

### 1. AN OVERVIEW

#### 1.1. The Institution

Formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, was established by the Govt. of India in the year 1970 as per the recommendations of Sanskrit Commission 1956. Its main aim & objective was to promote, propagate and preserve Sanskrit learning, teaching and research throughout the country. It was fully funded by the Ministry of HRD (now Ministry of Education), Govt. of India.

Considering its contribution in the field of promotion and propagation of traditional Sanskrit education, the Government of India accorded it the status of Deemed to be University w.e.f. 7th May, 2002. The erstwhile Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University) has now been promulgated as Central Sanskrit University, Delhi (CSU) under the Central Sanskrit Universities Act, 2020 (No.5 of 2020) passed by the Parliament and assented to by His Excellency, the President of India and started functioning as the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi since 30th April, 2020. With its Headquarters at New Delhi, it has twelve campuses spread across the country. In addition to these constituent campuses, it has granted affiliation to 58 Sanskrit institutions established in different regions of the Country.

Besides, it also working as the nodal agency of Govt. of India for overall promotion of Sanskrit language and was entrusted with implementation of following Central Schemes for development of Sanskrit education:-

- 1. Presidential Awards for Certificate of Honour and Maharishi Badarayan Vyas Samman to the Scholars in Sanskrit, Pali, Prakrit, Arabic, Persian, Classical Kannada, Classical Telugu, Classical Malayalam and Classical Odiya languages.
- 2. Scheme for Financial Assistance to the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya/Adarsh Shodha Sansthan.
- 3. Financial Assistance to Voluntary Sanskrit Organizations.
- 4. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching.
- 5. Pali-Prakrit Scheme

- 6. Financial Assistance to NGOs/Deemed Sanskrit Universities / CBSE/NCERT/ SCERT for various Research Projects and Programmes/ Activities for promotion of Sanskrit.
- 7. Financial Assistance for Publication/Re-print of rare books and Bulk Purchase of Books.
- 8. Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organisations to conduct "Vocational Training Courses" to the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions.
- 9. Financial Assistance for award of Scholarship to students of Sanskrit Pathashalas/Mahavidyalayas/Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges/Universities under the scheme for Development of Sanskrit Education.
- 10. All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest (Akhil Bhartiya Shastriya Spardha).
- 11. Financial Assistance for Utilization of services of retired/eminent literary Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).
- 12. Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.
- 13. Sanskrit Dictionary Project, Deccan College, Pune.
- 14. Financial Assistance under Ashtaadashi (18 Projects for sustaining growth of Sanskrit).

Under these schemes, financial assistance is provided to institutions/organizations/scholars engaged in propagation and development of Sanskrit throughout the country.

#### 1.2 Role and functions

The major objectives of the Central Sanskrit University as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and in pursuance thereof -

1. To Provide for higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels fully

conforming to the concept of university, namely University Education Report (1948) and the Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).

- 2. To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management, etc. routinely offered by conventional institutions.
- 3. To provide for high quality teaching and research and for the advancement of knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken in-house by substantial number of full time faculty/research scholars (Ph.D and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines.
- 4. To enable creation of University under the 'de novo' category devoted to unique in emerging areas of knowledge, not being pursued by conventional or existing institutions particularly in specific areas of study and research preferably sponsored by the Government of a State/UT or the Central Government regarded as important for strategic needs of the country or for the preservation of our cultural heritage, so determined by a well laid-out process of wide consultation with the eminent peers of academic community.
- 5. To undertake, aid, promote, coordinate research in all branches of Sanskrit learning including teachers' training and manuscriptology, to bring out linkage with the outcome of modern research in the contextually relevant fields and to bring out publications.
- 6. To act as nodal agency for the Government of India to implement its policies and programmes for the development of Sanskrit.
- 7. To provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as it may deem fit.
- 8. To provide for research and for the

- advancement of/and dissemination of knowledge.
- 9. To undertake extra mural studies, extension programmes and field outreach activities to contribute to the development of society.
- 10. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the objectives of the University.

### 1.3 Programmes and Activities

Realising its objectives, the University has undertaken the following major programmes and activities:-

- Establishment of Campuses in different States of India.
- Conducting teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary/Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Research at Doctorate levels.
- Conducting teachers training at graduate level i.e. Shiksha-Shastri (B. Ed.) and Post graduate level i.e. Shiksha-Acharya (M.Ed.).
- Conducting and Coordinating research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit.
- Cooperating with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.
- Establishment of Sanskrit libraries, manuscripts' collection centres and also editing and publishing rare manuscripts and books of importance.
- Conferment of degrees and granting of diplomas/certificates to persons having satisfactorily completed the approved prescribed courses of study/research and passed prescribed examinations.
- Instituting and awarding visitorship, fellowship, scholarships, stipends, prizes and medals.
- Conducting distance education programmes.
- Implementation of schemes of the Ministry of Education for the promotion of Sanskrit.

#### 1.4 Teaching

Teaching is conducted from Prak-Shastri to Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the University in its 12 Campuses. The affiliated institutions carry out teaching from Prathama to Acharya.

Sanskrit institutions managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the University also impart teaching with the same syllabus.

#### 1.5 Teachers' Training

In the Campuses, teacher's training course of one academic year with emphasis on teaching practice, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha-Shastri Degree which is equivalent to B.Ed.. In addition, Shiksha-Acharya Degree course equivalent to M.Ed. is conducted in Jaipur and Bhopal Campuses.

#### 1.6 Research

In all the Campuses of the University, students are enrolled for carrying out research leading to the award of degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D..

However, Ganga Nath Jha Campus, Prayagraj is exclusively dedicated to research activities in selected branches of Sanskrit. The Library of the Campus is one of the richest Sanskrit Libraries in the country. A collection of over 57,957 rare manuscripts are also preserved in the library.

#### 1.7 Publications

#### Research Journals and Books

The Central Sanskrit University has been publishing two research journals containing research based articles, namely 'Sanskrit Vimarsha' and Journal of the Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj. While the first journal is brought out by the University's Headquarters Office, the other is published by Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj. In addition, the Campuses also publish annual literary magazines. The campuses also upgraded the annual magazines published by them as research journals.

The University as well as the Campuses have brought out scholarly works, rare manuscripts and original texts. The University has published 688 books so far. Sanskrit Varta - a quarterly news bulletin in Sanskrit is also being published regularly.

#### 1.8 Rajbhasha Prabhat

The Ministry has been successfully running a programme called official language for the promotion and dissemination of Hindi language in the Central Government offices. In this sequence, a sufficient number of official work and various programmes are being conducted by university throught Hindi. Apart from other activities, report of the work being done in Hindi is sent to the Ministry every three months.

### 2. AUTHORITIES & STRUCTURE

- 2.1 Smt. Droupadi Murmu, Hon'ble President of India is the Visitor of the Central Sanskrit University. Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Hon'ble Minister, Ministry of Education, Government of India held the position of the Chancellor of the University. The Vice-Chancellor is the principal academic & executive officer and the ex-officio Chairperson of all statutary bodies of the University. The Vice-Chancellor exercises general supervision and control over the affairs of the University, executes policies and programmes and implements the decisions of all its authorities. Prof. Shrinivasa Varakhedi was the Vice Chancellor of Central Sanskrit University during 01.04.2022 to 31.03.2023. The following are the authorities of the University:
- 1. **Court** Constitution of the court and powers of the court shall be as prescribed by the clause 20 of the Central Sanskrit University Act. 2020.
- **2. Executive Council** It is the principal body to the manage the University. It is empowered to take policy decisions and to ensure implementation of the decisions.
- 3. Academic Council It is the principal

- academic body, responsible for the maintenance of standards of education, teaching, training, examinations and research programme.
- 4. Finance Committee It is the apex finance body responsible for placing annual accounts and financial estimates before the Board of Management, fixing limits of total expenditure and recommending creation of all types of posts.
- **5. Planning and Monitoring Board** It is the principal planning body responsible for monitoring of development programmes of the University.

Apart from the above, the University has also other consituted bodies namely Grant-in-Aid Committee, Publication Committee, Scholarship Selection Committee, Research Board and Examination Board for making recommendations to their respective nature of functions.



Concerted efforts were made during the year to get the audit objections settled. For this purpose, the individual campuses were directed to take necessary corrective measures and replies of compliance were sent to the audit authorities with the result that a number of audit objections were settled during the year.

### 4.1.3 ACADEMIC SECTION

The important responsibilities of the section are:

- \* Streamilining the academic activites of the University.
- \* Preparation of courses from Prathma to Acharya.
- \* Board of Studies (BOS) of different subjects to prepare curriculum for classes from Prathma to Acharya.
- \* To coordinate convening of Academic Council Meeting and Meeting of Board of Studies and

- take follow up action and follow up action.
- \* During the last year, three meetings of the Acadmic Council were held in the Academic Section. (08 May, 2022, 26 May, 2022 & 03 November, 2022)
- \* The Academic Section has also been entrusted the responsibility of grant of affiliation to Sanskrit institutions. Affiliation is being given to Schools in the academic year on the basis of the recommendation of the acadmic council and executive council.

### **MOOCs Project**

Mooc's training workshop was held at Eklavya Campus, Agartala (Tripura) from 22-28 March, 2018 to develop lesson on MOOC Platform by teaching staff of all departments from various campuses.

## E-learning (MoU with Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT, Bombay)

In April 2023, CSU signed an MoU with the Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay, with an aim to enhance the skills of CSU students and faculty through ICT/digital methods. Currently, more than 1100 students and faculty are enrolled in various courses on the STP portal. To ensure efficient management of this project, CSU has appointed STP coordinator at each campus and conducted multiple online meetings/workshops for STP coordinators to achieve better results.

## > 3-Days National MOOCs Workshop at Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu.

From August 17 to 19, 2023, Central Sanskrit University organized a successful 3-days workshop on MOOCs at Shri Ranbir Campus in Jammu. Many experts attended this workshop and gained the latest knowledge of SWAYAM MOOCs.

### First Online Sanskrit Olympiad

CSU has successfully organized the First Online Sanskrit Olympiad on September 14 and 17, 2023, with the aim of promoting the Sanskrit language. More than 25,000 students participated in this event. This event encouraged students to learn Sanskrit in a gamified way.

### Over 2000 Users on CSU LMS

In 2023, CSU LMS achieved the goal of having more than 2000 users on CSU LMS. This will encourage our dedication to providing quality education and learning resources for our students and teachers.

### Developing More Courses/Ongoing Course Development

More than 80 new courses are in the development phase on CSU LMS. These courses will improve the learning experience and meet the changing needs of our students.

### **Regular Meetings for SWAYAM-MOOCs**

CSU MOOCs & LMs is conducting regular meetings to review and improve the quality of SWAYAM-MOOCs. These online/offline meetings help the MOOCs coordinators stay up to date with the latest knowledge of LMS.

### Regular Meetings for LMS

CSU LMS is conducting regular meetings to review and improve the performance of CSU LMS. These online/offline meetings help the LMS coordinators stay up to date with the latest knowledge of LMS.

### > Participation in "Bharatiya Bhasha Summit"

CSU MOOCs and LMS section actively participated in the "Bharatiya Bhasha Summit" and helped make it a successful event. This will help in preserving India's languages and culture.

### > Creating MOOCs Studios at CSU Campuses

CSU MOOCs section is working to set up MOOCs studios at all CSU campuses. This will help us make and deliver high-quality learning content for SWAYAM- MOOCs and CSU LMS.

- (b) Financial Assistance for teachers for Modern Subjects in Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/ Mahavidyalayas.
- (c) Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools belonging to State Government Schools.
- (d) Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers under Chatuspathi.

#### Scheme-II

Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in Indigent Circumstances.

#### Scheme-III

Financial Assistance for Programmes/Activities for Promotion of Sanskrit.

#### Scheme-IV

Financial Assistance for Utilization of Services of Eminent or/and Retired Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).

#### Scheme-V

Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organisations to Conduct "Vocational Training Courses" to the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions.

#### Scheme-VI

Financial Assistance for Publication, Bulk Purchase and Re-print of Rare Sanskrit Books.

#### **Scheme-VII**

Award of Merit Scholarships to the students studying Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit languages.

#### Scheme-VIII

Ashtaadashi - Eighteen Projects for sustaining the growth of Sanskrit.

#### Scheme-IX

All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest (Akhil Bhartiya Shastra Spardha).

#### 1. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching.

#### Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers to the Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas.

Under this scheme, selected organizations are being sanctioned financial assistance in the form of remuneration to Sanskrit teachers @ Rs.8,000/-permonth and @ Rs. 20,000/- per month from 01.10.2022 for 12 months in a year, for Part-time Teachers/Computer Teacher @ Rs. 4,500/- per month and @ Rs. 10,000/-per month from 01.010.2022 and for 12 months in a year. In case of Residential Scholarship to students @ Rs. 300/- per month and @Rs. 600/- per month from 01.10.2022 for 10 Months.

An amount of Rs. 1258.37 lakh was issued under this scheme by the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi during the financial year 2022-23. Financial assistance was provided to 677 Sanskrit teachers who are working in 301 Sanskrit Pathshalas/Sanskrit Mahavidyalayasand 2543 residential students. (Annexure-I)

# b) Financial Assistance for Teachers for Modern Subjectin Traditional Sanskrit Pathasalas/ Mahavidyalayas.

Under this scheme the financial assistance is being provided to Modern Subject Teachers who are working in Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Mahavidyalaya's with remuneration of @ Rs.8000/per month and @ Rs. 20,000/- per month from 01.10.2022 and for Part-time Teacher @ Rs. 4500/per month and @ Rs. 10,000/- per month from 01.10.2022 for 12 months in a year.

Under this scheme Central Sanskrit University, Delhi has released financial assistance of Rs. 464.00 Lakh in the financial year 2022-23 to 282 teachers working at 197 Institutions. (Annexure- J)

# c) Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools belonging to State Government Schools.

Under thescheme financial assistance is being provided to one Sanskrit teacher @ Rs. 8,000/- per month and @ Rs. 20,000/- per month for 12 months engaged in Govt. and Govt. Aided High/Higher Secondary Schools where the State Government is not able to provide Sanskrit Teaching facilities to do so.

Under this Scheme, during the financial year 2022-23 a total number of 35 Sanskrit teachers working at Government Schools were the beneficiaries and an amount of Rs. 50.40 lakh was utilized. (Annexure-K)

### d) Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers under Chatuspathi.

Under this scheme financial assistance is being provided to Sanskrit Teachers who are working in Chatuspathi Institutions with remuneration of @ Rs. 2,000/- per month and @ Rs. 5,000/- per month from 01.10.2022 and for 12 months. Under this Scheme, during the financial year 2022-23 a total number of 138 Sanskrit teachers working at 135 Chatuspathi Institutions were the beneficiaries and an amount of Rs. 57.96 lakh was utilized. (Annexure-L)

II Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.

Under the scheme the financial assistance is provided in the form of Samman Rashi to the Eminent Sanskrit Scholars above the age of 65 years. Who have dedicated their lives to Sanskrit but have no settled source of income. The selected scholars will be given @ Rs. 60,000/- per annum, without deduction of income from other sources. Total 184 numbers of pandits are being benefitted through this scheme. An amount of Rs. 88.32 lakh released under this scheme by the University.

#### III Financial Assistance for Programmes/ Activities for Promotion of Sanskrit.

Under this scheme, Central Sanskrit University, Delhi meets cent-percent approved expenditure on different programmes for the development and propagation of Sanskrit undertaken by NGO's/Sanskrit Universities/Universities Institutions. During the year 2022-23 the University incurred an expenditure of Rs. 22.88 lakh for various activities. A total number of 26 Institutions/Universitites/NGO's were the beneficiaries.

# IV Financial Assistance for Utilization of services of Eminent or/and Retired Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).

Under this Scheme, the services of Eminent or/ and Retired Sanskrit Scholars are being utilised in Traditional Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Universities and voluntary organizations. The main objective of the scheme is to preserve the in-depth studies of different Shastras at the various centers where Sanskrit education is imparted to the Sanskrit students with traditional system. As per the Scheme, the traditional scholars are appointed in different organizations. The scholars are being paid @ Rs. 10,000/-per month and from 01.10.2022 @ Rs. 20,000/- per month for a period of two years. The appointment can be extended for another one year on the recommendation of the Grants in Aid Committee.

In addition to the existing 13 engaged scholars, 40 scholars have been selected for the financial year 2022-23. A sum of Rs. 18.98 lakh issued under the scheme in the year 2022-23.

# V Financial Assistance to registered Academic Organisations to conduct "Vocational Training Courses" to the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions.

Under this scheme, selected organizations are issued financial assistance @ Rs. 1,00,000/-eachprogramme to organise the workshop and to

conduct Fashion Design, Management, Temple Culture, Natural Language Process, Hotel Management, Paaka Shastra (Food making), Cultivation, Apps, Tourism, Hospitality, MOOC development, Manuscriptology, Cataloguing, Paleography, Ritualogy, Sanskrit Typing and Short Hand, Sanskrit Composing and Proof Reading & Epigraphy, Ratna Pariksha courses. 12 Vidyalayas/Mahavidyalayas are benefitted. An amount of Rs. 10.90 Lakh was released during the financial year 2022-23.

### VI) Financial Assistance for Publication, Re-print and Bulk Purchase.

During the year 2022-23, meeting of the Grants-in-Aid Committee of the University was convened on 09.02.2023 in which several important proposals were approved under publication schemes.

#### VIII Ashtaadashi Project

Ministry of Human Resource Development (now Ministry of Education), Govt. of India, Department of Higher Education vide letter No. F.No. 1-27/2015. Skt. II dated 18.11.2015 had constituted a Committee comprising 13 members under the Chairmanship of Shri N.Gopalaswamy, Chancellor, formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha (now National Sanskrit University), Tirupati to suggest a long-term Vision and Roadmap for next ten years for the development of Sanskrit. As per terms of references, one of the major recommendations of the Committee is Ashtaadashi (18 Projects) for sustaining the growth of Sanskrit. According to the report, Ashtaadashi Scheme may be taken up as a special case in order to give the muchrequired boost for the growth engine of Sanskrit.

The major areas of the Ashtaadashi project are:

- 1. Knowledge Texts Translation Project.
- Editing & Publishing of Manuscripts Project.
- 3. Digital & Online Resources Project.
- 4. Summer Course Project.
- 5. Contemporary Literature Project.
- 6. Evening School Project.
- 7. Technology Adaptation Project.
- 8. Computer Education Project.
- 9. Biennial Sanskrit Book fair Project.
- 10. Outreach Programs Project.
- 11. Shabdashala Project.

- 12. Reprinting of Rare Books Project.
- 13. Residential Training Project.
- 14. Integrating Sanskrit with Modern Subjects Project.
- 15. Support Internship Project.
- 16. Children's Literature Project.
- 17. Yoga through Sanskrit Project.
- 18. Ayurveda through Sanskrit.

As per the recommendations of the Road Map Committee and Ministry of HRD (now Ministry of Education), the Central Sanskrit University had issued a notification for inviting proposals for financial assistance to universities/educational institutions/ organizations in the year 2022-23. According to the notification and recommendations of pre-scrutiny committee, a total number of 80 proposals were called for interface meeting for presentation. Based on the guidelines, quality of the proposals and presentation of the concerned projects the High-level Committee has recommended 49 projects at a cost of Rs.4,99,94,000/- (Rupeesfourcrore ninety-nineLakh and ninety-four Thousand Only). Further, after approval of the GIAC and BoM, allocated grants are being disbursed according to guidelines.

#### 4.1.9 SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

Central Sanskrit University disburses two types of scholarships -

- (1) Internal scholarships for traditional Sanskrit students studying in University's own campuses.
- (2) Financial Assistance for Award of Scholarship to students of Sanskrit Pathashalas/Mahavidyalayas/High/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges at All India Level in Modern and Traditional Streams.

Among the above mentioned 1 & 2 the type 1 scholarship (i.e. internal scholarship for the campus students) are directly distributed to the eligible students by the Campuses. Type 2 scholarships is distributed under the 'Scheme for the Development

of Sanskrit Education' of Govt. of India. The disbursement of scholarships under this scheme is looked after by the scholarship section of H.Q. of University.

#### Internal (type 1) Scholarships

The rates of internal scholarships for students of Prak Shastri, Shastri, Shiksha Shastri and Acharya courses are Rs. 600/- Rs. 800/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 1000/- per month respectively. Scholars pursuing research for the award of Vidyavaridhi degree are granted monthly scholarship amount of Rs. 8000/- in addition to annual contingency grant of Rs. 8000/- for two years w.e.f. 18.02.2016.

(2) Financial Assistance for Award of Scholarship to the students studying Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit languages for the financial year 2022-23 in Traditional & Modern Scheme from 9th to PhD level under Scheme for Sanskrit Promotion.

#### Introduction:-

In order to encourage the students in Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit, the scholarship is provided by the Central Sanskrit University under the scheme for Sanskrit promotion to regular students studying Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit as a main or optional subject in any recognized Sanskrit Pathashala/Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya/ Sanskrit Vishwavidyalaya in Traditional Stream or School/College/ University in Modern Stream pursuing Purva-Madhyama(1st year)/9th standard, Purva-Madhyama (2nd year)/10th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/Prakshastri (1st year)/11th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/Prakshastri (2nd year)/12th standard, Shastri /B.A (1st/2nd/3rd year), Acharya/M.A(1st/2nd year), Vidyawaridhi/Ph.D. or equivalent.

The number of Scholarships to be awarded each year under the scheme depends upon the availability of funds. Reservations will be provided as per the Government policy from time to time.

As per the sanctioned budget earmarked to states, a cut off list of merit of maximum to maximum percentage of student is prepared. According to our record, 35292 applications were received in the University from stream 6022 registered institutions

under the Traditional and Modern for award of Scholarship for the year 2022-23. After prepared the merit of the applications, 17895 applicants were selected for award of scholarship 2022-23 in modern & traditional streams from class 9th to Ph.D. programme in different places of India of various University/Colleges/Schools. As per the sanctioned funds, the Scholarship awarded is as mentioned in the table below:

#### 4.1.10 ALL INDIA SANSKRIT ELOCUTION CONTEST

The present Scholars, Judges and audience appreciated the presentations of the contestants.

#### 4.1.11 ADARSH SANSKRIT MAHAVIDYALAYA/ ADARSH SANSKRIT SHODH SANSTHAN

#### Name of the Scheme

The Scheme for Financial Assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Sanskrit Shodh Sansthans.

#### Introduction

The Scheme for financial assistance to Institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas / Adarsh Sanskrit Shodh Sansthans was started by the Government of India in 1978 for supporting traditional institutions of Sanskrit learning. The Scheme was first revised in 1983 vide Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India letter no. F.80-7/88-SK.I dated 06.10.1983. Then it was revised in 1993 vide Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India letter no. F. 30-19/88-SK.-I dated 6th July, 1993. Later the Scheme was transferred to the Central Sanskrit University (formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan) for implementation vide letter no. F. 8-3/94-Skt.-I dated 16.06.1995 of the Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. This scheme has been further revised by Government of India, vide letter no. F.No. 31-4/ 2009-Skt.I dated 29th June, 2012.

Consequent upon the changes that have come about in the field of higher education, particularly Sanskrit education, implementation of 6th Pay Commission and subsequent issuance of Regulations by the University Grants Commission for maintenance of standards in higher education, it has become imperative to reformulate the scheme in order to enable the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Sanskrit Shodh Sansthans to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research in a more effective way.

Under this scheme, 26 Institutions are being run at various parts of the country with the financial assistance of Govt. of India through the Central Sanskrit University and major portion of the finance for this scheme is being released by the CSU. There are 22 ASMs & 04 ASSSs. These institutions are financially assisted to the extent of the 95% of the admissible expenditure for recurring item and to the extent of 75% for non-recurring items, subject to the maximum of Rs.5.00 lakh per annum relating to development of infrastruture.

#### **Objectives**

The objective of the Scheme is to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research. For this purpose, assistance is extended under this scheme to Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas for conducting courses at the level of Shastri and Acharya and to Shodh Sansthans (Research Institution) for organizing and conducting research - both at doctoral and post doctoral levels and bringing out research based publications and research journals.

#### 4.1.12 PROJECTS

#### 1. Samarth

Samarth is an initiative of Ministry of Education. Central Sanskrit University has successfully implemented the Samarth project in 2022 to deliver quality services to staff, students and other stakeholders. Currently, there are 1178 accounts of Central Sanskrit University that are managed through Samarth, The University has increased its efficiency by leveraging digital technologies to define and govern administrative processes. There are multiple modules that are offered by Samarth for the management of various functional domains of university operations and administration. Central Sanskrit University is efficiently utilizing 22 modules.

#### 2. eOffice

eOffice is an integral part of Digital India Programme. Central Sanskrit University has implemented this project to achieve a simplified, accountable, responsive and transparent working in the University. eOffice is implemented in the headquarters of Central Sanskrit University and all its campuses across India. Currently, accounts of 144 employees are employees are operational in eOffice. It is a product suite comprised of several applications for transforming the day-to-day official work-related activities. It is a digital workplace that assists the University in making quick decisions. It helps in making the work of the University paperless.

#### 3. Media Cell

Central Sanskrit University has constituted a Media Cell for the promotion of Sanskrit language. It is responsible for promoting Sanskrit language on all social media platforms including Twitter, YouTube and Facebook. All the programs of Central Sanskrit University are telecast on the social media handles of the University through this Cell. The Media Cell designs posters and pamphlets for the various events or programmes of the University.

#### 4. Digital Attendancey System

Central Sanskrit University has adopted Digital Attendance System for maintenance of accurate attendance records of its employees. Biometric Attendance machines are deployed in the Headquarter Office and all the campuses of the University. The attendance records of 1480 users are maintained on this system. It is developed for automating the daily atendance of staff and scholars of the University. The system uses fingerprint or face recognition feature for marking the attendance. It is useful for tracking the working hours of employees from arrival to departure.

Samarth is an intiative of Ministry of Education. Central Sanskrit University has successfully implemented the Samarth project in 2022 to deliver quality services to staff, students and other stakeholders. Currently, there are 1178 accounts of Central Sanskrit University that are managed through Samarth. The University has increased its

#### i. Bhasha Mandakini (T.V. Telecast)

Central Sanskrit University telecasts Sanskrit programmes through Cyan Darshan Channel of IGNOU daily and thrice in a week through D.D. Bharati and D.D. India since September, 2003. Since then 730 episodes of 30 minutes were telecast by IGNOU.

### 2. National E-data Bank of Sanskrit Literature: (E-text)

The project aims at developing e-learning in Sanskrit and making e-Sanskrit corpus available to public through electronic texts and internet. Targets for the first phase of the project have been decided and the ground work has been prepared. One hundred texts have been taken up for preparing data-base to start the ground work for this tremendous task. Teachers in different campuses of the University have been assigned the texts as per their specializations and area of study. Data entry operators have been engaged for feeding the texts and preparing files on the computer. 120 video lectures have been uploaded in the University's website.

### 3. Sanskrit Teaching through Audio/Video (Multimedia Project)

In this project DVD albums have been prepared Sanskrit Bhasha Shikshnam, Vaidic Ganit, Sankshepa Ramayana, Naytyavinshatika, Kathadashakam, Prathama Deeksha V.C.D., Tadeva Gaganam Saiva Dhara, Kavibhaskari, Abhijnanashakuntalam, Shabdakalpadrum and Bhasnatakchakram are available for sale.

#### 4. MP3 Audio -

'Tattvachintamani' prepared by Prof. K.E. Devanathan, Tirupati and 'राणायणीयं सामगानम्' prepared by Shri Vedamurti Prabhakar Shastri and Pundlik Krishna Bhagvat is available for sale.

#### 5. E-Granthalaya -

3.05,567 books have been entered for networking the libraries of all campuses of University with Egranthalaya software.

#### 6. Manas Software -

Manas software for preparing data bank of Sanskrit Manuscripts has been assigned in the Allahabad Campus.

#### 7. Who is Who -

The University prepared data bank of Sanskrit Scholars in a book form as well as soft form. The book form 'Inventory of Sanskrit Scholars' (संस्कृतविद्वत्परिचायिका) already published on the occasion of 15th World Sanskrit Conference, 2012 and uploaded on website.

#### 8. Dictionary of Sanskrit -

Inter-lingual studies can provide a plausible way for promotion and preservation of languages. Central Sanskrit University has taken up a project on 'Dictionary of Sanskrit and other Indian languages including Dialects and Sub-dialects.' This project has been taken up with financial assistance under the schemes of MHRD in 2009.

This project will also contribute to the preservation and protection of traditional knowledge and linguistic skills through the study of common terminology in diverse Indian languages, dialects and sub-dialects. Details of Dictionary projects read as under:-

- i. Work on 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary and 'Malvi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' is carried out in Bhopal campus, Bhopal. In 'Bundeli-Sanskrit-Dictionary', collection work of 14000 words of Bundeli is completed and Bundeli to Sanskrit word-meanings of vowels, Kavarga, Cha, Chha, Ja, is completed. Remaining work of word-collection has been complete in 'Malavi-Sanskrit-Dictionary' collection work of 15,000 words of Malavi is completed and typed. Also, Malavi to Sanskrit word-meaning of vowels, Kavarga, Chavarga is completed.
- ii. 'Dialect-Sub-Dialects of North and North East India' project is carried out in Sanskrit Sahitya Parishad, Kolkata, in which total 11,487 words of oriya and Banlga languages were collected.
- iii. Work of 'Sanskrit-Persian-Urdu-Hindi Dictionary' is carried out in University headquarter. Under this project first volume based on vowels got published and in Consonants work from 'Ka' to 'Dha' is completed. Remaining work is in process.

#### 9. Sankhyayoga or Patanjalayoga Darshan-

In this project, the new edition of Patanjalayog Darshan is being prepared which is enriched and embellished with its terminologies and twelve antique commentaries. In the conservation of oriental Sanskrit texts, this project will contribute immensely. Two S.R.F. are working at Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi in this project.

The first phase of the project has been completed. In this phase, eleven commentaries of fifty one sutras of first chapter and common terminology available therein is arranged. In Appendix, the पाठभेद and of yogasutras are arranged alphabetically in first volume which is handed over to Research and Publication. The work on seven commentaries of Patanjala Yogasutra and four commentaries of Samkhyapravachan Bhasya is still carried on.

### 10. Special Drive for Collection and Digitizatin of Manuscripts -

All the Campuses of the University have independent libraries. This apart, the Campuses at Allahabad, Puri, Guruvayur and Lucknow have manuscript Ds libraries also. The Guruvayoor campus has undertaken a special drive for the collection of manuscripts from the year 2008-09 onward. The University has also taken the initiative for the

digitization of all the manuscripts available in various libraries of its campuses. The digitization work will be conducted through NIC.

As per information received from National Manuscripts Mission, dizitization of 55,369 manuscripts out of 52,187 manuscripts has been completed in Allahabad Campus.

Central Sanskrit University has undertaken several valuable projects since 2003. The list of projects undertaken/being undertaken is given below for information even though there is no specific progress in these during the reporting year.

### 11. Minor/Major Research Projects in University Campus

The Central Sanskrit University strives to promote teaching and research in emerging areas in Sanskrit Shastras, accordingly the campuses of University have been the centres of research in higher education in various disciplines. Hence University provide the support to its campuses/teachers for promoting research through projects. In this regard University will allot 1-2 major projects and 1-2 minor projects to each campus, annually. To achieve this goal there are 32 projects in first round (4 major & 2 minor) projects are in continuation.

#### 12. Bharatavani Project.

Bharatavani is a project with an objective of delivering knowledge in and about all the languages in India using multimedia (i.e., text, audio, video, images) formats through a portal (website). This portal would be all inclusive, interactive, dynamic and moderated. The idea is to make India an Open Knowledge Society, in the era of Digital India. Accordingly University has successfully uploaded 40 e-books on Bharatavani Portal.

#### At Present Running Projects

#### 1. Deccan College Sanskrit Dictionary Project

"An Encyclopedia Dictionary of Sanskrit on Historical Principles" is being implemented by the University in department of Sanskrit and Lexicography, Deccan college, Pune with financial support from the Ministry of HRD through Central Sanskrit University. Till now 35 volumes are published in this project.

#### 2. Rajabhasha

Ministry has implemented the programme regarding promotion and propagation of Hindi Rajabhasha in all Central Govt. offices. Accordingly University also doing sufficient official work in Hindi as well as organizing different kinds of programme. Every year trisemister report will be sent of work done in Hindi to the Hon'ble Minister apart from other activities.

#### 4.1.13 NON-FORMAL SANSKRIT EDUCATION

Central Sanskrit University conducted the following programmes through the department of Non-Formal Sanskrit Education during the year 2022-2023.

- 1. Functioning of Non-Formal Sanskrit Education Centres.

- 3. Post-Training Testing Programme
- 4. Meeting of Kendriya Samiti
- 5. Orientation Programme

### 1. Functioning of Non-Formal Sanskrit Education Centres

Sanskrit language is a unique treasure of Indian intellectual tradition and Culture. The nature of Sanskrit is very vast and comprehensive. Innumerable Indians want to study Sanskrit for the protection and firmness of their Indian aspect. With simple process, they are to be introduced to Sanskrit language and knowledge contained therein in simple way. With concept of this great objective and to provide the facility of Sanskrit study to the learners of varigated walks of society. Non Formal Sanskrit Education was started by the Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi.

The centers were set up by the Central Sanskrit University on the basis of applications received from highly reputed Institutions of the country like the Indian Institutes of Technology, Institutions of Ayurveda, Modern Colleges NITs, IIITs, Central Universities, State Universities and others. Central Sanskrit University has appointed for trained Sanskrit teachers the current academic session in these centers. An authorised officer has been nominated at each center by the Vice- Chancellor of Central Sanskrit University for the smooth functioning of the Non-Formal Sanskrit learning center. In the academic session 2022-2023, with the help of the authorized officer, A total of 120 centers were conducted in Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Delhi, Goa, Gujrat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Manipur, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tripura, Tamilnadu, Telangana, Uttrakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Meghalaya, West Bengal, North East states Authorized Officers evaluate all the activities of their respective centers and forward the monthly progress details to the Department.

A total of 7,426 (4552 Ladies and 2874 Gents) learners of different age groups benefited in this academic session in the Certificate Course in Sanskrit Language and Diploma in Sanskrit Language by Non-Formal Sanskrit Education.

Sanskrit Language and Diploma in Sanskrit Language Examination. Grand opening and closing ceremonies were organized in different centers, in which important visitors working in the field of Sanskrit, while expressing their views, explained the need for Sanskrit language enrichment. The heads of institutions have also requested the Central Sanskrit University to co-ordinate the Non Formal Sanskrit learning center in their institution in the next academic session also.

During the year 2022-23, 109 students from India & 05 students from foreign Countries have been registered in Correspondence Course.

## 4.1.15 MUKTA SWADHYAYA PEETHAM (Institute of Open and Distance Education)

The Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi had launched Open and Distance Mode educaton for various **Traditional Sanskrit Programmes** through its Mukta Swadhyaya Peetham (Institute of Open and Distance Education) in August, 2010.

In addition to these traditional degree courses, Sanskrit is taught to the general public through Non Formal Sanskrit teaching centers run in different states. Two courses are run by these centres, in which the first course is 'Sanskrit Language-Certificate-Course' and the second is 'Sanskrit Language-Proficiency-Course'. Apart from this, for the promotion of Sanskrit language, Sanskrit through Correspondence is conducted. Two Year elementary course in Sanskrit is being conducted through Hindi and English Medium.

Total No. of learners studying in M.S.P. during this year is 298.

A total of 92 students took admission in online Certificate and Diploma courses conducted under the joint auspices of Mukta Swadhyaya Peetham (institute of Open and Distance Education) and Sanskrit Promotion Foundation, New Delhi.

#### Meeting of Abhikalpa Samiti :-

Abhikalpa Samiti is the Governing Council of Mukta Swadhyaya Peetham (MSP). The 13th meeting

of this samiti was held on 08.08.2022 at Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi. According to the decision of this Samiti, in its meeting held on 10.03.2023, the Academic Development Center of Mukta Swadhyaya Peetham was establishment in Rajiv Gandhi Campus, Sringeri. It consists of 22 academic members who are involved in the development of various curriculum materials.

#### Center for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA)

Center for Internal Quality Assurance has been established by Mukta Swadhyaya Peetham which is its integral part. As per the regulation of Mukta Swadhyaya peetham it functions as a Unit. This Unit works to promote the development of ODL / Online education system and the expansion of Sanskrit Education. Its various activities are led by the Director of CIQA. #### 4.2 ACTIVITIES AT CAMPUSES

#### 4.2.1 Shri Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj (U.P.)

#### 1. Introduction -

History of Central Sanskrit University, Ganganath Jha campus starts from 17 November 1943 AD, which was established in its earlier form as Ganganath Jha Research Institute. Onthepicturesque terrain of Tirtharaj Prayagraj situated on the holy banks of Ganges, Yamuna and Saraswati, Sir Ganganath Jha Research Institute was established on 17 November, 1943 AD by Mahamana Pt. Madan Mohan Malviya Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru, Dr. Bhagwan Das, Dr. Sarvpalli Radha Krishnan, Justice shree Kamlakant Verma, Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj, Dr. Amar Nath Jha, Dr. Eshwri Prasad, Dr. Rambabu Saxena, Lt. Governor Adityanath Jha and his followers, disciples and various family members at Hindu Hostel on the occasion of second death anniversary of Dr. Ganganath Jha.

On17 November 1943, on the occasion of the inauguration of Ganganath Jha Research Institute Mahamana Pt. Madan Mohan Malviya in his inaugural lecture had said -



"There is need for more than one center like the one you are proposing to erect here. I hope and pray that your efforts may be crowned with success and that you may be able really to build up an active center of research for ancient Sanskrit learning and other oriental languages. Knowledge is universal and it ought to be popularised. We hope that this center will be a means of creating such and other centres."

"To the students of Sanskrit, there cannot be a better ideal for inspiration than an Institute of this kind created in memory of Dr. Ganganath Jha.

With the efforts of M.M. Dr. Umesh Mishraafter acquirement of land from U.P. government in Chandra Shekhar Azad Park In Compuny Gardenthe foundation stone of this building was laid on 13.02.1945 by the then Governor of U.P. Sir Maurice Hallett.

Sir Mauricetold in very emotional words that Dr. Jha did not belong to any particular state but belonged to the whole nation. Considering his attachment to Prayagraj, it is very appropriate that a research institute should be built here in his memory from where his residual work would gain momentum.

Dr. Baburam Saxena, Dr. Ishwari Prasad, Dr. S. P. Chaturvedi and Pt. K.C. Chattopadhyay were in this committee. Till this time, the main work of the Research Institute was the publication of 'Journal'.

Itsfirst Chair Person was Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru (1943-49). After that Dr. Bhagwandas (1949-59), Dr. S. Radhakrishnan (1959–63)Justice Mr. Kamalakanta Verma (1963-65), Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj (1965-71),respectively adornedthe position of the president. 
institute is thriving under the name of CS.U G.N.Jha Campus.

### 4.2.3 Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu (Jammu and Kashmir)

#### 1. Introduction

Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi established by an Act of Parliament (formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan) under the Ministry of Education, Government of India is the largest, multicampus university in the world which has been accrediated A++ by NAAC. Presently Prof. Shrinivasa Varakhedi is the Vice-Chancellor of the university. Shri Ranbir Campus, situated at Jammu, the winter capital of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, is one of the 13 (including HQ) campuses of the University. The campus building has been constructed on a stretch of landadmeasuring 84 Kanals.

#### Objectives and Background

The history of the campus goes back to 1857 when Maharaja Sri Ranbir Singh of Jammu and Kashmir established Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya at Jammu, with a view to preserve and propagate the traditional knowledge enshrined in the Sanskrit language and literature. This Mahavidyalaya was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Government of India on April 1, 1971 and named as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. With the declaration of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as a multi-campus deemed university on May 2, 2002, this institution came to be called as Rashtriva Sanskrit Sansthan, Shri Ranbir Campus. Dr. Anant Maral Shastri was the first Principal of the institution, followed by Dr. Dayanand Bhargava, Dr. J. Ganguly, Dr. Murlidhar Pandey, Dr. Jagannath Pathak, Dr. Raghav Prasad Chaudhary, Dr. Ram Kishore Shukla, Dr. Priyatam Chandra Shastri (In-charge), Dr. G. Ganganna, Prof. Vishwa Murti Shastri, Prof. Yash Pal Khajuria (In-charge), Prof. M. Chandrasekhar (Incharge), Prof. P.N. Shastri (In-charge), Prof. Ramanuja Devanathan, Prof. Bachcha Bharti (In-charge), Prof. Lokmanya Mishra (In-charge), Prof. Fateh Singh (Incharge), Sh. Sharat Chander Sharma (In-charge). Prof. Vasudev Sharma (In-charge) was the last Principal and the first Director of the Campus after the attainment of Central Sanskrit University status on 30th April 2020. Presently Prof. Madan Mohan Jha is the Director of the Campus.

#### **Publications**

The campus has published 23 books relating to the various branches of knowledge. There is a great demand in the country for the books relating to Kashmir Shaiva Darshan. Publication of Annual Research Magazine "Shri Vaishnavi" (UGC care Listed) featuring research-oriented articles, poems etc. in Sanskrit, English, Hindi, Dogri is being carried on regularly since the inception of the institution. The magazine has been granted ISSN- 755 2277 906X by the National Institute of Science and Communication and Information Resources, New Delhi. Besides this, Education Department also has been publishing a Shiksha-Shastra journal titled "Shikshamritam" (UGC care Listed) since the academic year 2011-12.

#### 2. Campus Status

#### Library

The well-stocked library of the Campus enshrines about 46,000 books on various subjects.

The library also houses 72 rare manuscripts. The manuscripts are in Sharada and Devanagari scripts.

#### E- Library

To provide online information about the books available in the campus library to the public at large, data entry process is going on in "E-granthalaya", the e-library of the campus.

#### Planetarium

To provide the theoretical and practical knowledge of Astrology to the students, a small planetarium has been established in the campus. A number of instruments and teaching aids, such as, miniature planetarium, telescopes, planet orbit model machine, phases of the moon model machine, solar and lunar eclipse model machine, Gola Yantra and informative picture posters have been kept here.

#### **Conference Hall**

A conference hall, with conference microphones and LED projector system, having a seating capacity of 62 persons has been established at the campus.

#### Vani Vilas Auditorium

For smooth conduct of scholarly lectures, dance, dramas, programs and other cultural activities by the

students of the campus, a well-equipped auditorium with a seating capacity of 500 persons has been established at the campus.

#### Computer Lab

A computer lab also has been established by the Modern Subjects Department of the campus to provide practical computer education to the Prak-Shastri and Shastri students. The computer lab features 25 computers, air conditioners, excellent furniture, internet facility, and Wi-Fi facility.

#### **Departmental Computers**

Computers with printers and internet facility have been provided to each department for the smooth functioning of the departmental activities at the campus. Each department of the campus has its own Smart Class rooms with Wi-Fi and internet facility.

#### **Departmental Libraries**

In order to make books conveniently available to the teachers and students, and to inculcate in them an interest in books, Departmental libraries have been established in all the departments of the campus. Each department houses books amounting to Rs. 50,000/catering to the interest of the students and teachers.

#### Language Lab

Language Lab was established in the Department of Education in academic year 2016-17. For this purpose, 11 computers has been provided in the lab for their language skill development.

#### **Psychology Lab**

Department of Education houses Psychology Lab with new equipments, which include electronic equipments.

#### Teaching and Non-teaching Staff

The Campus is staffed with 43 faculty members, comprising of Professors, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors, Contract Teachers, and Guest Teachers. Moreover, the campus has 38 ministerial staff, 14 guards besides outsoursing staff which is increased or decreased as the situation arrises.

#### Hostels

For the students coming from the far-flung areas of the state and other parts of the country, separate hostel facility for boys and girls have been provided. The hostels are well-equipped with modern facilities. They have 84 rooms, capable of accommodating 168 students. The hostels also have geysers and arrangements for filtered drinking water. Both the

hostels have separate mess.

#### **Staff Quarters**

There are staff quarters inside the campus, to cater to the residential needs of the Director, hostel superintendent, wardens and teaching staff of the campus.

#### **Gymnasium**

Yoga and physical exercise facility is also provided to the students to ensure their physical and mental health well-being. For this purpose, a gymnasium equipped with modern exercising machines and a ten-seat work station, has been established. An open gym has also been installed in the campus with seven exercise stations.

#### Playground

The campus has a large playground where a variety of athletic and sports activities are organized from time to time.

#### **Studies and Research Activities**

Shri Ranbir Campus provides an education based on beautiful combination of traditional and modern systems of education. As per the directions of the Headquarters, New Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) has been implemented in the Campus. Classwise teaching arrangements are as follow:-

#### i) Traditional Sanskrit Studies

The Campus has begun teaching as per Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the varied courses proposed under NEP 2020. Under the traditional Sanskrit Studies, the Campus has arrangements for teaching Prak-Shastri (Intermediate 10+2 in Semester system), Shastri (B.A.) and Acharya (M.A.). Traditional Sanskrit subjects include Sanskrit Grammar (Vyakarana), Sanskrit Literature (Sahitya), Philosophy (Darshana), Astrology (Siddhanta and Phalit Jyotisha), and Vedic Literature (Veda); and English, Hindi, Dogri, History, Political Science, Computer Science, Environmental Science, Physical Education and Yoga are taught as Modern subjects.

#### ii) Professional Education

Professional Course Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) is taught in the Department of Education.

#### iii) Diploma and Certificate Courses

Campus has started newly designed Diploma and Certificate courses in Ved-Karamkand-Pourahitya and Jyotish Shastra respectively and in process to initiate a one-year Diploma course in Yoga has also been on track.

#### iv) Research Activities

In order to conduct multi-dimensional research activities in relevant fields of Sanskrit learning, there are arrangements for Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) guidance. At present, 17 students are registered as research scholars in the campus.

## Distance Education Centre (Muktaswadhyaya-peetham)

For the purpose of promotion and propagation of Sanskrit at the world level, a distance education institution called *Muktaswadhyayapeetham*, has been established which is duly recognized by the Distance Education Council of India. All the campuses of the Sansthan have a centre of the *Muktaswadhyayapeetham*, called *Muktaswadhyayakendram*.

The Muktaswadhyayakendram at Shri Ranbir Campus started in 2010-11. The centre provides Intermediate (Prak-Shastri), B.A. (Shastri) and M.A. (Acharya) courses as per annual exam system. A special feature of the Mukhtaswadhyayapeetham is that there is an arrangement for Bridge courses for non-Sanskrit students. Under these courses, the students are provided audio-visual material with other course material such as textbooks etc. so that non-Sanskrit students also can learn Sanskrit easily in a short time.

In addition to Sanskrit Literature, grammar and *Jyotisha* subjects, the centre is also conducting a course in Sanskrit journalism. There are plans for

introducing other classical subjects. Besides these, certificate courses in Dramatics (*Natyashastra*), Pali, Prakritetc, would be introduced soon. For these initiatives, the Sansthan Headquarters, the *Muktaswadhayayapeetham* and all the lovers of Sanskrit deserve to be congratulated. A number of members of local Intelligentia such as, engineers, doctors, lawyers, and teachers have joined the courses offered by the *Kendram*.

### Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project

Kashmir Shaiva Darshan is a priceless legacy of Jammu and Kashmir. For the conservation and preservation of this priceless legacy, the Campus is exclusively running a Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project on its premises. Through the tireless efforts of Late Dr. Baljinath Pandit and the research assistants associated with the project, two volumes of Kashmir Shaiva Darshan have been published, which are available for sale. The copies of the volumes are being sent all over India and the world.

# 4.2.4 Guruvayoor Campus, Purnattukara, Trissur (Kerala)

#### 1. Introduction:

Kerala, the God's own Country, sanctified with the birth of Adi Sankara, is exalted to the pinnacle as a place of living without discrimination of caste, colour, gender and creed as influenced by Jagad Guru ShriShankaracharya's philosophy of Advaita Vedanta. Samskritapranayabhajanam P.T. Kuriyakkose Master started Guruvayoor Sahitya Deepika Sanskrit Vidyapeetha at Pavaratty in 1909 and in 1934 UG and PG Courses were started under Madars University, which was later in 1972 taken by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi and rechristened it as Sahitya Deepika Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. In 1979 it was renamed as Guruvayoor Kendriya Sanskrit Vidhyapeetha and was shifted to present location in 1983. The New Administrative and Academic block located at Puranattukara was inaugurated by Dr. MuraliManohar Joshi, the then Hon'ble HRD Minister, on 16th August 1998. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was raised to the status of a multi campus Deemed University and this institution was renamed as Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Guruvayoor Campus on 7th May 2002. It has been raised to the status as the CENTRAL SANSKRIT UNIVERSITY by the Parliamentary Act.

### 2. Location of the Campus:

It is located at Puranattukara in Adat Panchayat in Thrissur District just behind Sarada Girls High School. It is flanked by Amala Institute Medical Sciences, Ramakrishna AshramamGurukulam Schools, IES Engineering College and Kendriya Vidyalaya. It is 8kms away from Thrissur on NH 47. The nearest airport is at Kochi, Nedumbassery.

For the implementation of this government order the RSKS New Delhi started the Bhopal Campus from 1st July 2002, as per the letter no.- 37021/2002-admin/no8 office order no. iO7/dated 5.6.2002, by providing the principal and other departments etc. The formal inauguration of the Bhopal Campus was declared on the date 16th September 2002 by the then Governor of M.P. Honorable Bhai Mahaveerji in the presence of the then V.C., RSKS New Delhi Prof. Vempati Kutumba Shastri, the founder Principal of the Campus Prof. Azad Mishra and the other reputed scholars of the Sanskrit world. #### 4.2.10 K.J. Somaiya Campus, Mumbai (Maharashtra)

#### 1. About the Campus in Brief

Philanthropist and a great visionary Padma Bhushan awardee Sri Karamshi Jetha Bhai Somaiya had a great contribution in the field of Education and Social service. He established an educational institution in Somaiya Vidyavihar, which is now known as one of the biggest and esteemed educational institutions and known as Somaiya Vidyavihar University, throughout the world. The Somaiya family is religious and has a great passion towards Sanskrit language. Hence Shri Shantilal Somaiya, S/o K.J. Somaiya submitted a proposal to HRD to establish a Campus ofRashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University) New Delhi in SomaiyaVidyavihar. Consequent upon the submission of the proposal by K.J. Somaiya Trust, Vidyavihar, Mumbai for establishing a Campus of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan with an offer of allotting one acre piece of land for construction of the building, a committee appointed by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, carried out an inspection and recommended establishing its constituent Vidyapeetha there. The HRD Ministry of Government of India was kind enough to concur in the recommendations of the committee vide the decision taken on 31st March 2002. K.J. Somaiya Trust allowed the Sansthan to utilize their existing built up structure for conducting the classesuntil the construction of building of the Campus is complete. The Sansthan has taken possession of the allotted land of one acre from the leaser Somaiya Trust. On the auspicious day of 16th May 2002, the then Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, Dr. Murali Manohar Joshi inaugurated the Mumbai campus. The construction of the new building on this site is in progress. The teaching learning process, in this campus, started precisely from 2003. The N.C.T.E. approved Shiksha - Shastri Course (Eq. to B.Ed.) was also introduced in the campus since 2006.

#### 2. Campus Location:

The Campus is located at Vidyavihar East, Ghatkopar, Mumbai, Maharashtra in the economic capital of India. The K.J. Somaiya Trust in Vidyavihar has donated one acre land for the construction of the Central Sanskrit University Campus. All the formalities for the construction of building have been completed.

At present, the Teaching-learning activities, Shastra Classes and Research works are running in the Chanakya Bhavan of Somaiya Campus. The Director's chamber and the Administrative office are located at Suruchi Bhavan of the Campus. The Library facility is arranged in a building, located beside it. Four rooms inthe Polytechnic Hostel of SomaiyaVidyavihar areallotted for the hostel facility of 20 students.

The Lokamanya Tilak Terminus, the Vidyavihar Railway Station and Ghatkopar Local Railway Stations are very close to the campus site.

#### 4.2.12 Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Devprayag, Uttarakhand

#### 1. Introduction:

Shri Raghunatha kirti Adarsha Sanskrit Mahavidylaya (Estd.1908), Devaprayaga, Uttarakhand was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan on 16th June, 2016 as its 13th constituent Campus. The campus has been named after the famous ancient deity Shri Raghunathaji shrine in the ancient Raghunatha temple constructed in the Katyuri style of Katyuri dynasty of the mountains on the holy confluence of two important mythological rivers, namely, Bhagirathi and Alaknanda from where exactly the river Ganga is originated. Because of this cultural, spiritual and educational background, the campus was inaugurated here on 16.06.16. The former Sanskrit Mahavidylaya has donated its premises with a vast land measuring 3.443 hectares and simultaneously the Govt. of Uttarakhand has also allotted some adjourned portion of land measuring 9.228 hectares. Now the campus has total land of 23 acres. The land with the complete approved lay-out plan has been handed over to CPWD (Shrinagar Branch) for the construction of the campus building The first Foundation stone was laid by the honourable Governor of Uttarakhand Dr. K.K.Paul on 06.05.2017 whereas the Second Foundation stone was laid by Dr. Satyapal Singh, the honourable state Minister of Higher Education, Ministry of HRD, Govt. Of India on 08.11.2017. The construction of all the required blocks including Academic, Administrative and residential (Hostel for Boys and Girls both, Guest House and several types of Staff Quarters) along with Library hall, Auditorium and Stadium (playground) etc. are in progress and heading towards completion. The newly established campus now functions with six departments where traditional subjects like Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Sahitya, Veda, Vedanta and Nyaya respectively are being taught along with the modern Subjects like Hindi, English, History, computer science etc. (up to graduation or Shastri level). Around one hundred seventy students are admitted to following different classes in prak shastri (intermediate), shastri (B.A.), acharya (M.A.) and vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.). Inside the regular course campus has a distance education centre affiliated with Muktswadhyayapeetham of Central Sanskrit University. There are bridge course also with other regular course.

#### 2. Location of the campus:

So far as the geographical, historical, cultural, mythological and educational status is concerned, Devaprayag comes in the state of Uttarakhand, popularly and culturally known as Devabhumi or the divine land. This state of Devabhumi is adorned not only with one of the famous Jyotirmathas called Shribadarikashrama but with one of the twelve jyotirlingas, namely, Shrikedarnatha. The province has the credit of being the sources of two vedic as well mythological rivers Ganga and Yamuna. Even today also the divine-souled (devatatma) Himalaya stands here as the measuring pole of the earth as if to glorify the state. According to the Kedarakhanda of the Skanda-Purana, the name Devaprayaga came into existence on the very name of the sage Shri Deva Sharma who has undergone a severe penance in this auspicious place. Devaprayag has the credit of being recognised as the first prayaga among the five prayagas of Uttarakhand, followed by Rudra prayaga, Karna Prayaga, Nanda prayaga and Vishnu prayaga respectively. The small but important hilly town Devaprayag is surrounded with at least three series of mountains, namely, Griddhanchala, Dasharathanchala and Nrisimhanchala etc. The Nrisimhanchalapart of Devaprayaga was famous earlier as a centre of learning in entire Uttarakhanda being categorically named as vidyakshetra where exactly the campus is situated now. It is the only state where Sanskrit is accepted as its second official language. Shri Raghunath kirti campus is situated on the road of Rishikesh to Badrinath and 75 km far from Rishikesh at Devpryag in the Pauri district on the Nrisinghachal mountain.



## **ACCOUNTING CONVENTION**

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and generally on the accrual method of accounting.

## REVENUE RECOGNITION

Fees from students (except Tution Fees), Sale of Admission form, Royalty and Interest on Saving Bank account are accounted on cash basis. Income from Investments are accounted on accrual basis.

## **FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION**

Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition. installation and commissioning. Gifted/Donated assets are valued at the declared value where available; if not available, the value is estimated based on the present market value adjusted with reference to the physical condition of the asset. They are set up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the Institution. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets.

Books received as gifts, are valued at selling prices printed on the books. Where they are not printed, the value is based on assessment.

Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Straight line method, at the following 3.3. 3.4.

  - Assets created out of Earmarked Funds and funds of Sponsored Projects, where the ownership of such assets vests in the University, are setup by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the University. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets. Assets created out of Sponsored Project funds, where the ownership is retained by the sponsors but held and used by the University are separately disclosed in the Notes on Accounts. 3.7
- Leasehold Land is amortized over period of lease.

# Intangible Assets: Patents and copy rights, E Journals and Computer Software are grouped under Intangible Assets

### STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of office and computer stationary stock is accounted as revenue expenditure. However, being a pioneer/nodal institution for the propagation and development of Sanskrit stock of University publication/books are treated as fixed assets. (refer Schedule-4)

### **RETIRMENT BENEFITS**

- Retirement benefits are treated as per GOI Rules. Its includes Pension, Gratuity, Leave & Cashment and Provident Fund.
- Afixed medical allowance of Rs.1000/-p.m. is being paid by Govt. of India OM dated 19.07.2017.
- For Provident Fund of employees of University a separate set of accounts Receipt & Payment, Income & Expenditure and Balance Sheet are prepared and is attached with these accounts. **6.**1 6.1 6.2 6.3 6.3 6.5 6.5 7.
  - For pension also an earmarked fund has been created in which Govt. Grant and expenditure is accounted in Schedule-2.
- 322 employees are covered under New Pension Scheme.

### INVESTMENTS

Investment is in the form of Fixed Deposit in the bank. There is no diminution in its value.

## Earmarked / Endowment Funds

- University is having one earmarked fund for Pension and five endowment funds in the name of Jindal Trust, Dubey Award, Somaiya Trust, Shukla Trust and RK Sharma. All these dedicated funds have been depicted in Schedule-2
  - Expenditure on the special funds is deducted from these funds only and not taken to the Income & Expenditure account.

### **Government/ UGC Grants**

- University is functioning on the basis of grant received from UGC which is being accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to the financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as recoverable from the Grantor. 9.6
- Grant utilized for fixed assets has been shown as Capital expenditure and remaining as revenue. (refer Schedule-10)
- Unutilized grants as carried forward as unspent (refer Schedule-10) and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet. (refer Schedule-3)

# INVESTMENT OF EARMARKED I FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCURED ON SUCH INVESTMENT:

- These earmarked funds are invested in fixed deposit in Banks.
- Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the University. (refer Schedule-2) 9.2 9.3 **10.** 10.1

### SPONSORED PROJECTS 7.

University is having one project of UGC - SRF/JRF (Senior/Junior Research Fellow) funded by UGC.

### INCOME TAX

The University is a Central Sanskrit University and fully finance through Govt. grant. The income of the University is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts. No TDS is deducted by the bank on investment in Terms Deposits. **12**.

### **PENSION FUND**

During the year, the Univesity has created a Pension Fund in State Bank of India for disbursement of pension to its pensioners through Centralized Pension Processing Centre (CPPC).

### Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi for the year ended 31 March 2023

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Central Sanskrit University (CSU), New Delhi as 31 March 2022, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act read with section 32 (1) of the Central Sanskrit University Act, 2020. The financial statements are the responsibility of the CSU Management. The financial statements include the accounts of 12 Campuses of the CSU and Headquaarer. Out of these, accounts of four units were audited and considered for the report. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- i) We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format, prescribed by the Ministry of Education, Government of India vide order No. 29-4/2012-FD dated 17 April 2015.
- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Central Sanskrit University, in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv) We further report that:

### A. Income and Expenditure

### A.1 Expenditure

### A.1.1 Administrative and General Expenses (Schedule 17) Rs.19.31 crore

The above includes e-office NICSI expendiure of Rs. 211.13 lakh which was and advance payment made in March 2023 for a period ranging from eight months to 60 months. Hence the actual payment for the year 2022-23 was Rs. 3.27 lakh and balance of Rs. 169.62 lakh should have been depicted in loans and advances.

This has resulted in understatement of Loans, Advances and Deposits and overstatement of Expenditure by Rs. 169.62 lakh.

### B. General

AS per the information provided to Audit the value of freehold land and leasehold land is Rs. 1.18 crore and Rs. 18.97 lakh respectively whereas in the accounts the value of freehold land and leasehold land has been shown as Rs. 35.95 lakh Rs. 51.70 lakh respectively. The difference of Rs. 82.05 lakh in the value of freehold land and (-) Rs. 32.73 lakh in the value of leashold land was not reconciled and clarified to Audit.

Further in contravention to clause 3.8 of significant accounting policy (Schedule 23) leasehold land of the University has not been amortized during the year.

### C. Grants in aid

The Central Sanskrit University received Grants-in-aid of Rs.324.43 crore (Non-NER: Rs. 301.99 crore and NER: Rs. 22.44 crore) during the year 2022-23 and had an opening balance of Rs. 0.60 crore (Non-NER: 0.06 crore and NER: Rs. 0.54 crore). Out of total fund of Rs. 325.03 crore (Non-NER: Rs. 302.05 and NER: Rs. 22.98 crore), Rs. 0.0983 crore had lapsed (Non-NER: Rs. 0.0982 crore and NER: Rs. 0.0001 crore) and the University utlized Rs. 324.07 crore (Non-NER Rs. 301.19 crore and NER: Rs. 22.88 crore) leaving an usspent balance of Rs. 0.86 crore (Non-NER: Rs. 0.86 crore and NER: Rs. NIL) as on 31 March 2023.

### D. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Vice-Chancellor, CSU through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India;
- a. in so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Central Sanskrit University (CSU) as at 31 March 2023; and
- b. and in so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

### 1. Adequacy of Internal audit system

- The internal audit of the campuses is being conducted by the Finance and Accounts Department of the CSU Hqrs and by hiring consultants. Out of the 13 planned units, only 7 were audited during the year.
- The internal audit of the CSU Hqrs was not conducted by the Ministry.
- There is no internal audit manual.

### 2. Adequacy of Internal Control System

• The internal control system of CSU is adequate in areas seen by audit.

### 3. System of physical verification of assets

- The physical verification of Fixed Assets of CSU Hqrs. has been conducted upto 31.3.2022.
- Physical verification of Library books of CSU Hqrs has been done upto 2019-20.

### 4. System of physical verification of inventory

The physical verification of inventories of CSU Hqrs such as stationery and consumables has been done upto 31.03.2022.

### 5. Regularity in payment of dues

As per accounts, no payment over six month in respect of statutory dues was outstanding as on 31.03.2023.
