PREAMBLE:

Central Sanskrit University, Delhi

Central Sanskrit University (CSU) is Established on 30th April, 2020 by an act of Parliament as per the Government of India Gazette No. CG-DL-A-17042020-219068 dated 17th April 2020. Earlier Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was established on 15th October 1970 as an autonomous organisation registered under the Societies Registration Act (XXI of 1860) under the control of MHRD which got transformed as Deemed University in 2002.

CSU is a Premier University for promoting Sanskrit studies in India and abroad. It is the biggest Sanskrit University in the world today which is also the only Multi-Campus Sanskrit University. All-round development of all the branches of Sanskrit learning and availability of Sanskrit resources through modern systems are the main objectives of the University. The University is meant for the upliftment of linguistic diversity and cultural plurality while arranging for teaching and research in Sanskrit, Pali and Prakrit in the context of their mutual cultural inter-relationship. It is also committed for the preservation and upliftment of the philosophical and scientific elements in the knowledge systems of these languages and ensuring their availability through the equipment's of information and communication technology while establishing the relationship of these knowledge systems with cultural legacy.

The other objectives of the University are:

- To disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional research and expansion facilities to the promotion of Sanskrit Language courses in humanities, social sciences and science in its educational governance.
 - To take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teachinglearning process and inter-disciplinary studies and research;
 - To educate and train manpower for the overall development;
 - To establish the glory of Sanskrit learning in the global context.

Here CSU includes all its campuses along with affiliated colleges, research centres and any other related organisations.

artistic and linguistic diversity of India including endangered languages such as

Rishnupriya Manipuri, Saurashtra, Meitei among others.

The Centre researched and highlighted rare tribal dances of India from Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Maharashtra, Karnataka etc.

Sanskruti also has the distinction of using dance for socially and culturally important subjects and has presented during various panel discussions at the Houses of British Parliament, some first of their kind, such as at World Hunger Day, United Nations World Water Day, World Day of Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development, World Health Day, International Mother Language Day, World Hunger Day, among others.

Sanskruti Centre for Cultural Excellence, have been training, highlighting and presenting classical & folk/tribal dance forms and linguistic diversity of India inBritain for over a decade now. They have also hosted panel discussions and events inboth the Houses of British Parliament on key occasions such as the World Day forCultural Diversity, United Nations International Year for Indigenous Languages, WorldTourism Day, UN Mother Language Day et al. In January 2022, Sanskruti have marked the Republic Day of India in association with ICCR, London (Cultural Wing of HighCommission of India) showcasing lesser-known tribal dance forms such as Shondol of Ladakh, Rabha of Assam, Nyishi of Arunachal Pradesh etc. by the local talent in theUK, which has received wide appreciation and acclaim.

OBJECTIVES:

- The overall objective of MoU is to provide framework for collaboration between Central Sanskrit University, Delhi and Sanskruti, Centre for Cultural Excellence, U.K. on exchange of knowledge under the project "Sanskrit Language Knowledge System" SLKS.
- Cultural exchange between the Central Sanskrit University (CSU), Delhi and Sanskruti, Centre for Cultural Excellence, keeping the richness of research work in the field of Sanskrit language in both the institutions/countries.

AREAS OF COOPERATION:

 Sanskruti Centre of Cultural Excellence, U.K. will plan to stage famous Sanskrit dramas in foreign countries. They willstage one Sanskrit Drama in London on 15th October, 2022 (i.e. Foundation day of Central Sanskrit University, formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthanand Golden Jubilee Celebration of National Independence under the banner of Azadi ka V Ragashallo Ren

- Amrit Mahotsava) Central Sanskrit University will provide technical knowhow in the form of giving artist support and financial assistance to other party Sanskrutiin this regard.
- The parties, CSU and Sanskruti will cooperate in the implementation of Joint activities for safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage. These activities may include the organizing of capacity building and awareness rising activities for the spreading of Sanskrit Language Knowledge System.
- Based on Central Sanskrit University's available experience and expertise
 in the data handling, analysis and visualising in the field of Sanskrit
 education, the parties may use part of these data relevant to cultural
 heritage as a mean to improve the quality of their joint programs and
 develop new formats of spreading Sanskrit education in UK.
- Both the parties, agree in lending mutual support to initiate collaboration and information exchange, and in the spirit of providing open access to information, cooperate in activities of Sanskrit Knowledge creation and dissemination through the co-production of publication, Training Programs, Manuscript publication& translation, propagation of languages and Shastric texts and Indian Knowledge System and support for digital platform which make information, tools and data readily and freely available to the public.
- Sanskruti will encourage its members to contribute the articles, research papers to be published in the peer reviewed journals of CSU, Delhi.
- The parties CSU and Sanskruti may exchange publications and other documents of common interest, with emphasis to Sanskrit Studies.
- The parties, may disseminate relevant information about each other organization of appropriate venues such as courses, conferences, symposia, online programs and meetings in order to encourage a better visibility to knowledge and adherence to both organizations.
- CSU, Delhi will encourage its Sanskrit scholars to deliver scholarly talk either off-line or on-line mode on any of the Sanskrit based Research topic in the academic meetings organized by Sanskruti U.K. at London venue.

PROJECT BASED COLLABORATION

Based on this MoU, both the parties from time to time may discuss and draw up theme-based collaboration in projects with a detailed Rome.

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN PARTIES

• Neither Sanskruti, Centre for Cultural Excellence nor CSU is or will be an agent or legal representative or partner of the other. Neither of them is or shall be responsible for the debts incurred by the other or be bound by any contracts or representatives made by the other or any obligations undertaken by the other. Neither of them is or shall be an employee of franchisee of the other and nor does this MoU create a joint venture or any similar relationship between them unless specifically agreed upon and approved.

RESPONSIBILITIES/DELIVERABLES/TIMELINES

 CSU and Sanskruti, Centre for Cultural Excellenceshall endeavor to admit and encourage research, publication and multiple programme activities, to facilitate and encourage the exchange between their respective areas and to collaborate with each other in propagating a better knowledge of the culture and ways of life with applicable regulations and subject to conditions to be agreed upon by both the parties.

FINANCING AND JOINT ACTIVITIES

• Efforts shall be made by the Parties to explore the possibilities of obtaining grants from State/Central Government agencies and contributions from corporates, trusts and foundations. However, it is understood that it would be on a non-commercial basis. Sanskruti, Centre for Cultural Excellence/CSU may develop projects on a joint collaboration basis in the areas of Sanskrit& Associated knowledge system. Both parties shall enjoy joint ownership of the collaborative work. If there are any financial implications, both Sanskruti, Centre for Cultural Excellence and Central Sanskrit University will discuss the details before starting the project. In future, if both the parties agree to commercialize a particular product, the revenue would be decided on case to case basis.

AMENDMENTS

 The MoU may be amended by mutual consent through exchange of correspondences between the two parties. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this MoU, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the Parties to this MoU, shall be incorporated by a written instrument, and become effective when executed and signed by both the Parties to the MoU.

VALIDITY PERIOD OF THE MOU

 The Memorandum of Understanding will come into effect on the date of signature and will remain in force for a period of a 03 years. It will be extendable for another period subsequently on terms mutually agreed upon.

TERMINATION

- Either Party may terminate the MoU by giving a notice of three months (90 days) in writing. Either party may terminate this MoU if either of the Parties is not satisfied with the arrangement for reason beyond their control for going ahead with the implementation of the provision of this MoU and such reasons beyond control continue for a period of six months.
- Their shall be no liability on the part of any Party to the other arising from the termination of this MoU provided that in case of this agreement coming to an end by an earlier termination as aforesaid, the ongoing projects shall be completed as per the plan agreed by CSU and Sanskruti, Centre for Cultural Excellence and both Parties shall fulfill their respective obligations as part of this agreement.

This MoU will be binding on either of the Parties as specifically set out R. R. Bhereto. This MoU is intended to express the broad understanding of the Parties of Regulation.
