, 2002 vide Notification No. F.9-28/2000-U.3 followed by U.G.C.'s Notification No.F.6-31/2001(CPP-I) dated 13th June, 2002. On 5th July, 2012 **National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC)**, Bangalore awarded Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), New Delhi **with 'A' grade.**

Under the scheme of review of Deemed Universities, the UGC Review Committee inspected all the campuses of the Sansthan including its Head Quarter at Delhi. The committee has praised the academic standard maintained by the Sansthan and has further recommended the status of Deemed University to it.

1.2 Role and functions

The major objectives of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and in pursuance thereof -

1. To Provide for higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels fully conforming to the concept of university, namely University Education Report (1948) and the Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).
2. To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management, etc. routinely offered by conventional institutions.
3. To provide for high quality teaching and research and for the advancement of knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken in-house by substantial number of full time faculty/research scholars (Ph.Ds and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines.
4. To enable creation of Sansthan under the 'de novo' category devoted to unique in emerging areas of knowledge, not being pursued by conventional or existing institutions - particularly in specific areas of study and research preferably sponsored by the Government of a State/ UT or the Central Government regarded as important for strategic needs of the country or for the preservation of our

cultural heritage, so determined by a well laid-out process of wide consultation with the eminent peers of academic community.

5. To undertake, aid, promote, coordinate research in all branches of Sanskrit learning including teachers' training and manuscriptology, to bring out linkage with the outcome of modern research in the contextually relevant fields and to bring out publications.
6. To act as nodal agency for the Government of India to implement its policies and programmes for the development of Sanskrit.
7. To provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as it may deem fit.
8. To provide for research and for the advancement of/and dissemination of knowledge.
9. To undertake extra mural studies, extension programmes and field outreach activities to contribute to the development of society.
10. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the objectives of the Sansthan.

1.3 Programmes and Activities

Realising its objectives, the Sansthan has undertaken the following major programmes and activities :-

- Establishment of Campuses in different States of India.
- Conducting teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary/ Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Research at Doctorate levels.
- Conducting teachers D training at graduate level i.e. Shiksha-Shastri (B. Ed.) and Post graduate level i.e. Shiksha-Acharya (M.Ed.).
- Conducting and Coordinating research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit.

- Cooperating with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.
- Establishment of Sanskrit libraries, manuscripts' collection centres and also editing and publishing rare manuscripts and books of importance.
- Conferment of degrees and granting of diplomas/certificates to persons having satisfactorily completed the approved prescribed courses of study/research and passed prescribed examinations.
- Instituting and awarding visitorship, fellowship, scholarships, stipends, prizes and medals.
- Conducting distance education programmes.
- Implementation of schemes of the Ministry of Human Resource Development for the promotion of Sanskrit.

1.4 Teaching

Teaching is conducted from Prak Shastri to Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the Sansthan in its 13 Campuses. The affiliated institutions carry out teaching from Prathama to Acharya.

Sanskrit institutions managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the Sansthan also impart teaching with the same syllabus.

1.5 Teachers' Training

In the Campuses, teacher's training course of one academic year with emphasis on teaching practice, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha Shastri Degree which is equivalent to B.Ed.. In addition, Shiksha Acharya Degree course equivalent to M.Ed. is conducted in Puri, Jaipur, Jammu and Bhopal Campuses.

1.6 Research

In all the Campuses of the Sansthan, students are enrolled for carrying out research leading to the award of degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D..

However, Ganga Nath Jha Campus, Allahabad is exclusively dedicated to research activities in selected branches of Sanskrit. The Library of the Campus is one of the richest Sanskrit Libraries in the country. A collection of over 57,957 rare manuscripts are also preserved in the library.

1.7 Publications

Research Journals and Books

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has been publishing two research journals containing research based articles, namely '*Sanskrit Vimarsha*' and 'Journal of the Ganganath Jha

Campus, Allahabad. While the first journal is brought out by the Sansthan's Headquarters Office, the other is published by Ganganath Jha Campus, Allahabad. In addition, the Campuses also publish annual literary magazines. The campuses also upgraded the annual magazines published by them as research journals.

The Sansthan as well as the Campuses have brought out scholarly works, rare manuscripts and original texts. The Sansthan has published 654 books so far.

Sanskrit Varta - a quarterly news bulletin in Sanskrit is also being published regularly.

2. AUTHORITIES & STRUCTURE

2.1 Minister of Human Resource Development, Government of India is the Chancellor of the Sansthan. During the period 01.04.2018 to 31.03.2019 **Shri Prakash Javadekar, Minister of Human Resource Development, Government of India** held the position of the Chancellor of the Sansthan. The Vice-Chancellor is the principal academic & executive officer. He is the president of all statutory bodies of the Sansthan. He exercises general supervision and control over the affairs of the Sansthan, executes policies and programmes and implements the decisions of all its authorities. **Prof. Parmeshwara Narayana Shastry** is continuing as Vice Chancellor of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan during the year 2018-19. The following are the authorities of the Sansthan:

1. **Board of Management** - It is the principal organ of the management in the Sansthan. It is empowered to take policy decisions and to ensure implementation of the decisions.
2. **Academic Council** - It is the principal academic body responsible for the

maintenance of standards of education, teaching, training, examinations and research programme.

3. **Finance Committee** - It is the apex finance body responsible for placing annual accounts and financial estimates before the Board of Management, fixing limits of total expenditure and recommending creation of all types of posts.
4. **Planning and Monitoring Board**- It is the principal planning body responsible for monitoring of development programmes.

Apart from the above the Sansthan has also other constituted bodies for making recommendations with regard Planning and Monitoring Board to their respective nature of functions namely Grant in Aid Committee, Publication Committee, Scholarship Selection Committee, Research Board and Examination Board.



RASHTRIYA SANSKRIT SANSTHAN**





4.1 Activities at Head Quarter

4.1 ACTIVITIES AT HEAD QUARTER

4.1.1 ADMINISTRATION

The administration services of the Sansthan are executed through the following wings which are headed by the officers in-charge who assist in the subject matters linked with their unitsz :

- (a) General Administration/Establishment
- (b) Personnel Administration
- (c) Campus Administration

In addition to the above main activities, this branch also deals with services and supplies, acquisition of land & building, establishment of new campuses and conducting meetings of Board of Management and Finance Committee. Various construction proposals for the buildings at different Campuses alongwith the estimated expenditure were sanctioned during the period

under report which are campus wise summarised as under :

Under Right to Information Act, 2005, total number of 281 applications and 33 first appeals were received in the Headquarters Office and replies to 229 applications and 25 appeals were given. 30 applications were transferred to the related campuses and institutions.

4.1.2 FINANCE & ACCOUNTS

Budget (2018-19)

These funds were utilised during the year on pay and allowances, scholarships, President's award to eminent Sanskrit scholars and various schemes under development of Sanskrit Education and other maintenance items of expenditure.

Accounts

The wing is responsible for the consolidation of accounts received from various units of the Sansthan and submission to DGACR for audit. The consolidated annual account for the year 2018-19 submitted to DGACR for Audit are placed at Annexure-'M'.

Maintenance of Provident Fund Accounts

The section maintains pay and provident fund accounts for officers and members of the staff of the Headquarters Office. Every member has been supplied with the annual provident fund account statement immediately after the close of the financial year.

Settlement of Audit Objections

Concerted efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual campuses were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were settled during the year.

4.1.3 ACADEMIC SECTION

The important responsibilities of the section are :

- * To organize the Academic activities of the Sansthan and frame syllabi for various courses.
- * To creating syllabus of different subjects and Prathma to Acharya.
- * To coordinate convening of Academic Council Meeting and Meeting of Board of Studies and take follow up action and follow up action.
- * This Section is also responsible for laying

down standards for Academic performance and preparation of calendar of Academic programme.

- * During the year under report, two meetings of the Academic Council were held in the month of May 2018. Sub-committee of Academic Council in held on December 2018.
- * The Academic Section has also been entrusted the responsibility of grant of affiliation to Sanskrit institutions. The Sansthan had started with a few Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha but later some

private institutions were also affiliated. These private institutions are affiliated only for the general courses from Prathama to Acharya and Vidyavaridhi. Under the instruction of University Grant Commission the Vidyalaya/Maha-vidyalaya cannot be affiliated. The status

of Affiliated Institutions for the previous year was retained *status quo* on the recommendations of the Sub-Committee of Academic Council and Board of Management.

4.1.4 RESEARCH and PUBLICATION SECTION

This department is entrusted with the responsibilities of :

- A. Co-ordinating Research activities of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.
- B. Looking after the publication work of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

The department has the responsibility of organizing the meetings of Central Research Board and Publication Committee to carryout the above tasks.

Sansthan's Central Research Board met on 30.10.2018. Registration of 101 research students was approved in different Campuses for Vidyavaridhi research degree course. 04 JRF have been registered in Vidyavaridhi at the campuses including Headquarter.

The Sansthan through its Publication Committee meetings held on 06.03.2019 and approved various important titles for publication.

4.1.5 EXAMINATION SECTION

The section is mainly responsible for conducting various examinations and the evaluation of examination papers of the Sansthan. The examinations, such as Prathama to Acharya, Shiksha Shastri, Shiksha Acharya and Vidyavaridhi are conducted by the Sansthan. In these examinations, students from



Award of Scholarships to Students of Sanskrit Pathshalas /Mahavidyalayas/ High/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges.

Scheme-IX

All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest.

I. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching

a) Towards salary of Sanskrit Teachers for Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Schools/Mahavidyalayas

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance in the shape of salary to Sanskrit teachers, scholarship to students, Library grants. An amount of Rs. 859.99 lakh approximately was incurred under this scheme by the Sansthan. During the year, financial assistance was provided to 427 institutions.

b) Towards Salary of Teacher for Modern subjects in Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Mahavidyalas

Under this scheme of development of Sanskrit, the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is providing financial assistance to teachers for modern subjects remuneration of Rs. 8000/-per subject. As per the scheme, the financial assistance is restricted to three teachers in modern subjects in each institution. An amount of Rs. 149.82 lakh was incurred under this scheme by the Sansthan in the year 2018-2019. The financial assistance was provided to 127 Institutions.

c) Towards Salary of Sanskrit Teachers for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools belonging to State Govt.

Under the Scheme of development of Sanskrit, the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan is providing financial assistance to Sanskrit teachers of Government Schools in different states. This assistance is extended towards salary of one Sanskrit teacher. During the year 2018-19, a total of 35 Government Schools were the beneficiaries and an amount of Rs. 22.20 lakh was utilised under this scheme.

II. Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.

Under the scheme the financial assistance is provided in the form of Samman Rashi by Sansthan to the eminent scholars above the age of 65 who have dedicated their lives to Sanskrit

but have no settled source of income. The recommended scholar will be given Rs. 36,000/- per annum, without deduction of income from other sources. For this purpose of Pandits having income of less than Rs. 72000/- per annum only would be considered.

III. Financial Assistance to NGOs/ Deemed Sanskrit Universities/ Universities for various Research Projects and Programmes/Activities for promotion of Sanskrit

&

VII. Financial Assistance to Universities/ Deemed Universities/CBSE/NCERT/ SCERT etc. to improve standards of Sanskrit teaching.

Under these schemes, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan meets cent percent approved expenditure on different projects and programmes for the development and propagation of Sanskrit undertaken by NGO's/ Deemed Sanskrit Universities/Universities/ Institutions. During the year 2018-2019 the Sansthan incurred an expenditure of Rs. 6.37 lakh for various projects.

IV. Financial Assistance for Publication, Re-print and Bulk Purchase

During the year 2018-19, meeting of the Grants-in-Aid Committee of the Sansthan was convened on 12.10.2018 in which several important proposals were approved under publication schemes. A total amount of Rs. 95.00 lakh was released for the these schemes to meet out the expenses for their execution.

Under the scheme of Production of Sanskrit Literature, 15 books were published by different authors with financial assistance of the Sansthan and 23 other proposals were sanctioned for publication grant. **(Annexures at 'J' and 'K')** In addition to it, 10 Sanskrit Journals/News Papers were also granted annual publication grant.

V. Shastra Chudamani Scheme

Under this Scheme, the services of retired eminent Sanskrit scholars are utilised in campuses, Adarsh Sanskrit Pathshalas and other State Government run Sanskrit Colleges/ Universities and voluntary organisations. The object of the Scheme is to preserve the indepth studies of different Shastras at the various centres where Sanskrit education is imparted to the Sanskrit students of traditional system. As per the scheme, the traditional scholars are appointed in different organisations. The scholars are being paid Rs. 10,000/- p.m. for a period of two years. The appointment so made can be extended for another one year on the recommendation of the Grants in Aid Committee.

In addition to the existing appointed scholars, 14 more Shastra Chudamani Scholars were selected during 2018-2019. A sum of Rs. 56.53 Lakh was utilised under the scheme.

VI. Vocational Training Scheme

Under this scheme, selected organisations are sanctioned financial assistance to organise the workshop and to conduct Prayogik Prashikshan in vocational disciplines like Jyotisha, Karmakanda, Paleography, Cataloguing, Manuscriptology, Sanskrit Shorthand and Typing etc.. An amount of Rs. 3.15 lakh was utilised under this scheme during 2018-2019.

VIII. Award of Scholarships

This scheme is carried out by the scholarship section. Details regarding this are shown in 4.1.2. & 3.

IX. All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest

We organize different Shastric Competitions under the programme named Akhila Bharateeya Shastriya Spardha. The details of this

programme during 2018-19 are given in 4.1.10 of this Annual Report.

X Ashtadashi Project

Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, Department of Higher Education vide letter No. F.No. 1-27/2015. Skt. II dated 18.11.2015 had constituted a thirteen (13) Member Committee under the Chairmanship of Shri N.Gopalaswamy, Chancellor, Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati to suggest a long-term Vision and Roadmap for next ten years for the development of Sanskrit.

As per terms of references, one of the major recommendations of the Committee is Ashtaadashi (18 Projects) for sustaining the growth of Sanskrit. According to the report, Ashtaadashi Scheme may be taken up as a special case in order to give the much-required boost for the growth engine of Sanskrit. The major areas of the Ashtaadashi project are:

1. Knowledge Texts Translation Project.
2. Editing & Publishing of Manuscripts Project.
3. Digital & Online Resources Project.
4. Summer Course Project.
5. Contemporary Literature Project.
6. Evening School Project.
7. Technology Adaptation Project.
8. Computer Education Project.
9. Biennial Sanskrit Book fair Project.
10. Outreach Programs Project.
11. Shabdashala Project.
12. Reprinting of Rare Books Project.
13. Residential Training Project.
14. Integrating Sanskrit with Modern Subjects Project.
15. Support Internship Project.
16. Children's Literature Project.
17. Yoga through Sanskrit Project.
18. Ayurveda through Sanskrit.

As per recommendations of the Road Map Committee and Ministry of HRD, the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan had issued a notification for inviting proposals for financial assistance to universities/educational institutions/ organizations. According to the notification and recommendations of pre-scrutiny committee, a total number of 64 proposals were called for interface meeting for presentation. Based on

these guidelines, quality of the proposals and presentation of the concerned projects Principia Investigator the High-level Committee has recommended 42 projects at a cost of Rs. 1,84,44,000/- (Rs. One Crore Eighty-Four Lakhs and Forty-Four Thousand Only). Consequently, after approval of the GIAC and BoM, grants are being disbursed according to rules to concern institutions.

4.1.9 SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan disburses two types of scholarships -

(1) Internal scholarships for traditional Sanskrit students studying in Sansthan's own campuses.

(2) Financial Assistance for Award of Scholarship to students of Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Mahavidyalayas/High/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges at All India Level in Modern and Traditional Streams.

Among the above mentioned 1,2 the type 1 scholarship (i.e. internal scholarship for the campus students) are directly distributed to the eligible students by the Campuses. Type 2 scholarships is distributed under the 'Scheme for the Development of Sanskrit Education' of Govt.

of India. The disbursement of scholarships under this scheme is looked after by the scholarship section of H.Q. of Sansthan.

Internal (type 1) Scholarships

The rates of internal scholarships for students of Prak Shastri, Shastri, Shiksha Shastri and Acharya courses are Rs. 600/- Rs. 800/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 1000/- per month respectively. Scholars pursuing research for the award of Vidyavaridhi degree are granted monthly scholarship amount of Rs. 8000/- in addition to annual contingency grant of Rs. 8000/- for two years w.e.f. 18.02.2016.

In order to encourage the students in Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit, a merit scholarship is provided by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan under the scheme for Development of Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit Education to regular students studying Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit as a main or optional subject in any recognized Sanskrit Pathashala/Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya/ Sanskrit Vishwavidyalaya in Traditional Stream or School/College/ University in Modern Stream pursuing Purva-Madhyama(1st year)/9th standard, Purva-Madhyama (2nd year)/10th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/Prakshastri (1st year)/11th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/Prakshastri (2nd year)/12th standard, Shastri / B.A (1st/2nd/3rd year), Acharya/M.A(1st/2nd year), Vidyawaridhi/Ph.D. or equivalent.

4.1.11 ADARSHA SANSKRIT MAHAVIDYALAYA/SHODH SANSTHAN

Name of the Scheme

The Scheme for Financial Assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans.

Introduction

The Scheme for financial assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas / Adarsh Shodha Sansthans was started by the Government of India in 1978 for supporting traditional institutions of Sanskrit learning. It was reviewed from time to time. The last review by Ministry of Human Resource Development was made in 1993 and the same became operative vide letter no. F. 30-19/88-skt-I dated 7th July, 1993. Later the Scheme was transferred to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan for implementation Vide letter no. F. 8-3/94-skt-I dated 16th June, 1995 of the Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. This scheme has been further revised by Government of India, vide letter no. F.N. 31-4/ 2009-Skt.I dated 29th June, 2012.

Consequent upon the changes that have come about in the field of higher education, particularly Sanskrit education, implementation

of 6th Pay Commission, Pay Grade and subsequent issuance of Regulations by the University Grants Commission for maintenance of standards in higher education, it has become imperative to reformulate the scheme in order to enable the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Shodha Sansthans to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research in a more effective way.

Under this scheme, 26 Institutions are being run at various parts of the country with the financial assistance of Govt. of India through the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan and major portion of the finance for this scheme is being released by the Sansthan. There are 22 ASM & 04 ASS (01 ASM i.e. Smt. Laad Devi Sharma Puncholi Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya, Bhilwara, Rajasthan has been recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya for financial assistance in the March, 2015). Such institutions are are financially assisted to the extent of the 95% of the admissible expenditure for recurring item and to the extent of 75% for non-recurring items, subject to the maximum of Rs.5.00 lakh per annum relating to development of infrastruture.

Objectives

The objective of the Scheme is to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research. For this purpose, assistance is extended under this scheme to Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas for conducting courses at the level of Shastri and Acharya and to Shodha

Sansthans (Research Institution) for organizing and conducting research - both at doctoral and post doctoral levels **and bringing out research based publications and research journals.**

4.1.12 PROJECTS

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has undertaken several valuable projects since 2003. The list of projects undertaken/being undertaken is given below for information even though there is no specific progress in these during the reporting year.

i. Bhasha Mandakini (T.V. Telecast)

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan telecasts Sanskrit programmes through Cyan Darshan Channel of IGNOU daily and thrice in a week

through D.D. Bharati and D.D. India since September, 2003. since then 730 episodes of 30 minutes were telecast by IGNOU.

2.National E-data Bank of Sanskrit Literature :- (E-text)

The project aims at developing e-learning in Sanskrit and making e-Sanskrit corpus available to public through electronic texts and internet. Targets for the first phase of the project have

been decided and the ground work has been prepared. One hundred texts have been taken up for preparing data-base to start the ground work for this tremendous task. Teachers in different campuses of the Sansthan have been assigned the texts as per their specializations and area of study. Data entry operators have been engaged for feeding the texts and preparing files on the computer. 120 video lectures have been uploaded in the Sansthan's website.

3. Sanskrit Teaching through Audio/ Video (Multimedia Project)

In this project DVD albums have been prepared Sanskrit Bhasha Shikshnam, Vaidic Ganit, Sankshepa Ramayana, Naytyavinshatika, Kathadashakam, Prathama Deeksha V.C.D., Tadeva Gaganam Saiva Dhara, Kavibhaskari, Abhijnanashakuntalam, Shabdakalpadrum and Bhasnatakchakram are available for sale.

4. MP3 Audio -

'Tattvachintamani' prepared by Prof. K.E. Devanathan, Tirupati and 'रणायणीयं सामगानम्' prepared by Shri Vedamurti Prabhakar Shastri and Pundlik Krishna Bhagvat is available for sale.

5. E-Granthalaya -

3,05,567 books have been entered for networking the libraries of all campuses of Sansthan with E-granthalaya software.

6. Manas Software -

Manas software for preparing data bank of Sanskrit Manuscripts has been assigned in the Allahabad Campus.

7. Who is Who -

The Sansthan prepared data bank of Sanskrit Scholars in a book form as well as soft form. The book form 'Inventory of Sanskrit Scholars' (संस्कृतविद्वत्परिचयिका) already published on the occasion of 15th World Sanskrit Conference, 2012 and uploaded on website.

8. Dictionary of Sanskrit -

Inter-lingual studies can provide a plausible

way for promotion and preservation of languages. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has taken up a project on 'Dictionary of Sanskrit and other Indian languages including Dialects and Sub-dialects.' This project has been taken up with financial assistance under the schemes of MHRD in 2009.

This project will also contribute to the preservation and protection of traditional knowledge and linguistic skills through the study of common terminology in diverse Indian languages, dialects and sub-dialects. Details of Dictionary projects read as under:-

i. Work on 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary and 'Malvi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' is carried out in Bhopal campus, Bhopal. In '**Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary**', collection work of 14000 words of Bundeli is completed and Bundeli to Sanskrit word-meanings of vowels, Kavarga, Cha, Chha, Ja, is completed. Remaining work of word-collection has been complete in '**Malvi-Sanskrit-Dictionary**' collection work of 15,000 words of Malavi is completed and typed. Also, Malavi to Sanskrit word-meaning of vowels, Kavarga, Chavarga is completed.

ii. '**Dialect-Sub-Dialects of North and North East India**' project is carried out in Sanskrit Sahitya Parishad, Kolkata, in which total 11,487 words of oriya and Banlga languages were collected.

iii. Work of '**Sanskrit-Persian-Urdu-Hindi Dictionary**' is carried out in Sansthan headquarter. Under this project first volume based on vowels got published and in Consonants work from 'Ka' to 'Dha' is completed. Remaining work is in process.

9. Sankhyayoga or Patanjalyoga Darshan-

In this project, the new edition of Patanjalyog Darshan is being prepared which is enriched and embellished with its terminologies and twelve antique commentaries. In the conservation of oriental Sanskrit texts, this project will contribute immensely. Two S.R.F. are working at Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi in this project.

The first phase of the project has been

completed. In this phase, eleven commentaries of fifty one sutras of first chapter and common terminology available therein is arranged. In Appendix, the पाठशेखर and of yogasutras are arranged alphabetically in first volume which is handed over to Research and Publication. The work on seven commentaries of Patanjala Yogasutra and four commentaries of Samkhyapravachan Bhasya is still carried on.

10. Special Drive for Collection and Digitization of Manuscripts -

All the Campuses of the Sansthan have independent libraries. This apart, the Campuses at Allahabad, Puri, Guruvayur and Lucknow have manuscript libraries also. The Guruvayoor campus has undertaken a special drive for the collection of manuscripts from the year 2008-09 onward. The Sansthan has also taken the initiative for the digitization of all the manuscripts available in various libraries of its campuses. The digitization work will be conducted through NIC.

As per information received from National Manuscripts Mission, digitization of 55,369 manuscripts out of 52,187 manuscripts has been completed in Allahabad Campus.

At Present Running Projects

Minor/Major Research Projects in Sansthan Campus

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan strives to promote teaching and research in emerging areas in Sanskrit Shastras, accordingly the campuses of Sansthan have been the centres of research in higher education in various disciplines. Hence Sansthan provide the support to its campuses/teachers for promoting research through projects. In this regard Sansthan will

allot 1-2 major projects and 1-2 minor projects to each campus, annually. To achieve this goal there are 32 projects in first round (4 major & 2 minor) projects are in continuation.

MOOCs Project

Mooc's training workshop was held at Eklavya Campus, Agartala (Tripura) from 22-28 March, 2018 to develop lesson on Mooc Matform by teaching staff of all departments from various campuses.

Rajabhasha

Ministry has implemented the programme regarding promotion and propagation of Hindi Rajabhasha in all Central Govt. offices. Accordingly Sansthan also doing sufficient official work in Hindi as well as organizing different kinds of programme. Every year we send trisemester report of work done in Hindi to the HonDble Minister apart from other activities.

Deccan College Sanskrit Dictionary Project

"An Encyclopedia Dictionary of Sanskrit on Historical Principals" is being implemented by the Sansthan in department of Sanskrit and Lexicography, Deccan college, Pune with financial support from the Ministry of HRD through Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. Till now 32 volumes are published in this project.

Bharatavani Project.

Bharatavani is a project with an objective of delivering knowledge in and about all the languages in India using multimedia (i.e., text, audio, video, images) formats through a portal (website). This portal would be all inclusive, interactive, dynamic and moderated. The idea is to make India an Open Knowledge Society, in the era of Digital India. Accordingly Sansthan has successfully uploaded 40 e-books on Bharatavani Portal.

1. Conduct of Non Formal Sanskrit Teaching Centres

Sanskrit language is a unique treasure of Indian intellectual tradition and Culture. The nature of Sanskrit is very vast and comprehensive. Innumerable Indians want to study Sanskrit for the protection and firmness of their Indian aspect. With simple process, they are to be introduced Sanskrit language and knowledge contained therein in simple way. With concept of this great objectives and to provide the facility of Sanskrit study to the learners of varigated walks of society. Non Formal Sanskrit Education was started by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi.

The centers were set up by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on the basis of applications received from highly reputed Institutions of the country like the Indian Institutes of Technology, Ayurveda Institutions, Modern Colleges and Universities. Sansthan has appointed trained Sanskrit teachers for the current academic session in these centers. An authorised officer has been nominated at each center by the Vice-Chancellor of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan for the smooth functioning of the Non Formal Sanskrit learning center. In the academic session 2018-2019, with the help of the authorized officer, A total of 128 centers were conducted in North East states, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Goa, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Telangana, Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh.

Authorized Officers evaluate all the activities of their respective centers and forward the monthly progress details to the Department.

A total of 7134 learners of different age groups benefited in this academic session in the Sanskrit language certificate course and Sanskrit language proficiency course conducted by Non Formal Sanskrit Deptt.

The heads of institutions have also requested the Sansthan to co-ordinate the Non Formal Sanskrit learning center in their institution in the next academic session also.



01. Brief History of the Campus -

Situated in the heart of the holiest city Prayag i.e. in the bank of Ganga Yamuna and Saraswati, Ganganath Jha Research Institute was founded on 17th November 1943 in the auspicious occasion of second death anniversary of Mahamahopadhyaya (Dr.) Sir Ganganatha Jha with a view to perpetuate his name and works by a number of Great persons including Indologist and erudite scholars of eminence, his students, his well wishers and his family members like Mahamana Pt. Madan Mohan Malaviya, Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru, Dr. Bhagvan Das, Dr. S. Radhakrishnana, Justice Sri Kamala Kant Verma, Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj, Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishwari Prasad and Dr. Baburam Saxena etc.

The proposal for the building was registered on 12.1.45 under the society Registration act 1860. A land of 1.5 Acres was acquired with the effort of M.M. Umesh Mishra near the Chandra Shekhar Azad Park, in Company Bagh and the Foundation stone was laid on 3.2.1945 by the then Governor of U.P. Sir Maurish Haile.


Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru was the first Chairman (1943-49) of the Institute followed by Dr. Bhagavan Das (1949-59), Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, (1963-65), justice Shri Kamala

Kant Verma (1963-65) and Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj (1965-71). As Chairmen of the Institute Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishwari Prasad, Dr. Baburam Saxena have contuributed a lot for the upliftment of this institute.

The Institute was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi (Under the Ministry of HRD, Government of India) in 1st April, 1971 and it was named as Ganganatha Jha Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Again from 2002 onwards it has been renamed as Ganganath Jha Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, when Sansthan was recognised by UGC as a Deemed University now the campus is dedicated to undertake, aid, promote and co-ordinate original researches in all branches of indology.

02. Location of the Campus. -

Ganganath Jha Campus is situated in Chandrasekhar Azad Park in the Company Bagh, near Indian press Chaurah, behind the statue of the great martyr Chandrasekhar Azad. Just in front of the Campus in the east lies pannalal Road, in the north Jawaharlal Nehru Road (G.T. Road) and in the behind in i.e. west Allahabad Museum is situated in the Kamala Nehru Road. The Campus is placed in the distance of 3 k.m. form Civil Line Bus Station, 5 k.m. from Railway station and 15 k.m. form Bamrauli Air Port.

4.2.2 Shri Sadashiva Campus, Puri (Odisha)

About the Campus (Brief History of the Campus)

First centenary Celebration of our Campus on April 1st, 2018. Our Institution was transformed into a global college named Shri Sadashiva Campus on 01.04.1918 by effort of Pandit Sadashiva Mishra, an eminent Sanskrit Scholar. Before it, in 1865 by the continuous effort of Pandit Harihar Dash and financial support of the King of Balarampur state named Sir Digvijaya Singh Bahadur of Ayodhya dynasty, a Sanskrit institution was established in Puri and it was converted into a Sanskrit school in 1888. At that time the Sanskrit school as well as colleges were functioning under the ministry of Odisha State Govt. The subjects like Sahitya, Vyakarana, Dharmashastra, Vedant, Nyaya, Samkhyayoga, Mimamsa, Jyotish, Agam, Puran and Ayurveda including modern subjects like Odiya, English, Mathematics, History, Geography etc. were being taught. After that in August 15, 1971, the Deptt. of Education Govt. of India had taken it under his administration. So the Puri Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya, then Shri Sadashiva Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya was finally ornamented by the name of Shri Sadashiva Kendriya Sanskrit Bidyapitha. Again this institution was concented as Shri Sadashiva Campus (Deemed University) by the M.H.R.D. Govt of India on May 7th 2002. UGC had also given a conscent as Deemed University to this institution on June 13th, 2002 and its was inaugutated on July 3rd, 2002. Recently it is popular as Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), Shri Sadashiva Campus, Puri. Inspite of so many hurdles in the mission, presently this institution has flourished into a huge shade and our eminent students and scholars have increasing its prestige by their talents, success and publications in all over the world.

The campus celebrated the half centenary during the completion of 50 years since 01.04.1918 to 01.04.1968 and now we are going to celebrate the centenary celebration on

4.2.3 Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu (Jammu and Kashmir)

1. ABOUT THE CAMPUS

Introduction

Under the aegis of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), with its campuses all over India, is the largest, multi-campus university in the world. Prof. P.N. Shastri is the present Vice Chancellor of the university. Shri Ranbir Campus situated at Jammu, the winter capital of the state of Jammu and Kashmir, Shri Ranbir Campus is one of the 13 campuses of Sansthan. The campus building has been constructed on a stretch of land, measuring 84 kanals.

Objectives and Background

The history of the campus goes back to more than 173 years when Maharaja Shri Ranbir Singh of Jammu and Kashmir established Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya at Jammu, with a view to preserve and propagate the traditional knowledge enshrined in the Sanskrit language and literature. This Mahavidyalaya was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Government of India, on April 1, 1971, and named as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth. With the declaration of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as a multi-campus deemed university on May 2, 2002, this institution came to be called D Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Shri Ranbir Campus. Dr. Anant Maral Shastri was the first principal of the institution, followed by Dr. Dayanand Bhargava, Dr. J. Ganguly, Dr. Jagannath Pathak, Dr. Raghav Prasad Chaudhary, Dr. Ram Kishore Shukla, Dr. Priyatam Chandra Shastri (In-charge), Dr. G. Ganganna, Prof. Vishwa Murti Shastri, Prof. Yash Pal Khajuria, Prof. M. Chandrasekhar and Prof. Parameshwar Narayan Shastri. Prof. Ramanuja Devanathan and Prof. Baccha Bharti, Prof. Lokmanya Mishra. Prof. Fateh Singh is the principal of the Campus at present.

Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project

Kashmir Shaiva Darshan is a priceless legacy of the state of the Jammu and Kashmir. For the conservation and preservation of this priceless legacy, the Campus is exclusively running a Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project on its premises. Through the tireless efforts of Late Dr. Baljinnath Pandit and the research assistants associated with the project, two volumes of Kashmir Shaiva Darshan have been published, which are available for sale. The copies of the volumes are being sent all over India and the world. The department also houses 125 rare manuscripts. The manuscripts are in Sharada and Devanagari scripts. The transliteration and translation work on these manuscripts has stopped due to retirement/ transfer of the concerned research assistants to the headquarters. A request for appointment of staff has been made and the requisite staff is expected to be deputed soon, after which the project work would be resumed.

Publications

The campus has published 23 books relating to the various branches of knowledge. There is a great demand in the country for the books relating to Kashmir Shaiva Darshan. Publication of Annual Research Magazine EH Shri VaishnaviD featuring research-oriented articles, poems etc. in Sanskrit, English, Hindi, Dogri is being published regularly since the inception of the institution. The magazine has been granted ISSN 755 2277 906-x by National Institute of Science and Communication and Information Resources, New Delhi.

Besides this, Education Department has started publishing a Shikshashastra journal titled nshikshamritam since the academic session 2011-12. From academic year 2016-17 departmental research magazines are also being published.

2. Current Condition of the Campus

Library

The well-stocked library of the Campus enshrines about 46000 books on various subjects.

E- Library

To make available to the public at large, the introductory knowledge of books in the campus library, data entry process is going on in DE-granthalayaH - the e-library of the campus.

Planetarium

To provide the theoretical and practical knowledge of Astrology to the students, a small planetarium has been established in the campus. A number of instruments and teaching aids, such as, miniature planetarium, telescopes, planet orbit model machine, phases of the moon model machine, solar and lunar eclipse model machine, Gola Yantra and informative picture posters have been kept here.

Conference Hall

A conference hall, with conference microphones and LED projector system, having a seating capacity of 62 persons has been established at the campus.

Vani Vilas Auditorium

For smooth conduct of scholarly lectures, and dance, dramas, lectures and other cultural activities by the students of the campus, a well-equipped auditorium with a seating capacity of 500 persons has been established at the campus.

Computer Room

A computer room also has been established by the Modern Subjects Department of the campus to provide computer instruction to the Prak-Shastri and Shastri students. The computer room features 17 computers, air conditioners, excellent furniture, internet facility, and Wi Fi facility.

Departmental Computers

Computers with printers and internet facility have been provided to each department for the smooth functioning of the departmental activities at the campus.

Departmental Libraries

In order to make books conveniently available to the teachers and students, and to inculcate in them an interest in books, Departmental libraries have been established at all the departments of the campus. Every department was granted a sum of Rs. 50000 for the purpose of purchasing books in the current session.

Language Lab

Language Lab was established in the Department of Education (Pedagogy). At a time, ten students and one instructor can engage in understanding the intricacies of language learning and pronunciation. For this purpose, ten student computers and one instructor Ds computer has been established in the lab.

Teaching and Non-teaching Staff

The Campus is staffed with 35 faculty members, comprising of Professors, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors, Contract Teachers, and Guest Teachers, and 23 ministerial staff, 4 guards and 4 CPWD staff.

Hostels

For the students coming from the far-flung areas of the state and other parts of the country, separate hostels for boys and girls have been established. The hostels are well-equipped with modern facilities. They have 84 rooms capable of accommodating 168 students. The hostels also have 4 geysers. Both the hostels have separate messes also.

Staff Quarters

There are staff quarters inside the campus, to cater to the residential needs of the Principal, hostel superintendent and wardens and teaching staff of the campus.

Gymnasium

Yoga and physical exercise are also provided to the students to ensure their physical and mental health and well-being. For this purpose, a gymnasium equipped with modern exercising machines and a ten-sear work station, has been established.

Play Ground

Campus has a vast playground in this campus for game activities.

Studies and Research Activities

Shri Ranbir Campus provides education based on a beautiful combination of traditional and modern systems of education. As per the direction of the Sansthan Headquarters, semester system has been implemented in the Campus. Class-wise teaching arrangements are, as follow: -

Traditional Sanskrit Studies

Under the traditional Sanskrit Studies, the Campus has arrangements for teaching Prak-Shastri I + II (Intermediate 10+2), Shastri I + II + III (B.A.) and Acharya I + II (M.A.). The subjects taught include D traditional Sanskrit subjects like Sanskrit Grammar (Vyakarana), Sanskrit Literature (Sahitya), Philosophy (Darshan), Astrology (Siddhanta and Phalit Jyotisha), and Vedic Literature (Veda); and modern subjects like English, Hindi, Dogri, History, Political Science, Computer Science,

Environmental Science and Physical Education.

Professional Education

Professional courses like Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) and Shiksha-Acharya (M.Ed.) are taught in the Department of Education.

Research Activities

In order to conduct multi-dimension research activities in the relevant fields of Sanskrit learning, there are arrangements for Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) guidance. Till last year, 120 research scholars have been awarded Ph.D. degrees. At present, 24 students are registered as research scholars in the campus.

Institute of Distance Education (Mukta Swadhyaya Peetham)

For the purpose of promotion and propagation of Sanskrit at the world level, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan has started a distance education institution called *Muktaswadhyayapeetham*, which has been duly recognized by the Distance Education Council of India. All the campus of the Sansthan have a centre of the *Muktaswadyayapeetham*, called *Mukhtaswadyayakendram*.

The *Mukhtaswadyayakendram* at Shri Ranbir Campus started in 2010-11. There are 58 students registered with the Centre in the current session. The centre provides Intermediate (Prak-Shastri), B.A. (Shastri) and MA. (Acharya) courses as per semester system. A special feature of the *Mukhtaswadyayapeetham* is that there is an arrangement for Bridge courses for non-Sanskrit students. Under these courses, the students are provided audio-visual material with other course material such as textbooks etc. so that non-Sanskrit knowing students also can learn Sanskrit easily in a short time.

In addition to Sanskrit Literature, grammar and *Jyotisha* subjects, the centre is also conducting a course in Sanskrit journalism. There are plans for introducing other classical subjects. Besides these, certificate courses in Dramatics (*Natyashastra*), Pali, Prakrut etc, would be introduced soon. For these initiatives,

the Sanskrit Headquarters, the *Muktaswadha-yayapeetham* and all the lovers of Sanskrit deserve to be congratulated. A numbers of members of local Intelligentsia, such as, Engineers, doctors, lawyers, teachers have joined the courses offered by the *Kendram*.

2. LITERARY AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

2.1 Saraswati Parishad and Departmental Seminars

Since 1971 Saraswati Parishad in convened at Shri Ranbir Campus with the aim of furthering intellectual and personality development of students. Since 2006 the departments coach their students in prose, poetry, pronunciation etc. During their departmental Parishad which is convened on the third week of every month. In addition to these departmental Parishads on the last week of every month Saraswati Parishad is organized combining all departments during which, various competitions are held amongst the students.

2.2 Practice of Shastras

Inquisitive students with a notable interest Shastas are after scheduled classes, coached in the Shastra of their interest. To further the self-sufficiency of the students, they are also coached in Rudrashtadhyayi and other Vedic Mantras in theory and in practice. There is a special class organized to this end.

2.3 Natyamahotsava

4.2.7 Shri Rajiv Gandhi Campus, Sringeri (Karnataka)

About the Campus

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan established Rajiv Gandhi Campus at Sringeri, the abode of ancient treasure of knowledge where Sri Adi ShankaraBhagavatpada had established an AmnayaPeetha for the preservation and propagation of ancient treasure of knowledge, on 13th January 1992. The foundation stone of the campus was laid on 5th March 1992, by His **Holiness Jagadguru Sri Sri Bharati Teertha Mahaswamiji** of Dakshinaamnyaya Sringeri Sri Sharada Peetham, in the benign presence of **Shri R.Veikataraman**, the then President of India, and Shri Arjun Singh ji, the then Minister of HRD, Government of India. The Central Public Works Department has constructed the main building of the Campus at the cost of Rs.1.63 Crores. In the second phase the construction of hostels for boys and girls, quarters for minimum requirement of the staff has been done at the cost of Rs. 4.17 crores. Recently, in the year 2014-15, an extension work of the main building, a playground constructions work and hostel extension work were taken with a cost of Rs.8-05 crores, and the truncated position of the building was completed and inaugurated on 7th February, 2016 by Prof. P.N. Shastri, Honorable Vice-Chancellor of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

Presently, the Campus has a strength of 487 students. The campus vows a great debt of gratitude to the blessings of His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Sri Bhaarathi Teertha Mahasannidhanam, His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Sri Vidhushekhara Bharathi Sannidhanam, and to the grace of Dr. V.R. Gowrishankar Ji, the Chairman of Local Advisory Committee of the Campus and the Administrator of Shri Sharada peetham, Sringeri for providing mid-day meals for the students of the campus.

The Campus Location

The Campus, which is situated in Menase of Sringeri Taluk in Chickmagalur District of Karnataka State is established in 10.2 acre of land acquired from the State Government. The campus is situated at 120 kms away from Mangalore, 380 kms from Bangalore, 90kms from Udupi and 105 kms from Shimogya. It adjoins to the Shimogya-Bangalore train route and Vdupi-Mangalore-Humbai train route.

THE COURSE OFFERED

The Campus offers subjects such as Sahitya, Navya, Vyakarana, Advaita Vedanta, Mimamsa, Navya Nyaya and Phalitha Jyotisha at Acharya (MA) and Shastri (BA) levels. Shiksha-Shastri (B.Ed) and Prak Shastri (Intermediate) course are also offered here. The campus also offers Vidyavaridhi (PhD) degree for research scholars who complete the research successfully. Besides, the modern subjects such as Hindi, English, History, Kannada, Computer Science and Physical Education are also taught in the Campus. In addition to this, Diploma in Vastu Jyotisha also introduced. Apart from this, a new course called Shastri Pratishtha (BA. Honours) has also been introduced too.

In addition to the regular curriculum, the Campus has constituted three Parishad and Shree Sharada Vishishtavyakhyanamala for the benefit of the students. 4.2.9 Bhopal Campus, Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh)

About the Campus

As per the recommendation of the Sanskrit Commission (1956-57), the Government of India established the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on 15 October, 1970 as an autonomous body, for the development along with the dissemination of Sanskrit and the implementation of the Central Government's policies and programs regarding Sanskrit. Considering its multifarious importance in May 2002, the Ministry of Human Resource and Development, Government of India, has declared it a Multi Campuses Deemed University. At present total 12 campuses of this deemed university are working in different states of India among which, from the session 2002-2003, the Bhopal campus is being run in the capital city of M.P.- Bhopal.

Bhopal is a city which is well flourished in the aspects of natural, intellectual, literary, historical and political wealth from the ancient times. So the MHRD Govt. of India issued the establishment order no. Sanskrit-i-section dated 31st March 2002 to establish the Bhopal campus in the city. For the implementation of this government order the RSKS New Delhi started the Bhopal Campus from 1st July 2002, as per the letter no.- 37021/2002-admin/no8 office order no. iO7/dated 5.6.2002, by providing the principal and other departments etc. Though 10 years before this date, in 1991-92, by the declaration of the then minister of Human Resource and Development Ministry Govt. of India, Honourable Shri Arjun Singh, the planning of this Bhopal campus had been decided and at that very time the Govt. of M.P. had given 10 acres land at free of cost, for the development of this campus through the Govt. order letter no- F 67307 Govt./Sa-2B/93 dated 27.05.1993/20.7.1993. Thus, from 6th July 2002 in the room provided in the Barkatullah University Guest House the Bhopal Campus activities were started and from 2nd August 2002 the admission of the students and the teaching activities were started in a rented building in Arera Colony.

The formal inauguration of the Bhopal Campus was declared on the date 16th September 2002 by the then Governor of M.P. Honorable Bhai Mahaveerji in the presence of the then V.C., RSKS New Delhi Prof. Vempati Kutumba Shastri, the founder Principal of the Campus Prof. Azad Mishra and the other reputed scholars of the Sanskrit world. After that the then chief minister of M.P. Honorable Shri Digvijay Singh laid the foundation stone of this campus building on the allotted land plot on 27.02.2003. The foundation stone of the main administrative building was laid by the then minister of MHRD Honorable Shri Arjun Singh on the date 19th September 2005 for the further development of the Campus.

Then in the presence of then VC Prof. Radhavallabh Tripathi the newly built main building was named as the Vatsaraja Bhavan on the date 24.03.2010 i.e. Wednesday Ramnavami and all the campus activities were started in this Vatsaraja Bhavan from that day. At present in this Vatsaraja main building all the classes, laboratories, non-formal classes, departmental libraries, correspondent open education centre, Natya Shastra research centre, meeting hall and fully equipped auditorium are available. Along with these a systematic Vararuchi Granthagar (Central Library) and an air-conditioned Bhavabhuti Prekshagar (Auditorium) fully equipped with audio visual facilities too are available. In this building the guest room, teachers - room and rooms for the HODs are also given as per the rules. Apart from these a boys for hostel for 333 students, girls - hostel for 108 students, guest house, principal and employees residence have been provided in the campus.

- The campus is running 6 departments including- Sahitya, Vyakaran, Jyotish, Jain Darshan and Education with the Modern Subjects Department. The courses offered include Prakshastri, Shastri, Acharya, Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.), Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.), a separate certificate course in

Jyotish (3 months), Diploma in Vastushastra and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) in different branches of Sanskrit knowledge. For the training of the physical education a modern gymnasium along with playground is provided to the students.

- The Mukta Swadhyay Peeth is working in the campus for providing Sanskrit education to the people who want to learn Sanskrit.
- The campus Vararuchi Granthagara (Central Library) maintains a rich collection of many references, journals, books, other magazines and newspapers.
- The campus possesses well equipped Computer, Jyotish, Language, Curriculum and Psychology laboratories for the advance studies in Sanskrit.
- The well maintained open air theatre is built in the campus premises which can accommodate 300 people at a time.
- Bhopal Campus runs the unique Natyashastra Anusandhan Kendra which works on the theatrical presentation of the Sanskrit plays and dramas . It records and prepares the audio CDs of the Sanskrit songs and slokas.
- The Bhopal Campus publishes two ISSN journals namely Rashtri (ISSN- 2231-2129) and Shastra Mimansa (ISSN- 2321-6948). The yearly departmental publications are also there in all the departments of the campus.

Thus this Campus is striving hard to achieve the decided goals for the development of the Sanskrit Education.

4.2.10 K.J. Somaiya Sanskrit Vidyapeetham Campus, Mumbai (Maharashtra)

About the Campus (Brief History):

Philanthropist and a great visionary Padma bhushan awardee Sri Karamshi Jetha Bhai Somaiya had a great contribution in the field of Education and Social service. He established an educational institution in Somaiya Vidyavihar, which is now known as one of the biggest and esteemed educational institutions throughout the world. The Somaiya family is religious and has a great passion to wards Sanskrit language. Hence Shri Shantilal Somaiya, S/o K. J. Somaiya submitted a proposal to HRD to establish a Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan(D. U.) New Delhi in Somaiya Vidyavihar.

Consequent upon the submission of the proposal by K. J. Somaiya Trust, Vidyavihar, Mumbai for establishing a Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan with an offer of allotting one acre piece of land for construction of the building, a committee appointed by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan carried out an inspection and recommended establishing its constituent Vidyapeetha there. The Ministry of Human Resource and Development, Govt. Of India was kind enough to concur in the recommendations of the committee vide the decision taken on 31-3-2002. K. J. Somaiya Trust allowed the Sansthan to utilize their existing built up structure for the classes until the construction of building of the Campus is complete. The Sansthan has taken possession of the allotted land of one acre from the leaser Somaiya Trust. On the auspicious day of 16th May 2002, the then Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, Dr. Murli Manohar Joshi inaugurated the Mumbai campus. The construction of the new building on this site is in progress.

The Campus imparts teaching for the courses namely Prak-Shastri (equivalent to Intermediate or +2), Shastri (equivalent to B.A.) and Acharya (equivalent to M.A.(Sanskrit)) in different disciplines viz Sahitya, Jyotisha and Vyakarana. Besides the traditional subjects,

modern subjects are also taught according to the syllabi of the Sansthan. The N.C.T.E. approved Shiksha - Shastri Course (equivalent to B. Ed.) and consequently, this course was also introduced in the campus from 2005.

Campus Location

The Campus is located in the Campus of Somaiya Educational Institutional Trust at Vidyavihar East in Mumbai, the capital city of Maharashtra State. Currently, the K. J. Somaiya Trust in Vidyavihar has donated one acre land for the construction of the Vidyapeetha. All the formalities for the construction of building have been completed.

At present, the activities are being practised in a way that the Library and Shastra Classes are running in the Polytechnic Bhavan, Teaching-learning and research work is done in the Chanakya Bhavan. The Principal chamber and the Administrative office is located at Suruchi Kala Bhavan of the Campus.

4.2.13 Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Devprayag, Uttarakhand

About the Campus (Brief History of the Campus) :

Shri Raghunatha Kirti Adarsha Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya (Estd. 1908), Devaprayaga, Uttarakhand was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on 16th June, 2016 as its 13th constituent Campus. Like the former Mahavidyalaya, the campus is also named after the famous ancient deity Shri Raghunathaji shrined in the ancient Raghunatha temple constructed in the Katyuri style of Katyuri dynasty of the mountains on the holy confluence of two important mythological rivers, namely, Bhagirathi and Alaknanda from where exactly the river Ganga is originated.

Because of this cultural, spiritual and educational background, the campus was inaugurated here on 16.06.16 by Mr. Mantriprasad Naithani, the then HonDble Education Minister of Uttarakhand in the precious presence of Prof. P.N. Shastri, the Vice chancellor of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan along with M. K. Dhyani, the Ex Rajyasabha Member and Mr. Rajendra Kotiyal, the Suchana Ayukta, Uttarakhand. The former Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya has donated its premises with a vast land measuring 3.443 hectares and simultaneously the Govt. of Uttarakhand has also allotted some adjourned portion of land measuring 9.228 hectares. Now the campus has total land of 23 acres. The land with the complete approved layout plan has been handed over to CPWD (Shrinagar Branch) for the construction of the campus building. The construction of Boundary is almost complete and the construction works of all other required blocks including Academic, Administrative and residential (Hostel for Boys and Girls both, Guest House and several types of Staff Quarters) along with Library hall, Auditorium and Stadium (play ground) etc. are in progress.

Campus Location :

So far as the geographical, historical, cultural, mythological and educational status is concerned, Devaprayaga comes in the state of Uttarakhand (formerly Uttaranchal and still formerly Uttarpradesh) which is popularly and culturally known as Devabhumi or the divine land. This state of Devabhumi is adorned not only with one of the famous Jyotirmathas called Shribadrikashrama but with one of the twelve Jyotirlingas, namely, Shrikedarnatha. The province has the credit of being the sources of two vedic as well mythological rivers Ganga and Yamuna. Even today also the divine-souled (devatatma) Himalaya stands here as the measuring pole of the earth as if to glorify the state.

According to the Kedarakhanda of the Skanda-Purana, the name Devaprayaga came into existence on the very name of the sage Shri Deva Sharma who has undergone a severe penance in this auspicious place. Devaprayaga has the credit of being recognised as the first prayaga among the five prayagas of Uttarakhand, followed by Rudra prayaga, Kama Prayaga, Nanda prayaga and Vishnu prayaga respectively. The small but important city Deva prayaga is surrounded with atleast three series of mountains, namely, Griddhachala, Dasharathachala and Nrisimhachala etc. The Nrisimhachala part of Devaprayaga was famous earlier as a centre of learning in entire Uttarakhand being categorically named as vidyakshetra where exactly the campus is situated now. It is the only state where Sanskrit is accepted as its second official language.

Courses Offered :

The newly established campus now functions with six departments where traditional subjects like Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Sahitya, Veda, Vedanta and Nyaya are taught along with the modern Subjects like Hindi, English, History,

computer science etc. (up to graduation or Shastri level). Around hundred students are admitted to following different classes :

- **Prak Shastri (Intermediate)**
- **Shastri (B.A.)**
- **Acharya (M.A.)**
- **Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.)** : The campus is also committed to offer research programmes for the award of Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) degree of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. At present three research students are enrolled in the campus for their Ph.D. works.

Future Courses

- **Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.)** : Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) course is to be started here in next academic years which is specifically meant for the training of Sanskrit teachers.
- **Distance Education** : The campus will run above mentioned all the courses through Distance Education of the Mukta-svadhyaapeetha of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.

Non-formal Sanskrit Teaching Courses

- **Sanskrit Spoken Course** : The campus has also undertaken a non informal course of Spoken Sanskrit to enable the students to speak Sanskrit fluently. Last year from 3rd May to 15th May 2017, the campus has arranged a residential camp for teaching the students through the *prathama diksha* and *dvitiya diksha* i.e. the self learning Sanskrit study materials of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan.
- **Certificate Course** : The campus is planning to run some Certificate Courses on Jyotisha, Vastu and Yoga in forthcoming years.

Extra Curricular Activities /


Dr. Nandkishor Raghunath Pattarkine

5.6 16th Inter-Campus Sanskrit Natya Mahotsava




SCHEDULE 23 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and generally on the accrual method of accounting.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION

- 2.1. Fees from students (except Tution Fees), Sale of Admission forma, Royalty and Interest on Saving Bank account are accounted on cash basis.
2.2. Income from Investments are accounted on accrual basis.

3. FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

3.1. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition, installation and commissioning.

3.2. Gifted/Donated assets are valued at the declared value where available; if not available, the value is estimated based on the present market value adjusted with reference to the physical condition of the asset. They are set up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the Institution. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets.

3.3. Books received as gifts, are valued at selling prices printed on the books. Where they are not printed, the value is based on assessment.

3.4. Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Straight line method, at the following rates:

3.5 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.

3.6 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Re.I in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.

3.7 Assets created out of Earmarked Funds and funds of Sponsored Projects, where the ownership of such assets vests in the University, are setup by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the University. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets. Assets created out of Sponsored Project funds, where the ownership is retained by the sponsors but held and used by the University are separately disclosed in the Notes on Accounts.

3.8 Leasehold Land is amortized over period of lease.

4. Intangible Assets: Patents and copy rights, E Journals and Computer Software are grouped under Intangible Assets.

5. STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of office and computer stationary stock is accounted as revenue expenditure. However, being a pioneer/nodal institution for the propagation and development of Sanskrit stock of Sansthan publication/books are treated as current assets. (refer Schedule-7)

6. RETIRMENT BENEFITS

6.1 Retirement benefits are treated as per GOI Rules. Its includes Pension, Gratuity, Leave & Cashment and Provident Fund. This year we have got calculated the provision for gratuity, leave in cashment and pension through actuarial valuer. The total value of provision for 2018-19 is Rs.4,11,93,98,935/-.

6.2 A fixed medical allowanc of Rs.1000/- p.m. is being paid by Govt. of India OM dated 19.07.2017.

6.3 For Provident Fund of employees of Sansthan a separate set of accounts - Receipt & Payment, Income & Expenditure and Balance Sheet are prepared and is attached with these accounts.

6.4 For pension also an earmarked fund has been created in which Govt. Grant and expenditure is accounted in Schedule-2.

6.5 170 employees are covered under New Pension Scheme.

7. INVESTMENTS

Investment is in the form of Fixed Deposit in the bank. There is no diminution in its value.

8. Earmarked / Endowment Funds

8.1 Sansthan is having one earmarked fund for Pension and five endowment funds in the name of Jindal Trust, Dubey Award, Somaiya Trust, Shukla Trust, RK Sharma and R. Devanathan. All these dedicated funds have been depicted in Schedule-2

8.2 Expenditure on the special funds is deducted from these funds only and not taken to the Income & Expenditure account.

9. Government and UGC Grants

9.1 Sansthan is functioning on the basis of grant received from Ministry of HRD which is being accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to the financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as recoverable from the Grantor.

9.2 Grant utilized for fixed assets has been shown as Capital expenditure and remaining as revenue. (refer Schedule-10)

9.3 Unutilized grants as carried forward as unspent (refer Schedule-10) and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet. (refer Schedule-3)

10. INVESTMENT OF EARMARKED FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCURED ON SUCH INVESTMENT:

10.1 These earmarked funds are invested in fixed deposit in Banks.

10.2 Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the University. (refer Schedule-2)

11. SPONSORED PROJECTS

Sansthan is having one project of UGC - SRF/JRF (Senior/Junior Research Fellow) funded by UGC.

12. INCOME TAX

12.1 Sansthan is a Deemed University and fully finance through Govt. grant. The income of the University is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts. No TDS is deducted by the bank on investment in Terms Deposits.

Draft Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan for the year ended 31 March 2019

1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as at 31 March 2019, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act. The audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2022-23. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Sansthan's Management. The financial statements include the accounts of 12 Campus of the Sansthan and Headquarter. Out of these, accounts of six units were audited and considered for the report. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
 2. The draft Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, subject to the observation in the report, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format, subject to the observation in the report, prescribed by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India vide order No. 29-4/2012-FD dated 17 April 2015.
 - iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv) We further report that:**
- A. Balance sheet**
- A.1 Liabilities**
- A.1.1 Current Liabilities and Provisions (Schedule-3) - Rs. 11.15 crore**
- (i)** As per Significant Accounting Policies & Notes to Accounts No.6 the liabilities for retirement benefits on the basis of actuarial valuation as on 31/3/2019 is Rs. 411.94 crore but provisions for same has not been made in the accounts which is contravention of Accounting Standard 15 and Format of Accounts prescribed by Ministry of Human Resource Development. This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions and overstatement of Capital Fund by Rs. 411.94 crore.

(ii) The above does not include the security deposits of students amounting to Rs. 3.70 lakh in respect of Ved Vyas Campus Garli. This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions and understatement of Current Assets- bank balance by Rs. 3.70 lakh.

A.2 Assets

A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule-4) - Rs. 311.69 crore

(i) The above includes capital work-in-progress of Rs. 17.40 crore in respect of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Eklavya Campus, Agartala whereas the Campus has transferred Rs. 31.51 crore to CPWD for the construction of New campus at Lembucherra Tripura. This has resulted in understatement of Work-in-Progress and Capital Fund by Rs. 14.11 crore.

(ii) The above includes work-in-progress of Rs. 15.29 crore in respect of Jaipur Campus out of which for an amount of Rs. 11.84 crore the works have not started and should have been shown Loans, Advances & Deposits. This resulted in understatement of Loans, Advances & Deposits and overstatement of work in progress by Rs. 11.84 crore

Further the work-in-progress includes amount of Rs. 38.59 lakh for which the work has been completed and being revenue nature work should have been shown under Revenue Expenditure. This has resulted in overstatement of Fixed Assets - work-in-progress and understatement of Repair & Maintenance expenses by Rs. 38.59 lakh.

(iii) The above includes work-in-progress of Rs. 15.30 crore in respect of Jaipur Campus out of which works valuing Rs. 1.11 crore have been completed during 2018-19. This has resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets by Rs. 109.15 lakh, understatement of depreciation by Rs. 2.23 lakh and overstatement of work in progress by Rs. 111.38 lakh.

(iv) The above includes an amount of Rs. 8.06 crore under Building (Construction of Shikshaya Soudha Building Rs. 3.72 crore added in 2017-18 and Rs. 4.34 crore added in 2018-19) in respect of Puri campus whereas the work is still under progress. This has resulted in overstatement of Fixed Assets- Building by Rs. 7.83 crore, overstatement of Depreciation by Rs. 23.44 lakh and understatement of work-in-progress by Rs. 8.06 crore.

(v) As per Form 65 of CPWD for the month of March 2019, the Ved Vyas Campus Garli of RSS deposited funds amounting to Rs. 24.60 crore with CPWD for various construction works, out of which building worth Rs.11.00 crore has been capitalized during 2016-17. Out of remaining funds of Rs. 13.60 crore the CPWD has shown unspent deposit with them amounting to Rs. 8.94 crore. By deducting the unspent amount from the balance of Rs.13.60 crore the amount of capital work in progress works out to Rs. 4.66 crore as on 31.3.2019 against which work in progress of Rs. 12.44 crore has been shown in the accounts by Garli Campus of RSS. This has resulted in understatement of Loans & Advances by Rs. 8.94 crore and overstatement of work in progress by Rs. 7.77 crore.

Further the figures of total funds deposited with CPWD by the RSS, are required to be reconciled with CPWD.

(vi) Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (RSKS), Ved Vyas Campus, Garli has 88 computers, 19 printers, 2 laptops, 2 servers in their stock which valued to Rs. 28,46,779 but out of these computer items, only below detailed items have been incorporated in annual accounts

A.2.2. Investment from Earmarked/Endowment Funds (Schedule 5) - Rs. 9.36 lakh

The above includes security deposits with BSES & DAVPS of Rs. 2.27 lakh resulting in overstatement of Investment from Earmarked/Endowment Funds and understatement of Loans Advances & Deposits by Rs. 2.27 lakh.

A.2.3 Investment –Others (Schedule 6) – Rs. 20.62 crore

The above represents investment in FDRs but as per the details and the physical certificates of FDRs made available to the audit for verification the amount is Rs. 17.00 crore. This has resulted in overstatement of investment by Rs. 3.62 crore.

A.2.4 Current Assets (Schedule 7) – Rs. 15.62 crore

Bank Balances -14.20 crore

- (i) RSS has 12 Campuses at various locations. The grants released to these campuses for various projects are shown as expenditure in the accounts of RSS due to which the balances remaining with the campuses in these project accounts as on the last day of financial year is not being reflected in the accounts. Audit observed the following in respect of the project bank accounts of these campuses :-
 - (a) The bank balance of Rs. 41,326 of the project account of one campus (Jaipur campus) has been included in the accounts.
 - (b) The bank balances of project accounts of six campuses amounting to Rs. 94 lakh (Eklavaya campus Agartala: Rs. 27.06 lakh, Allahabad campus: Rs. 12.37 lakh, Puri campus: Rs. 0.67 lakh, Sringeri campus: Rs. 20.12 lakh, Jammu Campus: Rs. 22.50 lakh and Mumbai Campus: Rs. 11.28 lakh) have not been included in the accounts resulting in understatement of Current Assets- Bank Balances and Current Liabilities and Provisions by Rs. 94 lakh.
 - (c) No clarity is available in the accounts in respect of the remaining five campuses (Devprayag, Lucknow, Garli, Guruvayoor and Bhopal). The details in respect of these five campuses may be furnished.
- (ii) Audit observed the following in respect of the Student Funds bank accounts of the 12 campuses of RSS:-
 - (a) The bank balances of the Student Fund of the eight campuses amounting to Rs. 213.58 lakh (Devprayag: Rs. 3.86 lakh, Mumbai: Rs. 13.46 lakh , Lucknow : Rs. 55.11 lakh, Jaipur : Rs. 33.35 lakh, Guruvayoor : Rs. 0.02 lakh, Bhopal : Rs . 69.27 lakh, Eklavya : Rs. 21.69 lakh, Sringeri: Rs. 16.82 lakh) have been included in the accounts.
 - (b) The bank balances of Student Funds of three campuses amounting to Rs. 29.24 lakh (Garli Campus: Rs. 12.02 lakh, Puri campus: Rs. 3.24 lakh and Jammu campus: Rs. 13.98 lakh) have not been included in the accounts resulting in understatement of Current Assets- Bank Balances and Current Liabilities and Provisions by Rs. 29.24 lakh.
 - (c) No clarity is available in the accounts in respect of the Allahabad campus.
- (iii) The above does not include the bank balance of Rs. 2.50 crore in the Central Bank of India Account No. 3464848394 in respect of Vedvyas Campus, Garli. Out of this amount of Rs. 2.23 crore was shown under the head building in 2016-17 and the interest income of Rs. 27 lakh has not been taken into accounts resulting in understatement of Current Assets-Bank Balances by Rs. 2.50 crore and overstatement of Fixed Assets Building by Rs. 2.14 crore, overstatement of depreciation by Rs. 8.83 lakh and understatement of Capital Fund by Rs. 27 lakh.
- (iv) In the accounts bank balances of Rs. 1988.42 lakh (inclusive of bank balances of GPF and NPS) has been shown whereas as per the information of bank accounts furnished to audit the amount is Rs. 1989. 15 lakh resulting in understatement of Current Assets-bank balances by Rs. 0.73 lakh.

B. Income and Expenditure Account

B.1 Income

B.1.1 Grants/Subsidies (Schedule 10) – Rs. 164.88 crore

The above schedule has not been correctly drawn. The opening balance of the grant-in-aid as on 1 April 2018 has been shown as Rs. 1.60 crore whereas the opening balance of grant-in-aid as on 1 April 2018 is Rs. 9.82 crore. This has resulted in understatement of income by Rs. 8.22 crore with consequent overstatement of deficit by Rs. 6.99 crore and understatement of Surplus by Rs.1.23 crore.

B.1.2 Interest Earned (Schedule 12) Rs. 76.60 lakh

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (RSKS), Ekalavya Campus, Agartala received interest income of Rs. 69.19 lakh from four saving bank accounts but in the Annual Accounts only Rs. 0.76 lakh has been taken. This has resulted in understatement of interest income by Rs. 68.43 lakh.

B.1.3 Prior Period Income (Schedule 14) - Rs. 5.36 lakh

Scrutiny of Bank Reconciliation Statements (BRS) of Bhopal Campus Bank account No. 10107770497 revealed that interest of earlier years amounting to of Rs. 2.77 lakh has not been taken into account resulting in understatement of Prior Period Income and Current Assets-Bank Balances by Rs. 2.77 lakh.

B.2 Expenditure

B.2.1 Staff Payments & Benefits (Establishment Expenses) (Schedule 15) -Rs. 91.30 crore

The above includes Rs. 25.51 lakh being staffs pay and allowances for the month of March 2018 (Eklavya Campus Agartala) which should have been accounted under Prior Period Expenses. This has resulted in overstatement of Staff Payments & Benefits (Establishment Expenses) and understatement of Prior Period Expenses by Rs. 25.51 lakh.

B.2.2 Depreciation (Schedule 4) - Rs. 2.96 crore

The above includes amortization of Patent of Rs. 2.48 lakh whereas the correct amount of amortization works out to Rs. 0.80 lakh. This has resulted in overstatement of depreciation by Rs. 1.68 lakh with consequent understatement of Fixed Assets and Capital Fund by Rs. 1.68 lakh.

C. Balance Sheet of GPF Account

C.1 Liabilities

C.1.1 Provident Fund Members Contribution– Rs. 41.59 crore

- (i) The above includes the subscription received during the year of Rs. 12.75 lakh in respect of Jammu Campus whereas as per the Broadsheet the GPF Subscription and the Refund of Advances is Rs. 47.80 lakh. This has resulted in understatement of Liabilities of GPF by Rs.35.05 lakh.
- (ii) The above includes the interest due on Employees GPF Fund during the year of Rs. 45.48 lakh in respect of Puri Campus whereas as per the Broadsheet the amount is Rs. 45.78 lakh. This has resulted understatement of Liabilities of GPF by Rs.30,000.

C.2 Assets

C.2.1 Cash & Bank Balances – Rs. 5.59 crore

The above include Bank Balance of Rs. 89.03 lakh in respect of Jammu Campus whereas in the Receipts & Payment Accounts the same has been shown as Rs. 89.21 lakh. The difference of Rs. 18,500 needs to be reconciled and clarified.

C.2.2 Current Assets, Loans & Advances – Rs. 1crore

In the GPF accounts of Jammu campus the opening balance of GPF advances has been shown as Nil and advances of Rs. 7.76 lakh has been given during the year. Against the total advances of Rs. 7.76 lakh the recovery of advances during the year has been shown as Rs. 8.85 lakh resulting in minus balance of GPF advances of Rs. 1.09 lakh. This may be clarified.

D. Balance Sheet of NPS

D.1 Assets

D.1.1 Current Assets - Rs. 28.82 lakh

The above represents investment in FDRs but as per the details and the physical certificates of FDRs made available to the audit for verification the amount is Rs. 30.42 lakh. This has resulted in understatement of investment by Rs.1.60 lakh.

E. General

- E.1** NSDL account in respect of some employees coming under NPS has not been created at Gurvayoor Campus and Sringeri Campus of RSS. These campuses are purchasing fixed deposit receipts in respect of these employees. The PRAN account in respect of these employees should be created at the earliest and the practice of creating FDRs stopped under intimation to audit.
- E.2** Loans, Advances & Deposits includes minus balances of Festival advance as on 31.3.2019 of Rs. 6.74 lakh. The reasons for these minus balances were not explained to audit.
- E.3** Loans, Advances & Deposits includes an amount of Rs. 13,549 under other receivable. This amount pertains to Jammu campus for the year 2005-06 and had been adjusted in 2012-13. This has resulted on overstatement of Loans, Advances & Deposits.
- E.4** Current Liabilities & Provisions includes minus balances of Rs. 8.37 lakh (GPF (Rs. 11,724), LIC (Rs. 50,767), NPS (Rs.7,69,745) & Professional tax (Rs. 5,175)). The reasons for these minus balances were not explained to audit.
- E.5** Designated/Earmarked/Endowment Funds includes the closing balance of Pension Fund of Rs. 2.27 crore in respect of which the following may be clarified:-
- (i)** The opening balance of the Pension Fund is Rs. 1.59 crore whereas the interest income on this Fund has been shown as Rs. 68.55 lakh(@ 43%).
- (ii)** The reasons for creation of this fund when there is no specific assets (investments/bank balances) of this Fund.
- E.6** Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (RSKS), Ekalavya Campus, Agartala did not maintain some important registers/records like Expenditure Control Register, Cheque issue Register, Cheque Received Register, Advance Register & TR-5/Money Receipt Register.
- E.7** Mumbai campus of RSS has not maintained Register of Assets (ii) Expenditure Control Register, (iii) Register of Contracts, and (iv) Grants-in-aid Register in the prescribed format.
- E.8** Mumbai campus of RSS did not prepare Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Accounts of GPF and also did not maintain separate accounts of CPF and NPS which is contravention of Format of Accounts prescribed by MHRD.

F. Grants-in-aid

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan received Grants-in-aid of Rs. 214.38 crore (Capital: Rs. 49.50 crore and Revenue: Rs. 164.88 crore) during the year 2018-19 and had an opening balance of Grants-in-aid of Rs. 9.82 crore (Capital: Rs. 1.60 crore and Revenue: Rs. 8.22 crore). The grant-in-aid of Rs. 224.20 crore was fully utilised leaving nil balance as on 31 March 2019.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the comment No. **A.2.4** and **B.1.1** and other significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- a. in so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as at 31 March 2019; and
- b. and in so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

1. Adequacy of Internal audit system

- There is no internal audit system and the post of Accounts Officer (Internal Audit) is vacant.
- The internal audit is also not being conducted by the Ministry.
- There is no internal audit manual.

2. Adequacy of Internal Control System

- The internal control system of RSS Hqrs. is inadequate due to following reasons:
 - (i) The post of Accounts Officer is vacant since February 2015.
 - (ii) Irregular internal audit and non-maintenance of internal audit manual.
 - (iii) 27 external audit objections for the period 2002-17 of RSS Hqrs. were outstanding as on 31/3/19.
 - (iv) Non maintenance of important registers by the units of RSS (Ekalavya Campus, Agartala and Mumbai Campus).
 - (v) Project Bank accounts have been kept out of the books of accounts.

3. System of physical verification of assets

- The physical verification of Fixed Assets of RSS Hqrs. has been conducted upto 2017-18.
- Physical verification of Library books of RSS Hqrs has not been done since 2015. Also missing books of 1782 Nos worth Rs.1.82 lakh has not been written off till date.
- The physical verification of fixed assets of the campuses of RSS is not being done regularly (Jaipur Campus, Eklavya Campus as Fixed Asset register not maintained).

4. System of physical verification of inventory

- The physical verification of inventories of RSS Hqrs such as stationery and consumables has not been done for the year 2018-19.
- The physical verification of inventories of the campuses of RSS was not produced to audit.

5. Regularity in payment of dues

- As per accounts, no payment over six month in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2019.

Assurance Memo

1. The RSS has drawn its accounts in the uniform format of accounts prescribed by MHRD in case of educational institutions.
2. The accounts contain the necessary approval of the competent authority.
3. The accounts comply with the relevant Accounting Standards issued by ICAI and cases on non-compliance have been commented in the SAR, if any.
4. The audit has been conducted as per the checklist mentioned in the appendix 8.6 of the Manual of Instruction for Audit of Autonomous Bodies and extant instructions/circulars issued by Headquarters.
5. The information/documents submitted with the draft SAR to Headquarters is complete as per 10.06 of Manual of Instructions for Audit of Autonomous Bodies.

In the Schedule 4 of Fixed Asset work in progress as on 31.3.2019 (addition) was shown of Rs. 623239568 but Consolidated Schedule of Receipt & Payment Account was shown of Rs. 501547102 in this regard the difference of Rs. 121692466 may be reconcile and intimation to audit. This has resulted overstated of fixed asset of Rs.121692466/-.

A.2.2 Current Assets

The figures shown in Current assets at headquarter of RSS in annual accounts the following discrepancy found in the annual accounts. The difference between annual accounts and stock register as on 31.3.2019.

The above discrepancy has resulted in overstatement of Current Assets by Rs. 373871/-.

C.8 Difference between Opening and Closing balance of Grant (Schedule-10)

RSS reply that total of Rs.94276215/- was transfer to the campuses during the earlier years i.e. 2015-16 and 2016-17. All the money could not spent during particular financial year and kept with them as an unspent balance. All campuses incurred unspent balances of Rs. 94276215 in 2017-18. Further amount of 8653868/- which was an internal generated fund was added with Revenue expenses from govt. Grant. This means total of Rs.94276215+8653868=102930083 which was Opening Balance of 2018-19.

C.9 In Balance Sheet of GPF account Interest Reserve has been shown separately as required in approved MHRD Format but the RSS does not tallies all the figures of Interest Reserve. In the absence of details of Interest Reserve we could not be quantified in audit.

C.10 Mismatch in Opening balances of account (GPF) received from Campuses viz. Bhopal, Devprayag & Puri. As well as contribution made during the year vary in Jammu Campus & Interest due on Employee in Puri Campus.

C.5 An amount of Rs.59122/- was shown as suspense A/c cash and Rs.723000/- as Suspense A/c. Financial irregularity was found in Mumbai campus during 2008-09. The cashier of Mumbai campus deposited the amount of Rs.1Lakh through Demand draft dated 3.6.2009 to the HQ. Office, New Delhi.

C.1 Scrutiny of Bank Reconciliation Statements (BRS) of RSS Hqrs. account no. 10469781338 revealed that an amount of Rs. 4.14 lakh has not been cleared upto 31.03.19 as details given below:

Cheques deposited but not credited in the account needs to be pursued with the bank to get credit of these amounts.

Rs. 176.17 crore

In the Schedule 4 of Fixed Assets as on 31.03.2019 (addition) was shown of Rs. 8210548 (excluding Gifted books of Rs. 580) but consolidated schedule of Receipt & Payment Account was shown of Rs. 9412911 in this regard the difference of Rs. 1202363 due to incorporation of publication in capital expenditure. This has resulted overstatement of capital expenditure and understatement revenue expenditure.
